



Why proximity to a hospital doesn't necessarily mean a neighborhood will be healthier:

Arlington, Texas – The North Central Texas Council of Governments (NCTCOG) has been awarded a grant of approximately \$270,000 to identify innovative, affordable transit solutions to improve access to basic needs and create strategies to reduce greenhouse-gas emissions in a part of Fort Worth identified as an area of persistent poverty.

- food
- healthcare
- housing
- jobs






## **SCOPE OF WORK**

#### **EXISTING TRANSIT**

In the Trinity Metro transit service area

#### **Fixed Route Bus Service**

- Three 15-minute bus routes (1, 4, and 6)
- Two 30-minute bus routes (5 and 54)

#### **On-Demand Rideshare**

- Within the Southside ZIPZONE boundary
- Provides corner-to-corner travel
- \$3 per passenger, per ride
- Sunday-Wednesday, 6AM-8PM
- Thursday-Saturday, 6AM-Midnight

#### **Regional Connections/Transfer Centers**

- TexRail and TRE at Central Station (via ZIPZONE, Routes 1, 5, & 6)
- Sierra Vista Transfer Center (via routes 5 & 54)





#### **EXISTING TRANSIT**

In the Trinity Metro transit service area

#### **Trinity Metro ACCESS**

- Paratransit transit service
- Door to door service
- Available to persons with a verifiable disability that cannot ride regular fixed-route service
- Weekday, Saturday, and Sunday service


