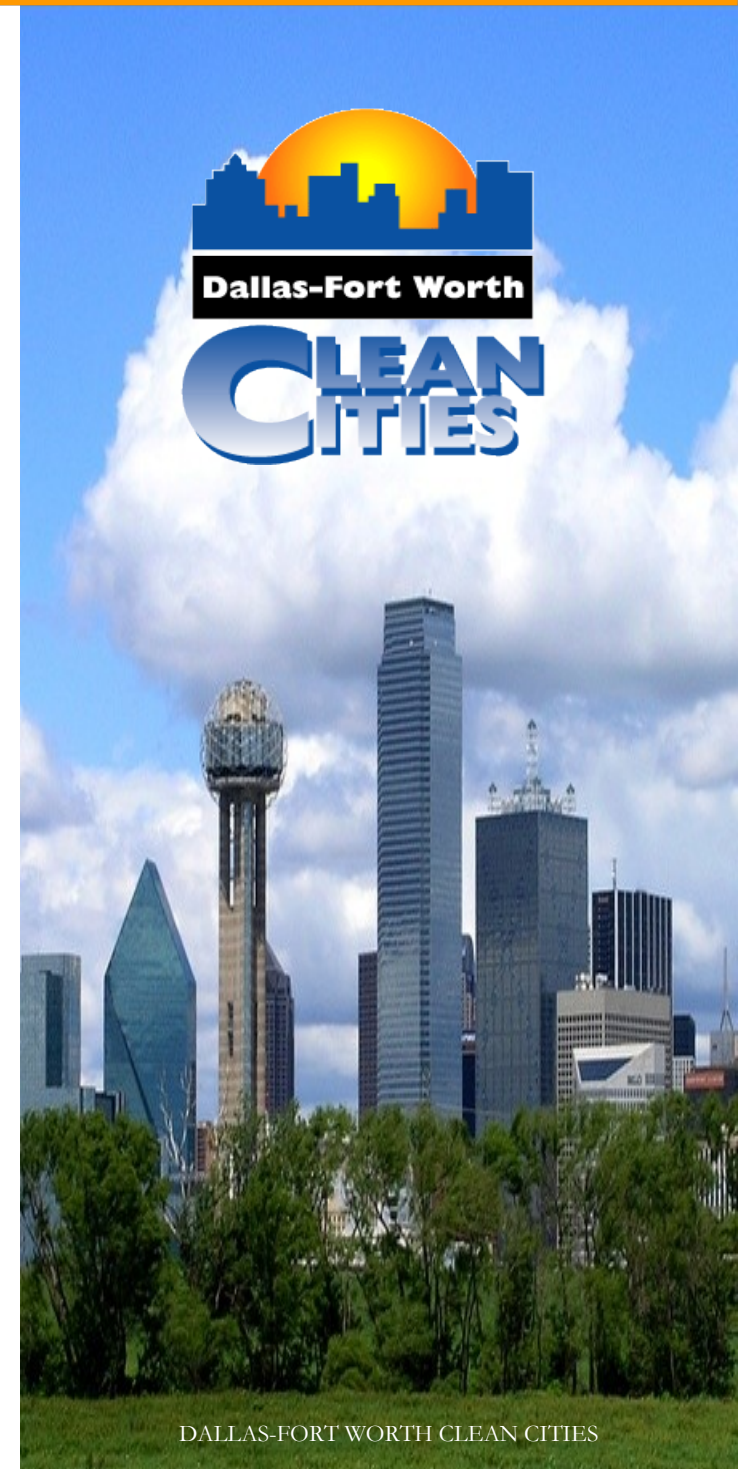

North Central Texas Council of Governments (NCTCOG):

- NCTCOG is a voluntary association of local governments planning for common needs, cooperating for mutual benefit, and coordinating for sound regional development.
- NCTCOG's purpose is to strengthen both the individual and collective power of local governments and to help them recognize regional opportunities, eliminate unnecessary duplication, and make joint decisions.
- NCTCOG serves a 16-county region of North Central Texas, which is centered on the two urban centers of Dallas and Fort Worth.
- Since 1992, NCTCOG has awarded approximately \$75,000,000 in federal dollars towards alternative fuel and advanced technology vehicle projects in the region.

Dallas-Fort Worth Clean Cities:

- NCTCOG administers the DFW Clean Cities Program.
- DFW Clean Cities has had financial support from the Texas State Energy Conservation Office (SECO), US Department of Energy (DOE), and others.

In 1995, the Dallas-Fort Worth (DFW) Clean Cities became one of the first Clean Cities under the Energy Policy Act's provision for an organization that promotes the use of alternative fuels to lessen America's dependence on foreign sources of petroleum. The DFW Clean Cities Coalition is a locally based, private and public partnership group that works to advance the economic, environmental, and energy security goals of the United States by supporting local decisions to adopt practices that contribute to the reduction of petroleum consumption in the transportation sector.

Clean Cities Technical Coalition (CCTC):
