Proposed Modifications to the List of Funded Projects

A comprehensive list of funded transportation projects through 2014 is maintained in the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). Projects with committed funds from federal, state and local sources are included in the TIP. To maintain an accurate project listing, this document is updated on a regular basis. The current set of project modifications will be presented for public review and comment.

Draft Project Recommendations: Transportation Investment Generating Economic Recovery (TIGER) Discretionary Grant Funding Opportunity

The US Department of Transportation announced \$527 million is available through the TIGER Discretionary Grants Program for shovel-ready transportation projects. Staff has been working with regional partners to develop a strategic list of projects to submit for funding consideration. The US DOT will competitively award funds to projects that significantly impact the nation, a metropolitan area or a region and address safety, livability, partnerships and economic activity among other issues.



Innovative Resource Agency Partnerships

NCTCOG staff are committed to expeditiously and effectively enhancing the region's transportation system while taking into consideration environmental, community and economic goals early in the planning process as well as through the project development, design and construction phases. Development around the 50 public-use general aviation facilities and Naval Air Station, Fort Worth, Joint Reserve Base is one of several focus areas. These facilities are major economic generators important to the future development of the region. Additionally, through an agreement with the US Army Corps of Engineers, NCTCOG and the Regional Transportation Council have enhanced coordination and communication between transportation partners and USACE. The result is conserved funding and natural resources, improved environmental stewardship around projects and timelier implementation of improvements. Other efforts that emphasize environmental considerations in transportation planning will also be discussed.
