

President's Legacy Scholarship for Graduates

WTS has launched a new scholarship, the **President's Legacy Scholarship**. Each year, the President's Legacy Scholarship will provide a \$3,000 scholarship to a young woman pursuing a career in transportation.

The WTS mission of transforming the transportation industry through the advancement of women can be realized by encouraging them to further their careers as leaders in the transportation industry. The President's Legacy Scholarship is awarded to women pursuing graduate studies in transportation or a related field, who demonstrate leadership skills and an active commitment to community service.

WTS recognizes that transportation is more than simply moving people and goods from one place to another. It is a driver of growth, and an integral part of our local communities. The leadership, skills, and perspectives of women are essential to ensure that the transportation systems of the future respond to the needs of all. Through the President's Legacy Scholarship, WTS seeks to motivate and reward women who demonstrate leadership in the transportation industry and a commitment to community service.

The President's Legacy Scholarship is \$3,000. The minimum criteria for selection are as follows:

- a. Open to women
- b. GPA of 3.0 or higher
- c. Currently enrolled in a graduate degree program in a transportation-related field, such as transportation engineering, planning, finance, or logistics in certain colleges/universities in Texas¹, and Oklahoma
- d. Plans to pursue a career in a transportation-related field
- e. Applicants are asked to specifically address in a personal statement their vision of how their education will give them the tools to better serve their community's transportation needs.

Applications must be submitted through local WTS chapters. The scholarships are competitive and based on the applicant's specific transportation goals, academic record and transportation-related activities or job skills. Minority candidates are encouraged to apply. Local Chapters may have additional requirements (such as personal interviews or higher GPA).
