Family Assistance Planning



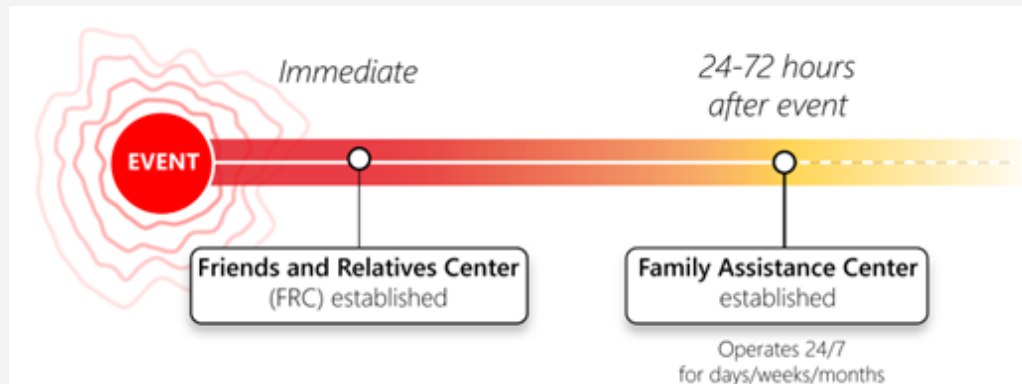
Why FRC/FAC Planning?

- **Supports response operations following mass casualty incident/mass fatality incident (MCI/MFI) or any emergency event with casualties/fatalities beyond the local jurisdiction's daily normal response**
- **Identifies and coordinates support services and basic assistance for those impacted by MCI/MFI (family, victim, friend, etc.)**



Key Terms

- **Friends and Relatives Center (FRC)**
 - Quickly activated following MCI/MFI
 - Limits people going to incident site and/or hospitals
 - Centralized information sharing in first 24-48 hours
 - Provides a place away from the incident site and media
 - Facilitated reunification
- **Avoid the use of the term “Reunification Center”**



Key Terms

- **Family Assistance Center (FAC)**

- Longer-term site opened 24-72 hours after MCI/MFI
- Secure, fully accessible facility
- Provides a wide range of services including emotional support and spiritual care
- Coordination between law enforcement, EMS, hospitals, and Medical Examiner/Coroner/Justice of the Peace
- Vetted information for families
- Located away from the FRC if possible



FAC Functions

- **Reception/data gathering**
- **FAC security**
- **Media management**
- **Basic needs, food, comfort**
- **Timely, vetted information and briefings**
- **Technology - access to TV, phone chargers, computers**
- **Support services**
 - Childcare
 - Spiritual care
 - Transportation
 - Financial assistance
 - Document replacement
 - Mental health
 - Investigative services
 - Support for people with disabilities/access and functional needs



FAC Location Criteria

- **Easy access to major thoroughfares/public transit**
- **Overall accessibility (e.g., elevators, restrooms)**
- **Consider proximity to possible hazards (e.g., flooding)**
- **Large indoor space**
- **Heat/air conditioning**
- **Ample parking, including accessible spaces**
- **Security measures**
- **Restricted areas for FAC staff**
- **Private areas for family interviews and notifications**
- **Areas for registration, social services, family briefings**
- **Communications and technology**
- **Available on short notice**



Virtual FAC

- **Some situations may warrant virtual operations**
- **Establish a method for affected individuals and families to access resources virtually**
- **Work with local public health, mental health, and social services partners to identify virtual resources**
