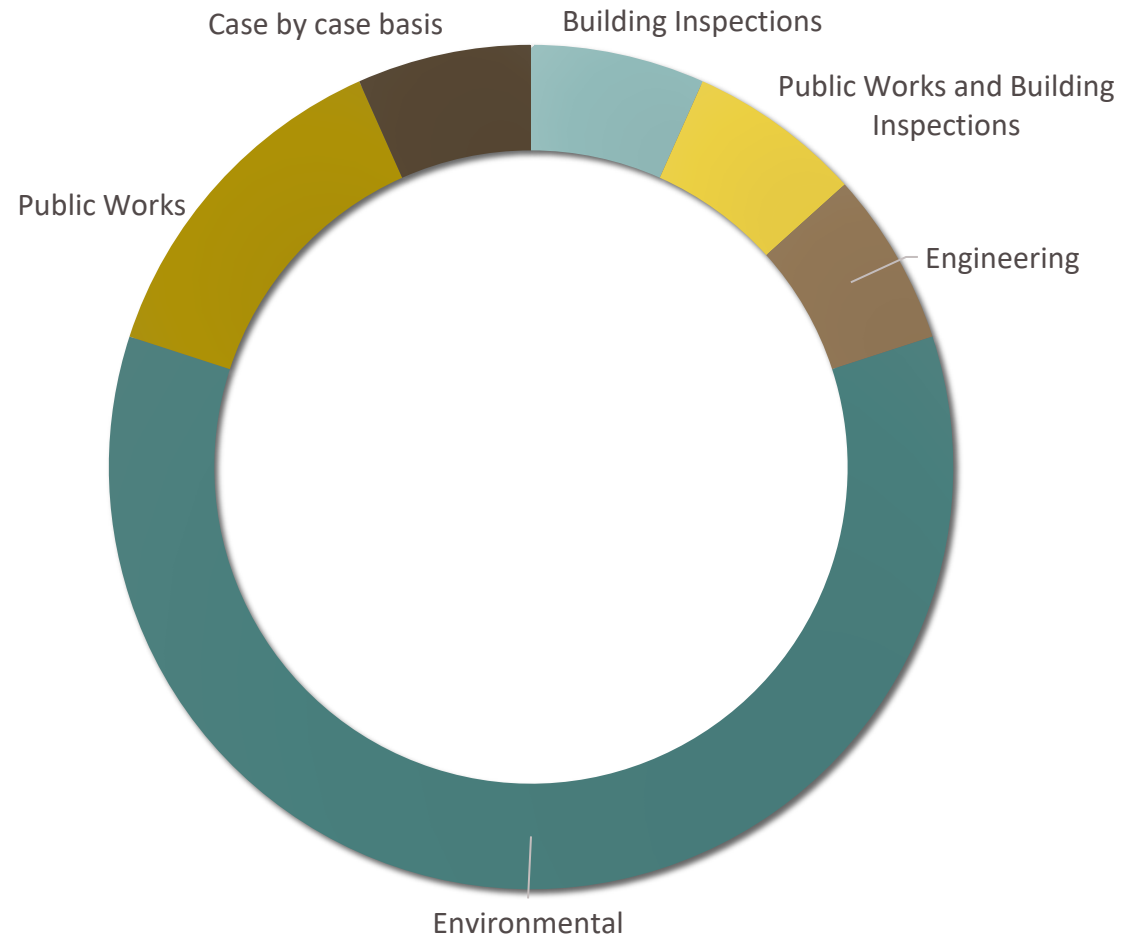

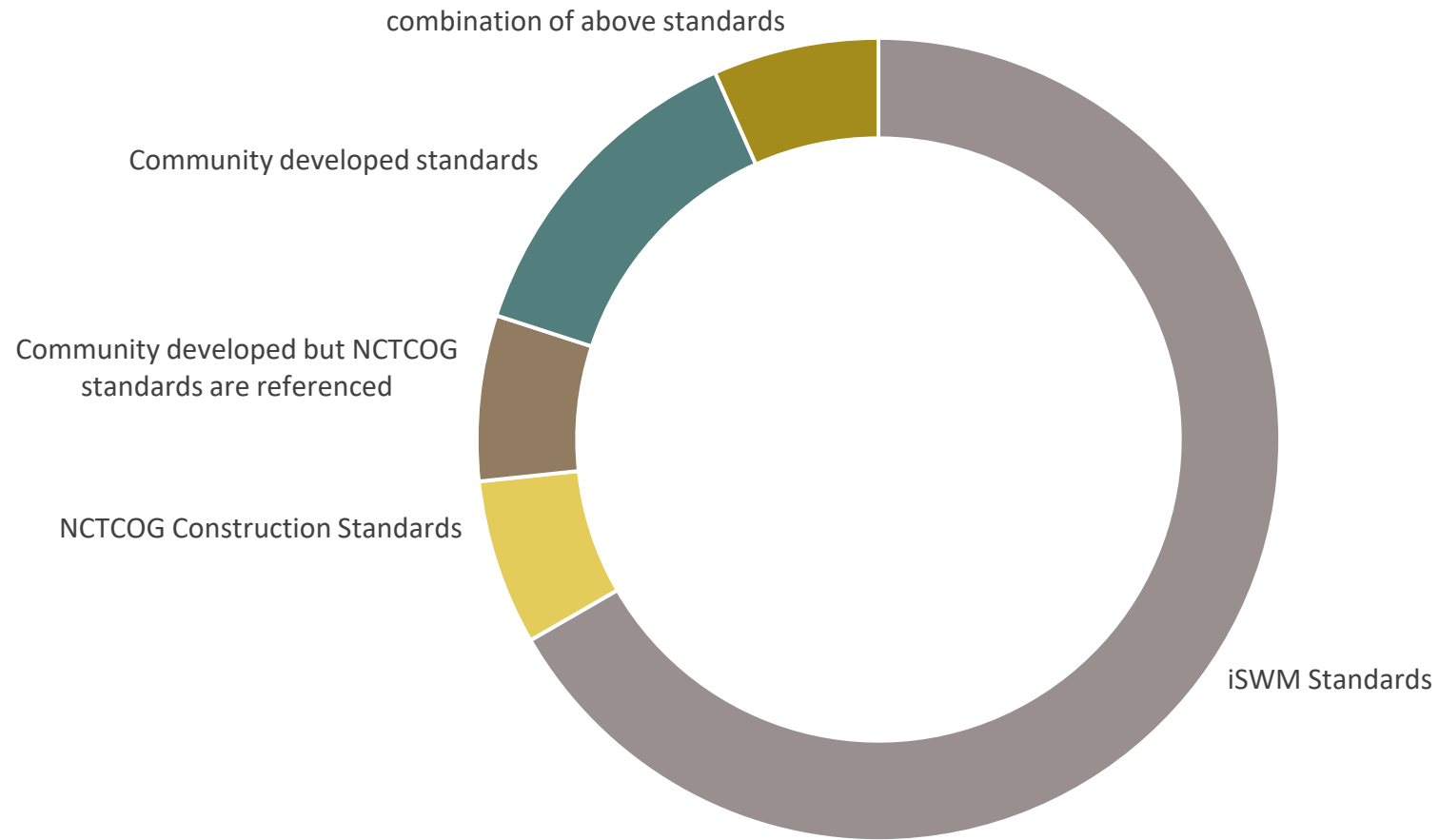
What MS4 Category Do you Represent?



Does your community inspect and enforce maintenance of ESCs during construction?

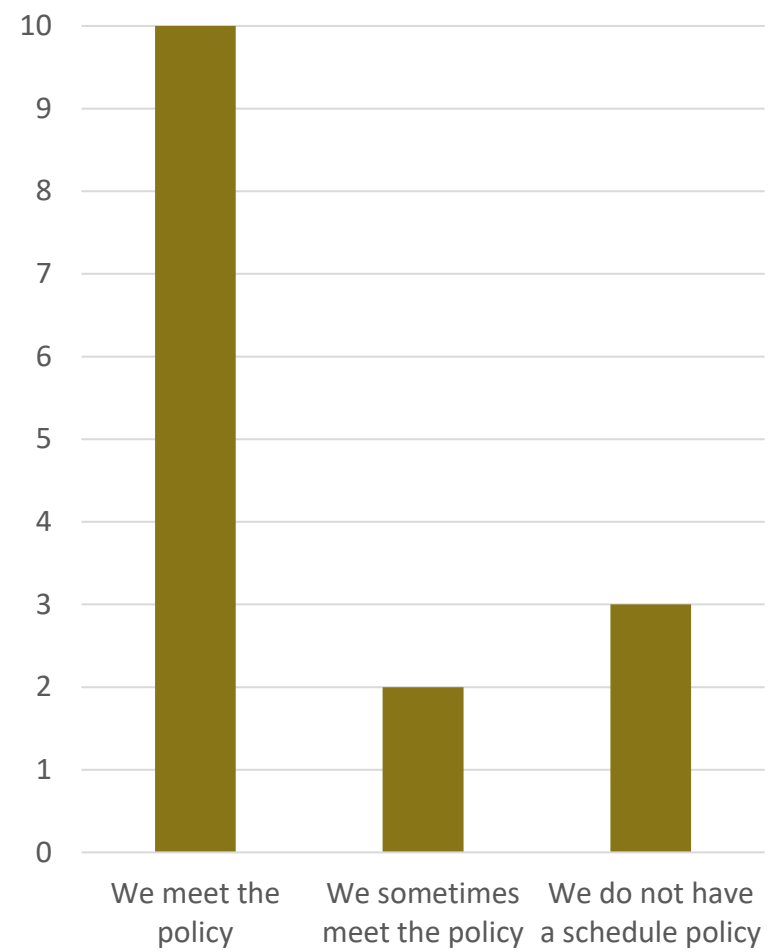
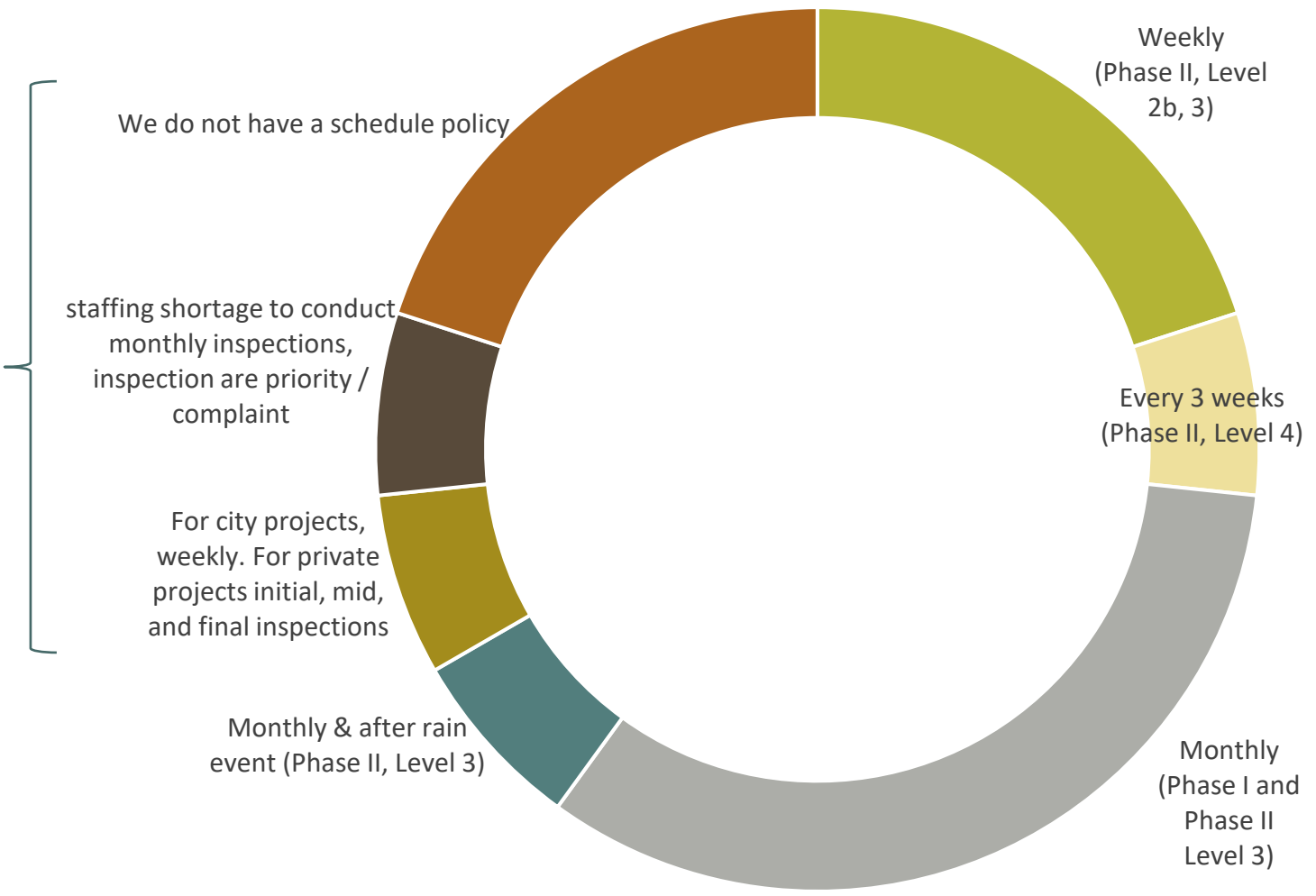


Does your community inspect and enforce maintenance of ESCs during construction? Department?

Per your community's policy, how often are inspections to be performed by your community's inspectors?

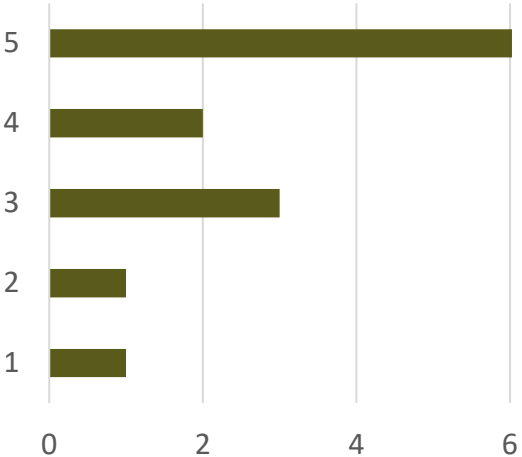

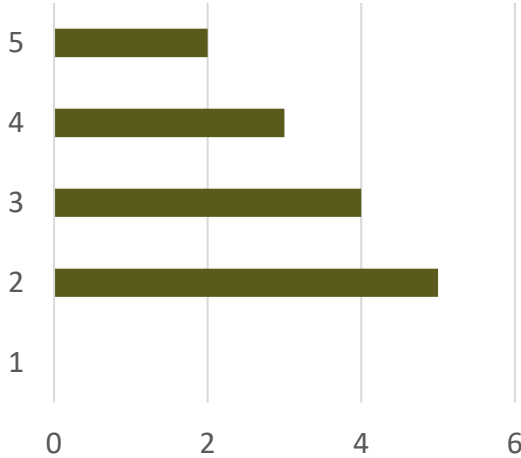

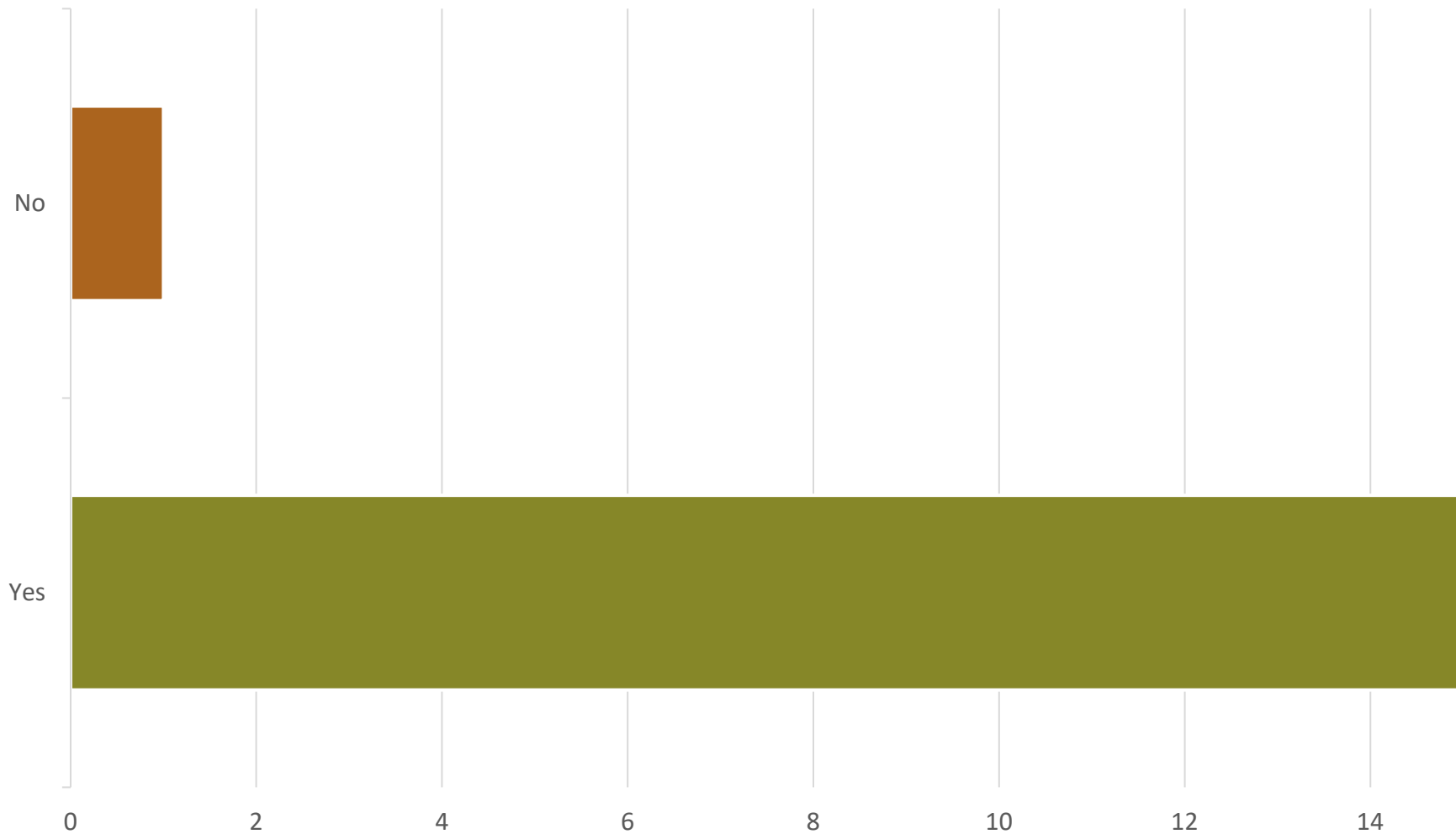

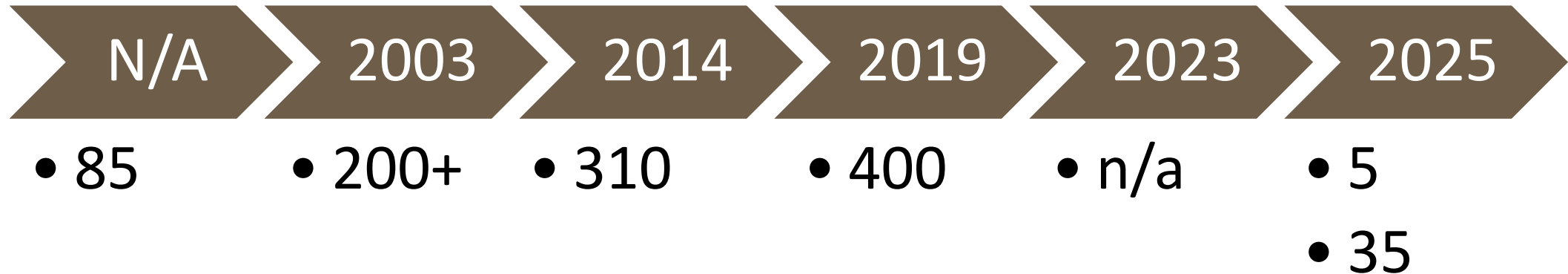

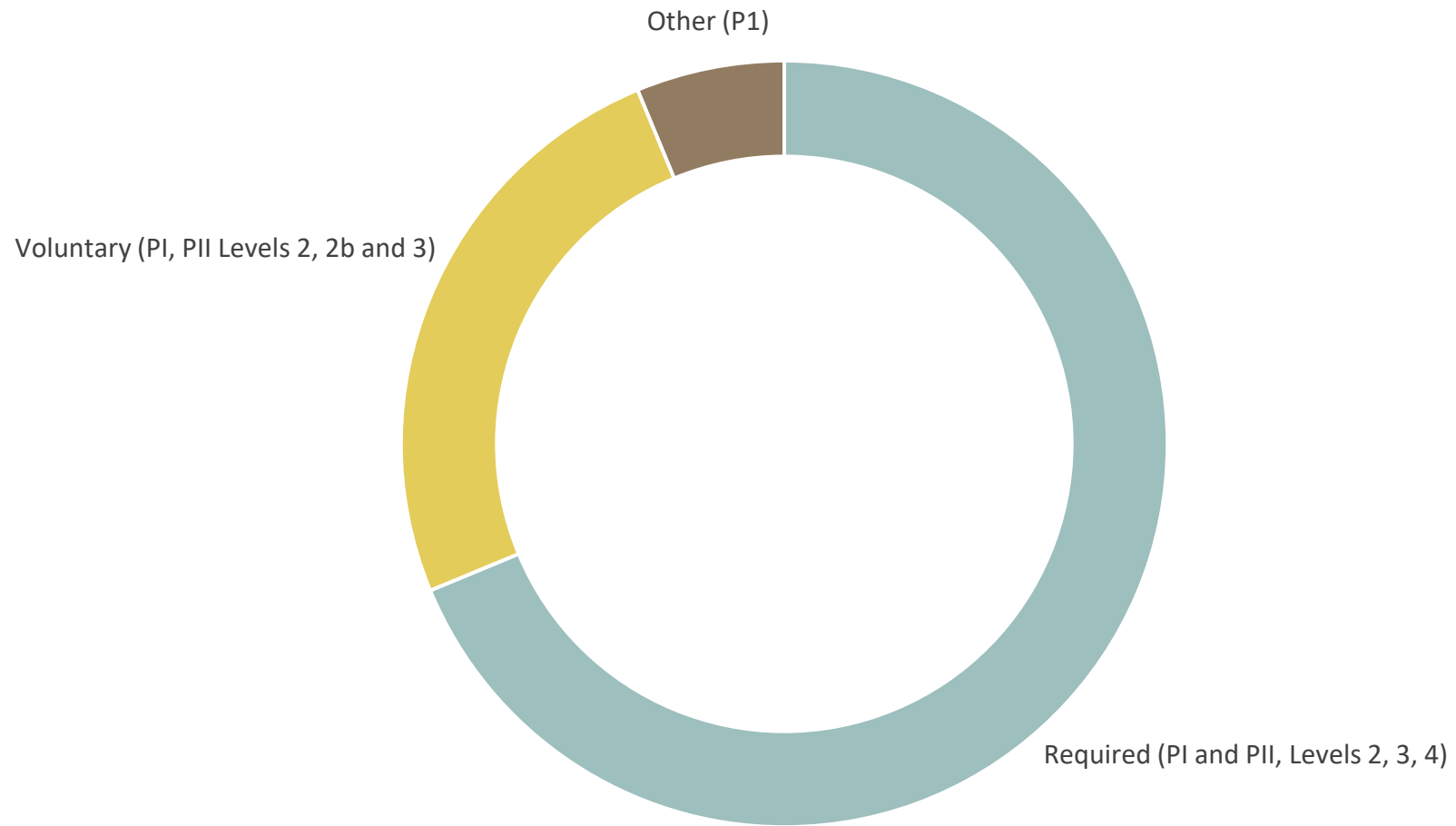

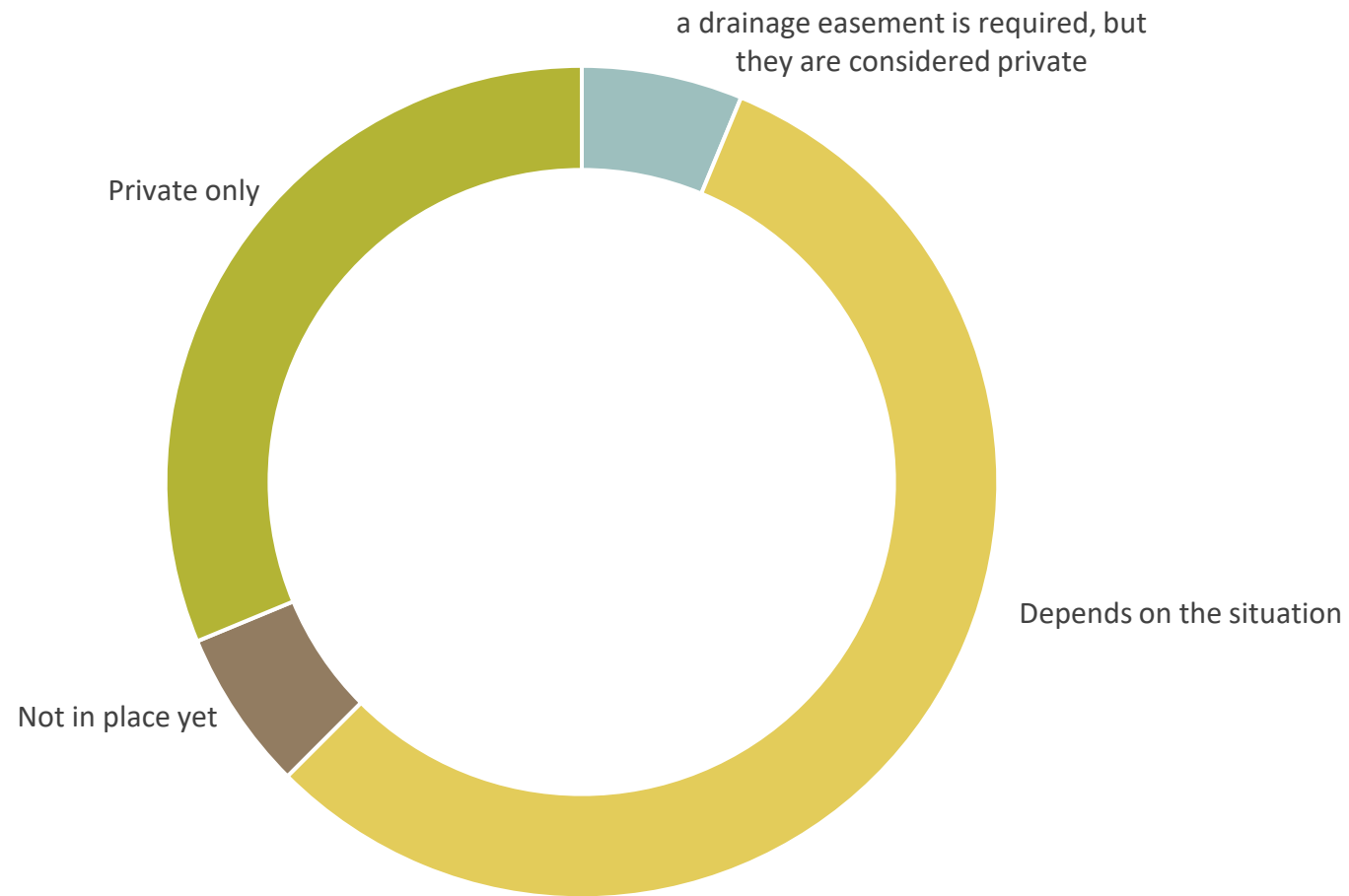

What types of PCWQMs does your community allow?



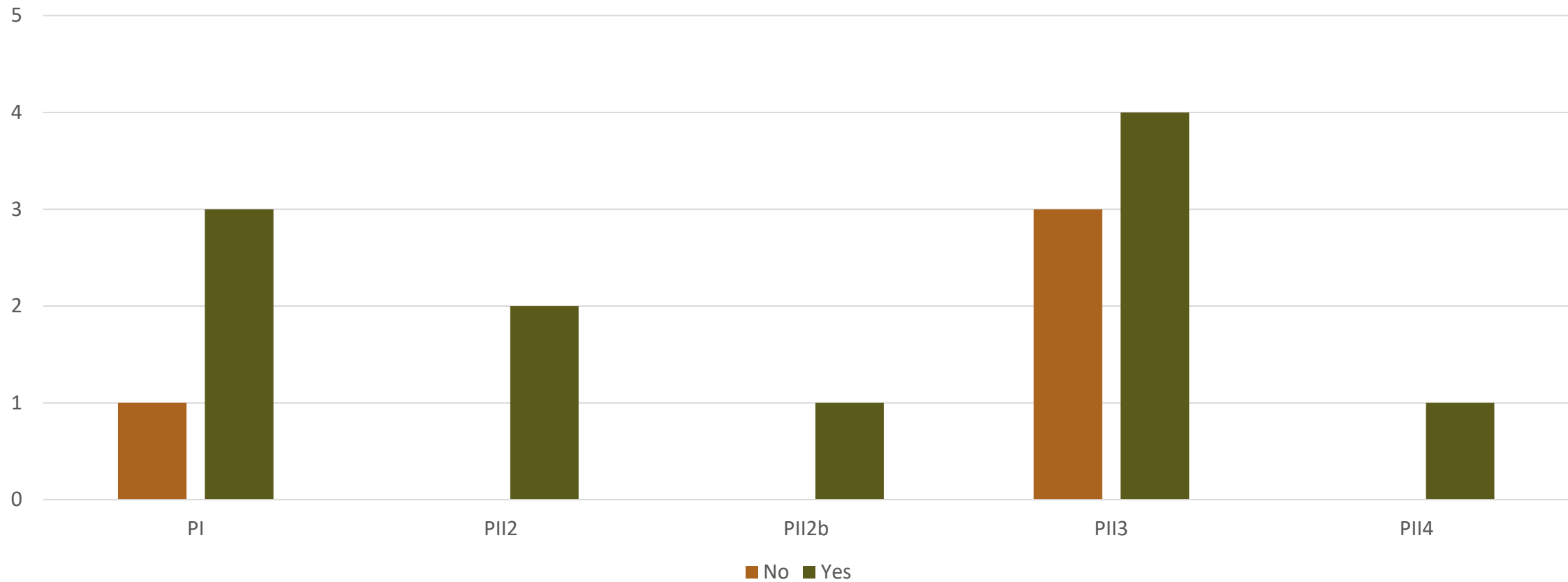

Please describe any lessons learned or best practices from your PCWQM program:

- Clear, thought-out maintenance language and BMP details during the permitting process save a lot of headaches down the line.
- Also, checking during the permitting process that BMPs can be easily accessed for inspection and maintenance is important (i.e. inspection ports for underground detention systems, hydrodynamic separators in a location easily accessible to vac trucks, etc.)!
- NCTCOG's post construction model ordinance is a great place to start.
- We are currently in the process of developing the program, so we are relatively new and eager to learn and improve as we move forward.
- Have no fully implemented our program yet but look forward to hear from other entities with successful programs.
