THE ROAD TO BETTER MOBILITY: US 75 LAST MILE EXPANSION REACHES COMPLETION

Part of the US 75 last mile project included reconstructing four main lanes into six. The left image shows the southbound lanes under construction in November 2025. The right image, from June 2026, depicts the completed six lanes, three in each direction.



North Texas' exponential growth has led the TxDOT Dallas District to prioritize US 75 corridor expansion in Collin County for decades. This summer, TxDOT wraps up an ongoing Collin County initiative with a roadway project that was delivered six months early.

Reconstruction of the two-year, \$80 million US 75 last mile project in the City of Anna, from County Road 370 to the Grayson County line, reached final completion in July.

Improvements include full reconstruction and widening from a rural four-lane highway to six lanes (three in each direction), conversion of two-way frontage roads into one-directional frontage

roads and full reconstruction of the Mantua Road / CR 371 cross-street bridge. The contractor was Mario Sinacola & Sons.

Today, field offices have demobilized in the area, material, equipment and trailers are being cleared and relocated to other

area projects. Fresh new pavement, striping and sod adorn the flowing highway, the last hints of final touches occurring on the project.

Earliest discussions to widen US 75 in Collin County date back to the late 1980s. As present-day demand continues to grow, TxDOT will continue to find opportunities to improve mobility in Collin County. The focus on this last mile was to remove the bottleneck effect as traffic moves north into Grayson County, which is one of the many locations to experience rapid population growth and business expansion in North Texas.

In a **Census Bureau report** published earlier this year, Collin County was named as one of the fastest-growing counties in the nation. The city of Anna was ranked fifth fastest-growing on the list, following other Collin County cities Celina, Princeton and Melissa.

TxDOT Project Manager Shawn Yousefi, says the new US 75 infrastructure will go a long way for this part of the county. "We're already seeing the immediate effects of improved

access and mobility from TxDOT's US 75 last mile expansion," said Yousefi. "Especially within our final year of the project, we've noticed some more commercial developments popping up in the area."

What Yousefi might be referring to is that, with project completion, major retail development is now occurring directly along the corridor as TxDOT improved frontage access and roadway capacity. A concentration of

developments at all quadrants of the US 75 and Rosamond Parkway intersection for example, is targeting openings in late 2026 and full project buildouts are stretching into 2028, according to the property development websites. This adds to the already busy residential subdivisions, retail and restaurants that have moved in within the last few years, providing a continued TxDOT focus on its mission of "Connecting You With Texas." ■

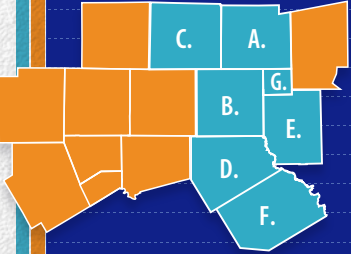
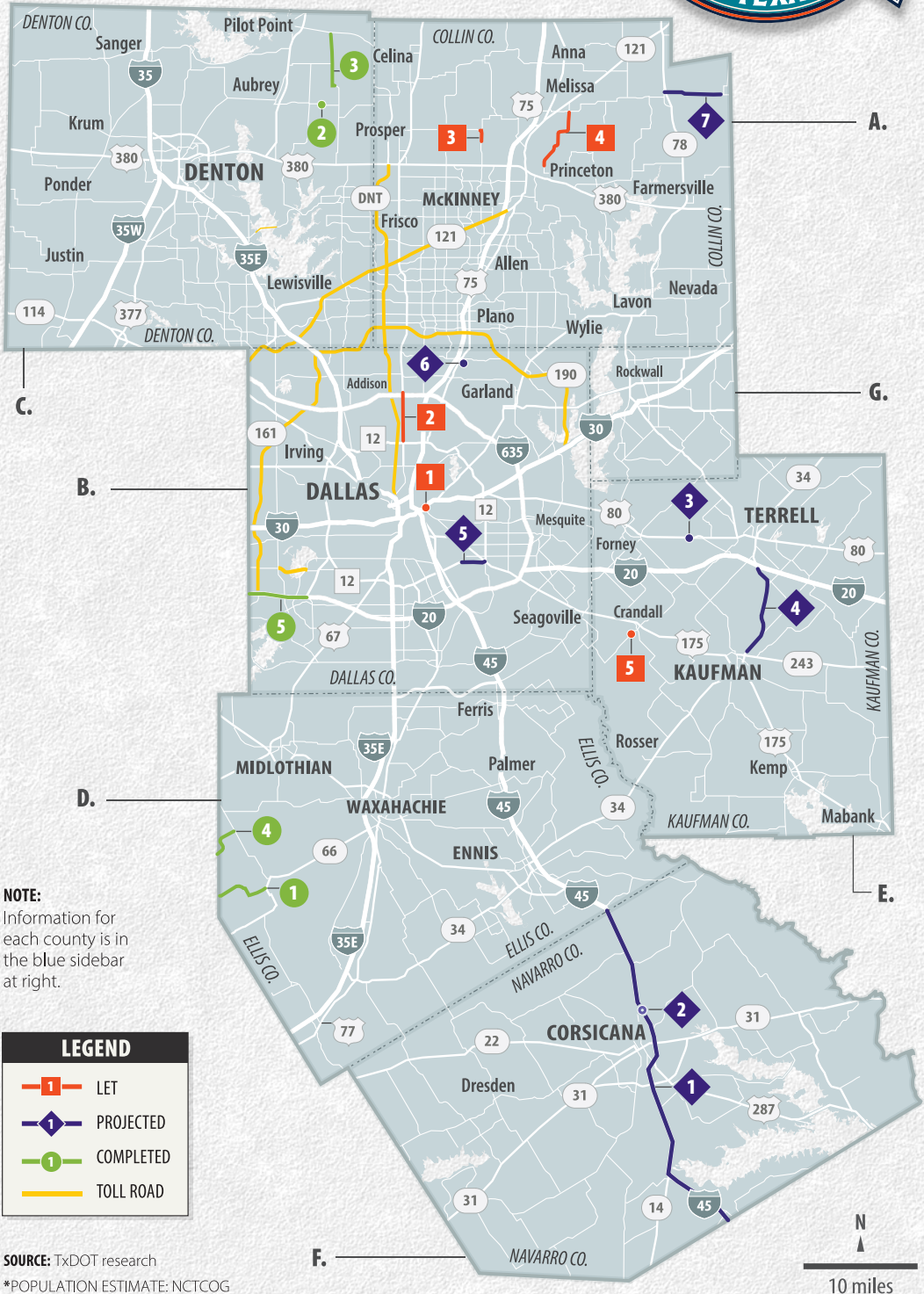
