


## Ozone Design Value Trends






#### Monitor Locations with Associated 8-Hour Design Value











## North Texas Reliable EV Infrastructure (NTx-REVI) Project


\$3.6 million to <u>repair and replace non-operational chargers</u> in the 16-county NCTCOG region

#### North Texas Equitable EV Infrastructure (NTx-EEVI) Project

\$15 million to <u>build up to 100 EV charging</u> <u>ports</u> in the 16-county NCTCOG region, with emphasis on underserved areas

#### **Texas EV Infrastructure Plan**

~\$70 million to <u>build EV charging</u> in the NCTCOG Metropolitan Planning Area (MPA) and county seat sites (Managed by TxDOT)




#### **How Visitors Found Air North Texas**


