PUBLIC COMMENT ON AGENDA ITEMS

Item 1 Approval of Minutes

President Piel stated that the first item on the agenda was approval of the minutes from the April Board meeting.

Item 2 Resolution Authorizing a Contract with a Public Accounting Firm for Audit and Advisory Services

Molly Rendon, Director of Administration, requested Board authorization to enter into contractual agreements with Pattillo, Brown & Hill, LLP for audit and advisory services for a maximum five (5) year term and in a total amount not to exceed \$916,000.00 She explained that a competitive procurement for independent audit and advisory services was conducted and five (5) proposals in response to the solicitation were received. Upon evaluation by an evaluation committee, Pattillo, Brown & Hill, LLP is recommended. She further explained that the Audit committee met prior to the Board meeting to discuss the selection.

Upon a Motion by Mayor Heidemann (seconded by Judge Little), and unanimous vote of all members present, the Board approved the resolution as presented.

Item 3 Resolution Authorizing Budget Amendment and Additional Staff for Training & Development Institute (TDI)

Molly Rendon, Director of Administration, requested Board authorization increasing the Training & Development Institute (TDI) Fiscal Year 2023 budget by an amount of \$75,000, resulting in an amended budget total of \$338,100. Additionally, she requested one (1) full-time equivalent position. She explained that TDI facilitates and hosts training programs for the NCTCOG region encompassing focus areas such as Public Works, Public Safety, Planning & Development, Public Management, Contracts & Purchasing, and Public Finance. Staff believe these changes will assist TDI in meeting the increased demand for quality, municipally focused training within the NCTCOG region and beyond.

Upon a Motion by Mayor Hairston (seconded by Mayor Martin), and unanimous vote of all members present, the Board approved the resolution as presented.

Item 4 Resolution Approving the North Central Texas Area Plan Federal Fiscal Years 2024-2026

Doni Green, Director of Area Agency on Aging, requested Board approval for the North Central Texas Area Plan Federal Fiscal Years 2024-2026. She explained the Area Agency on Aging (AAA), is required by the Older Americans Act of 1965 to develop multi-year area plans for its service area that provides, administers, and coordinates health and social services for persons aged 60 and over and their family caregivers. Similarly, the Texas Health and Human Services Commissions (HHSC) requires the multi-year plans for funding, delivery, administration and coordination of health and human services. The three-year plan covers the 14 counties surrounding Dallas and Tarrant Counties and has been approved by the Regional Aging Advisory Committee.

Upon a Motion by Councilmember Clemson (seconded by Mayor Hairston), and unanimous vote of all members present, the Board approved the resolution as presented.

Item 5 Resolution Authorizing Fiscal Year 2023 Supplemental Allocations for Aging Nutrition and Transportation Services

Doni Green, Director of Area Agency on Aging, requested Board approval to increase the budgets for homedelivered meals, congregate meals, and transportation services by approximately \$3.3 million utilizing American Rescue Act and Nutrition Services Incentive Program funds. She explained in 2019, the Board previously authorized agreements with fifteen (15) nutrition and transportation subrecipients that had been selected through a Call for Partners and to pass through Title III funds, consistent with its funding formula that was also approved by the Board. She further explained that since these authorizations, NCTCOG has been allocated American Rescue Act funds and wishes to budget these funds to AAA nutrition and transportation services during Fiscal Year 2023. Additionally, supplemental allocations to existing Title III nutrition and transportation services subrecipients, based on the previously approved funding formulas, was requested with actual funding determined by subrecipients' productivity.

Upon a Motion by Commissioner Mitchell (seconded by Councilmember Johnson), and unanimous vote of all members present, the Board approved the resolution as presented.

Item 6 Resolution Authorizing Applications to Federal Highway Administration Charging and Fueling Infrastructure Program

Michael Morris, Director of Transportation, requested Board authorization to submit applications to the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) for the Charging and Fueling Infrastructure (CFI) Discretionary Grant Program, which provides grants to fund up to 80 percent of the total project cost to deploy electric vehicle (EV) charging and other alternative fueling infrastructure in urban and rural communities in publicly accessible locations, including alternative fuel corridors, downtown areas and local neighborhoods, particularly in underserved and disadvantaged communities. Both applications have been approved by the Regional Transportation Council.

Staff proposes to apply to the grant program as follows:

- Community Program Application maximum award of \$15 million federal funds and \$3.75 million of local match from local partners to implement up to 100 EV charging stations region-wide. Specialized technical teams familiar with requirements related to permitting, zoning, codes, Buy America, and the National Environmental Policy Act will add value to the FHWA application by streamlining and expediting implementation and ensure timely project implementation. Up to five percent of the awarded funds will be reserved for educational activities to support high utilization of the infrastructure. The required non-federal contribution of 20% of the project cost is expected to be provided by the local governments or contracted private entities for the community grant.
- Corridor Program Application approximately \$103 million (approximately \$82.4 million federal funds and \$20.6 million local match from contracted private entities). Upon proposals that were solicited and reviewed, with the intent to develop a public-private partnership proposal to FHWA, NCTCOG plans to partner with Pilot Travel Centers LLC, in an amount not to exceed \$70 million in FHWA funds (no more than 80 percent of project costs) and approximately \$17.6 million required non-federal contribution (at least 20 percent of project costs) to implement up to five hydrogen refueling sites. NCTCOG also plans to partner with PACCAR, Inc. to implement one EV charging site for medium- and heavy-duty trucks in an amount not to exceed \$12 million in FHWA funds (no more than 80 percent of project costs) and approximately contribution (at least 20 percent of project costs) to implement one EV charging site for medium- and heavy-duty trucks in an amount not to exceed \$12 million in FHWA funds (no more than 80 percent of project costs). NCTCOG intends to retain \$500,000 in federal funds to cover administrative costs associated with implementing the project. The non-federal contribution must be provided by the contracted private entities for the corridor grant and would be sufficient to cover the required match for administrative costs.

Item 7 Resolution Authorizing Consultant Contract with Halff Associates to Implement the North Oak Cliff Engineering Study and Support the Upper Trinity River Transportation and Stormwater Infrastructure Project

Michael Morris, Director of Transportation, requested Board authorization to enter a contract between NCTCOG and Halff Associates to perform the North Oak Cliff Conceptual Engineering Study and support the Upper Trinity River Transportation and Stormwater Infrastructure Project in an amount not to exceed \$1,550,000. He explained that a Request for Proposals (RFP) was issued, reviewed, and evaluated by the Consultant Selection Committee. Halff Associates was the only firm that submitted a proposal in response to the RFP. The Consultant Selection Committee recommended Halff Associates for this project. The purpose of this project is to apply lessons learned

from previous approaches that have resulted in flooded roadways, neighborhoods, and critical infrastructure, and to assist communities with an approach to efficiently minimize these impacts before they occur.

NCTCOG's population estimates are often cited and are recognized for their coverage, timeliness, and uniqueness.

- Item Title: Resolution Endorsing SolSmart Engagement Partner Request for Proposal Application to the Interstate Renewable Energy Council

Staff will request Executive Board endorsement of the proposal submitted to the Interstate Renewable Energy Council (IREC) SolSmart Engagement Partner Request for Proposal (RFP). IREC would provide up to \$40,000 with no match requirement to fund staff time devoted to conducting outreach and engagement with cities in the North Texas region regarding the development of solar statements and their participation in the SolSmart program, a national recognition program that highlights solar-friendly communities. The work outlined in the proposal will be completed by May 2024.

As part of the regional bronze SolSmart designation the North Central Texas Council of Governments (NCTCOG) achieved in 2020, NCTCOG committed to a goal of securing SolSmart designations for 10 additional North Texas cities. SolSmart designation can help support broader adoption of solar energy in local communities. Increases in solar power generation can mitigate increases in conventional power generation associated with economic and population growth, resulting in reduced emissions and greater grid resiliency.

The RFP requires that 80 percent of designated cities must represent census tracts identified as disadvantaged by the Department of Energy's Energy Justice Mapping Tool. This opportunity would provide the funding and guidance necessary to achieve the existing agency goal of designating 10 additional cities while adding a focus on disadvantaged communities and an adequate timeline to complete the work required.

A draft resolution authorizing endorsement of the application to the Interstate Renewable Energy Council SolSmart Engagement Partner Request for Proposal is attached for Executive Board consideration. I will provide a brief presentation on this item and will be available to answer any questions prior to requesting Board approval.

RESOLUTION ENDORSING SOLSMART ENGAGEMENT PARTNER REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL APPLICATION TO THE INTERSTATE RENEWABLE ENERGY COUNCIL

WHEREAS, the North Central Texas Council of Governments (NCTCOG) is a Texas political subdivision and non-profit corporation organized and operating under Texas Local Government Code Chapter 391 as the regional planning commission for the 16-county North Central Texas region; and,

WHEREAS, NCTCOG is a voluntary association of, by and for local governments established to assist in planning for common needs, cooperating for mutual benefit, and coordinating for sound regional development; and,

WHEREAS, NCTCOG has been designated as the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) for the Dallas-Fort Worth Metropolitan Area by the Governor of the State of Texas in accordance with federal law; and,

WHEREAS, the Regional Transportation Council (RTC), comprised primarily of local elected officials, is the regional transportation policy body associated with NCTCOG, and has been and continues to be a forum for cooperative decisions on transportation; and,

WHEREAS, the Dallas-Fort Worth region is in nonattainment of the federal air quality standard for ozone and NCTCOG is actively involved in the development and implementation of the State Implementation Plan for air quality; and,

WHEREAS, increases in renewable energy generation such as solar can help reduce ozone-forming pollution, improve the reliability of the Texas electric grid, and facilitate greater local energy reliability; and,

WHEREAS, Subtask 3.03 of the Fiscal Year (FY) 2022 and FY2023 Unified Planning Work Program for Regional Transportation Planning includes implementation of air quality initiatives; and,

WHEREAS, the Interstate Renewable Energy Council released the SolSmart Engagement Partner Request for Proposal, which provides funding for outreach and engagement targeted at local governments to expand the SolSmart network and make the region more solar friendly.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED THAT:

- **Section 1.** The NCTCOG Executive Board endorses the submittal of a proposal to the SolSmart Engagement Partner Request for Proposal requesting funding in the amount of \$40,000 to carry out the required deliverables under the Request for Proposal.
- **Section 2.** NCTCOG is authorized to receive approximately \$40,000 from the Interstate Renewable Energy Council for project implementation.

- Item Title: Resolution Authorizing Fiscal Year 2023 Safe Streets and Roads for All Planning Grant Application to the United States Department of Transportation

In March 2023, the United States Department of Transportation (USDOT) announced availability of Fiscal Year (FY) 2023 funds for the Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) Discretionary Grant Program, regarding improving roadway safety by significantly reducing or eliminating roadway fatalities and serious injuries through safety action plan development and implementation focused on all users. The Notice of Funding Opportunity indicated availability of \$5 billion over five years, and up to \$1 billion for the SS4A Grant Program in FY2023; final applications are due to the USDOT on July 10, 2023.

NCTCOG will submit a grant application for \$5 million in federal transportation funds to conduct supplemental planning activities to further develop the regional Pedestrian Safety Action Plan and the regional Roadway Safety Plan. The total planning budget is anticipated to be \$6.25 million, with \$1.25 million in Regional Toll Revenue available for local match. The relatively new national infrastructure program is available to assist all local governments to secure transportation safety planning funds. The proposed project will benefit areas of the region with a high frequency of crashes (motor vehicles, pedestrians, bicyclists) as well as residents in disadvantaged areas by planning for the future implementation of safety improvements for all roadway travelers, increased transportation choices, improved air quality, and access to employment, education, and community services.

The Regional Transportation Council approved the submission of this planning grant application on June 8, 2023. Staff requests approval of the SS4A grant application.

A draft resolution authorizing submittal of the FY2023 Safe Streets and Roads for All application is attached for Executive Board consideration. I will provide a brief presentation on this item and will be available to answer any questions prior to requesting Board approval.

- **Section 1.** NCTCOG is authorized to submit a planning grant application to the USDOT under the SS4A Program in the amount of \$5 million.

- Item Title: Resolution Authorizing Agreements for the Receipt of Funds for Planning and Implementation Programs from the Texas Department of Transportation

The Executive Board has previously approved receipt of funding for continuation and enhancement of ongoing transportation and air quality initiatives and for new projects implemented and managed by North Central Texas Council of Governments (NCTCOG) staff. This item includes new projects and updates for projects with previous Executive Board approvals due to the addition of funding years. The resolution approving receipt of revenue and execution of necessary agreements is included in agreements with the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT). This item allows planning and implementation programs in the region to be administered and managed by NCTCOG that focus on efforts such as education, outreach, safety, congestion reduction, multi-modal transportation opportunities, and air quality.

The Regional Transportation Council (RTC) approved the programming of funds for these projects at various times, and the approval dates are included in the attached table. In preparation for development and execution of FY2024 agreements, staff requests Executive Board approval to receive approximately \$98,952,860 (\$76,081,800 STBG + \$2,350,000 CRP + \$11,895,000 CMAQ + \$4,833,560 RTR + \$2,683,750 State match + \$1,108,750 local match + 15,031,360 in RTC Transportation Development Credits in lieu of match). Attachment 1 contains a table detailing individual funding agreements. NCTCOG will coordinate with TxDOT to enter into agreements to receive these funds.

A draft resolution authorizing the receipt of funds for planning and implementation programs is attached for Executive Board consideration. I will provide a brief presentation of this item and will be available to answer any questions.

- Item Title: Resolution Authorizing Contract with INRIX, Inc. to Implement the Regional Traffic Signal Performance Measures Platform for Signalized Intersections in the 10-County Non-Attainment Area

On March 17, 2023, the North Central Texas Council of Governments (NCTCOG) issued a Request for Proposals (RFP) to solicit firms' assistance for the Development, Operations, and Maintenance Support of the Regional Traffic Signal Performance Measures Platform for signalized intersections in the 10-county Non-Attainment Area. Three firms submitted proposals in response to the RFP. The Consultant Selection Committee met on May 1, 2023, to review and evaluate the proposals. The Consultant Selection Committee recommended interviews with two firms, which were held on May 8, 2023. The Consultant Selection Committee recommended INRIX, Inc. for this project.

The region will benefit from the platform, which will be available to regional agencies. Among the many benefits, but not limited to, it will provide scalable and actionable signal performance measures, prioritize traffic signal improvement and investment, and rank and prioritize signal retiming and corridor synchronization. These results will be mapped against the Phase 1 Signal Needs Assessment, which surveyed 6,800 traffic signals. INRIX is a software-as-a-service company that provides a complete turnkey solution and has no subcontracting opportunities. Therefore, there will be no Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) participation under this contract.

A draft resolution authorizing a consultant contract with INRIX, Inc. for the Development, Operations, and Maintenance Support of the Regional Traffic Signal Performance Measures Platform for signalized intersections in the 10-county Non-Attainment Area, in an amount not to exceed \$7,500,000, is attached for Executive Board consideration. The initial phase of the project will be funded with remaining FY2021 funding, \$1,287,000 (\$1,029,600 Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality Program/\$257,400 State match in lieu of a local match), and approximately \$2,895,750 (\$2,316,600 Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality Program in FY2023 utilizing \$579,150 State match in lieu of a local match). Subsequent funding agreements between NCTCOG and the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) will be executed to fulfill the total contract amount. Additional funding for the optional renewals will be sought from the Regional Transportation Council.

I will provide a summary of this item and be available to answer questions from the Board. The Executive Board will be requested to authorize the execution of a consultant contract with INRIX, Inc. for the Development, Operations, and Maintenance Support of the Regional Traffic Signal Performance Measures Platform for signalized intersections in the 10-county Non-Attainment Area.

- Item Title: Resolution Authorizing Agreement Amendments with the City of Granbury and University of Houston for Rider 7 Subcontracts

The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) administers funds for local air quality planning activities under Rider 7 of the agency's legislative appropriation. This funding can be used to inventory ozone-related emissions, monitor ozone-related pollution levels, and to cover administrative costs.

In November 2021, the Executive Board approved receipt of funds from TCEQ for local air quality planning under Rider 7 of the agency's legislative appropriation. North Central Texas Council of Governments (NCTCOG) received \$281,250 in Rider 7 funds for two years. In June 2022, the Executive Board approved first year funding to the City of Granbury up to \$88,365 to quantify the extent to which emissions reductions can be achieved through vehicle replacement or fleet management practices and up to \$57,070 to the University of Houston to carry out monitoring of nitrogen oxides, the precursor to ozone formation, for Hood and Hunt counties, during the 2023 ozone season. Due to a change in funding needs, staff will request to change the awarding amounts for the City of Granbury to up to \$47,456 and move the additional value to the University of Houston for an amount up to \$97,979 for the University of Houston. Executive Board approval will be requested to enter into amended agreements with the City of Granbury and the University of Houston.

A draft resolution revising the agreement authorizations for the City of Granbury and University of Houston is attached for Executive Board consideration. I will provide a brief presentation on this item and will be available to answer any questions prior to requesting Board approval.
