

# Current and Proposed PM Standards

## PM<sub>2.5</sub> Primary Annual Standard

- Current: 12.0  $\mu\text{g}/\text{m}^3$  – annual mean, averaged over 3 years
- Clean Air Scientific Advisory Committee (CASAC) Recommendation: 8-10  $\mu\text{g}/\text{m}^3$
- EPA Proposal: 9-10  $\mu\text{g}/\text{m}^3$

## PM<sub>2.5</sub> 24-hour Standard

- Current: 35  $\mu\text{g}/\text{m}^3$  – 98<sup>th</sup> percentile, averaged over 3 years
- CASAC Recommendation: 25-30  $\mu\text{g}/\text{m}^3$
- EPA Proposal: Retain standard but soliciting comments on lowering

## PM<sub>10</sub> 24-hour Standard


- Current: 150  $\mu\text{g}/\text{m}^3$  – 98<sup>th</sup> percentile, averaged over 3 years
- CASAC Recommendation: Retain Standard
- EPA Proposal: Retain Standard




# 2023 Ozone Design Value Trends – Preliminary




<sup>1</sup>Attainment Goal - According to the US Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) National Ambient Air Quality Standards, attainment is reached when, at each monitor, the *Design Value* (three-year average of the annual fourth-highest daily maximum eight-hour average ozone concentration) is equal to or less than 70 parts per billion (ppb).

# Monitor Locations with Associated Fourth Highest Value


## 2023 Ozone Season



Colors represent Air Quality Index Breakpoints




Prevailing Wind Direction During Summer Ozone Season
