RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING CONTRACTS FOR AED KIOSK SERVICES

WHEREAS, NCTCOG is a voluntary association of, by and for local governments established to assist in planning for common needs, cooperating for mutual benefit, and coordinating for sound regional development; and,

WHEREAS, a Request for Proposals (RFP) #2024-074 for Automated External Defibrillator (AED) Kiosk Services was advertised and proposals received on June 12, 2024; and,

WHEREAS, proposals were evaluated by a committee comprised of staff from a member agency; and,

WHEREAS, following evaluation, it is recommended that contracts be awarded to ZapStand, LLC, and AED123, LLC; and,

WHEREAS, the contracts are intended to be utilized by NCTCOG, its member governments and other participating entities as part of NCTCOG's TXShare Cooperative Purchasing Program; and,

WHEREAS, NCTCOG has complied with federal and State regulations regarding contract and procurement proceedings for this procurement #2024-074.

WHEREAS, the Regional Transportation Council (RTC), comprised primarily of local elected officials, is the regional transportation policy body associated with NCTCOG, and has been and continues to be a forum for cooperative decisions on transportation; and,

WHEREAS, NCTCOG is a Designated Recipient for Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Urbanized Area Formula Program, Enhanced Mobility of Seniors and Individuals with Disabilities Program, and Bus and Bus Facilities Program funds in the Dallas-Fort Worth-Arlington, Denton-Lewisville and McKinney-Frisco Urbanized Areas, as delegated by the Governor of the State of Texas; and,

WHEREAS, Subtask 3.05 of the Fiscal Year (FY) 2024 and FY2025 Unified Planning Work Program supports the coordination with strategic partners to develop transit projects that meet the transit needs of seniors, individuals with disabilities; and low-income populations for job access; and,

WHEREAS, City of Dallas, City of Desoto, City of Lancaster, and STAR Transit will serve as subrecipients under the grant award; and,

WHEREAS, the Cities of Dallas, Desoto and Lancaster are contributing associated local contribution; and,

WHEREAS, on July 8, 2021, the RTC approved the submittal of three grant applications for a total of \$60.2 million in funding under the Rebuilding American Infrastructure with Sustainability and Equity (RAISE) Grant Program; and,

WHEREAS, on July 22, 2021, the Executive Board endorsed the RAISE Grant application; and,

WHEREAS, on November 16, 2021, the FTA awarded NCTCOG the FY21 RAISE Grant for the Southern Dallas Inland Port Project and, therefore, NCTCOG will serve as the grantee for the RAISE Grant with overall grant and compliance responsibilities; and,

WHEREAS, STAR Transit is a public transportation provider in Dallas County and has identified opportunities to support transit services in Dallas County for this project; and,

WHEREAS, the Interlocal Cooperation Act, Chapter 791 of the Texas Government Code, provides authority for NCTCOG to enter into agreements with City of Dallas, City of Desoto, and City of Lancaster for the provision of governmental functions and services of mutual interest.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED THAT:

Section 1.

NCTCOG is authorized to execute agreements with local partners referenced in Attachment 1 for the implementation of the Enhancing Mobility within the Southern Dallas Inland Port Project.

Section 2. These funds shall be incorporated into the appropriate fiscal year budget.

Section 3. The Executive Director or designee is authorized to execute necessary agreements in the name of the North Central Texas Council of Governments to carry out the initiatives described herein.

Section 4. This resolution shall be in effect immediately upon its adoption.
