

<u>Updates/Adjustments to Ongoing Program Activities for FY26:</u>

Coordination for Flood Science Training - NCTCOG will continue to offer relevant training to the region's floodplain professionals. NCTCOG is partnering with the USACE to offer training regarding flood science. The USACE Hydrologic Engineering Center supports water resources management responsibilities with research, training, planning analysis, and technical assistance. NCTCOG will work with USACE to promote the use of free online trainings offered by USACE that include, but are not limited to, 1D/2D modeling, HEC-RAS, HEC-HMS, and other flood science <u>software</u>. USACE will develop training for city staff, developers, <u>and engineers</u> regarding the CDC process, including technical evaluation of proposed projects, the review process, common technical issues, and the use of the consolidated model.



#### Additional program activities for FY26:

Support Participation in the FEMA Community Rating System (CRS)— NCTCOG will facilitate a CRS Users Group for exchange of best practices related to communities' participation in CRS. This may include supporting a multi-jurisdictional Program for Public Information. This program could make CRS communities eligible for bonus points on outreach projects and other CRS public information activities.



Updates/Adjustments to Ongoing Add. Technical Activities for FY26:

Participation in the Model Consolidation Committee – A committee of regional partners and communities completed a series of meetings resulting in a memorandum in FY 2020 to ensure a smooth transition for the use of the consolidated model. In May 2023, the first ever consolidated model was approved by the Flood Management Task Force. In October 2024, work by the USACE to develop East Fork of the Trinity River (East Fork) future flows and hydraulic modeling was completed. Currently, there is not a timeline or funding mechanism to incorporate the East Fork modeling into the consolidated model. The USACE Floodplain Management Services (FPMS) program is a potential source of funding to incorporate the East Fork modeling into the consolidated model. The FEMA preliminary studies on the Trinity River main stem and the East Fork are scheduled to go effective in the future. NCTCOG will continue to have a representative on this committee to attend all meetings, inform the FMTF of committee activities, coordinate with FMTF communities, and conduct administrative coordination activities to establish this new process. These activities will also include coordination with the USACE related to technical work.

### 4. FY2025 Trinity River Common Vision Work Program

#### **NFIP-CDC Model Maintenance and Extension Efforts**

- The USACE is continuing to incorporate approved CDC projects into the consolidated NFIP-CDC model and conduct ongoing model maintenance and expansion.
- 1. NFIP and CDC Model Consolidation Team
  - USACE is continuing to prepare a CDC program training in coordination with NCTCOG.
  - Model name to be revised to remove "NFIP" as requested by FEMA.
- 2. East Fork/Denton Creek Update and Expansion of the CDC Program West
  - The CDC East Fork and Mainstem extension was approved at the February 2025 FMTF meeting. The current models have been uploaded to the NCTCOG website.
  - Note that CDC and NFIP models in this area will remain separate until funding permits consolidation.
  - USACE is working on a pilot study for TSI to expand the CDC program to the West TSI area. The study is along Town Creek in the City of Weatherford, in coordination with city staff.







### TSI - Preliminary Findings on Valley Storage


- Definition The volume of water that is occupied in a river's floodplain during a flood.
- Function Flood water storage…like a reservoir.
- Regulation FEMA's NFIP
  - Development prohibited in Floodway
  - Development allowed in Floodway Fringe
- Impacts of Valley Storage Loss
  - Flow increases
  - Elevation increases
  - Shorter flood response times
  - Life safety threat





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

# TSI Study's Understanding of Higher Flood Standards

FEMA considers ASCE 24-24 the "gold standard" for flood-resistant design.

\*\*Enforceable only when explicitly adopted or referenced in local code.

IBC 2024 references ASCE 24-14, not 24-24.

ASCE 24-24 must be adopted separately to be enforceable.

Local jurisdictions can adopt ASCE 24-24 as a standalone or as an amendment to IBC.



# Comparison Chart: ASCE 24-12 vs. ASCE 24-24

ASCE 24-24 introduces 29 key changes over its 2014 predecessor, significantly enhancing flood resilience

Category	ASCE 24-14	ASCE 24-24	
Flood Hazard Area Coverage	Focused on 100-year floodplain (SFHA).	Expands to 500-, 750-, and 1000-year flood levels.	
Elevation Requirements	General elevation standards.	Risk-based, tied to Flood Design Class.	
Climate Change Considerations	Not required.	Required in coastal floodplain calculations.	
Dry Floodproofing Standards	No standardized testing.	Requires ANSI/FM 2510 testing and maintenance plans.

### **Use of Common Vision Cost-Share Funds to Support TSI**

- \$30,000 approved at 2024 Steering Committee meeting to support USACE participation in TSI-North Study Area
- USACE able to provide \$50,00 in match funds although number is in flux
  - Does not match entire \$150,000 in NCTCOG local funds from COMMON VISION + Public Works Council + Regional Stormwater Coordinating Council
- NCTCOG hopes to use remainder of local funds for a personal services agreement with former USACE staffer who worked on TSI
- Will ask Steering Committee to re-allocate \$30,000 (TBD):
  - ►\$5,000 USACE actual amount TBD
  - ■\$25,000 PSA actual amount TBD

Happy to make this a voting item to recommend to Steering Committee if FMTF would like to vote on this.


