

# **SUMMARY**

Public Education Task Force Wednesday, April 21, 2021 9:30 a.m.. Microsoft Teams

1. Welcome and Introductions.

### **PRESENTATION ITEMS**

2. **2021 Doo the Right Thing Campaign.** Dates for the 2021 Doo The Right Thing campaign will be announced.

The Doo The Right Thing social media photo contest period is scheduled to open on May 1, 2021 and run through June 30, 2021. The social media **toolkit** and corresponding **visuals** for the contest period are available on the PETF program page. Contest participants are encouraged to visit **www.dfwstormwater.com/PetWaste** to learn about the importance of picking up pet waste, to submit their pledge and contest photos. Voting on submissions will happen around the July or August timeframe, with the featured monthly winners announced at the October PETF meeting.

3. **North Texas Community Cleanup Challenge Project Update.** NCTCOG staff will update the group on the status of the North Texas Community Cleanup Challenge website and resources.

The website for the North Texas Community Cleanup Challenge is nearing completion with the addition of educational and toolbox content being added. Items in the Partner Resources Toolbox will include: a template for a Mayors Proclamation and a Press Release; Personal Protective Equipment Litter Guidance Volunteer guidelines; Safety tips; and a Certificate of Participation that participants can download at the close of the challenge. Members are encouraged to sign-on to the challenge by visiting the <u>Sign Up</u> page of the website.

4. **FY21 Work Project Update.** An update on the status of training webinars for the current fiscal year Work Program be given.

The <u>presentations</u> and <u>recording</u> of the recent webinar "Healthy Creeks and Waterways – Vegetation and the Flow of Healthy Waterways" is now available online. Work is ongoing for the next webinar on low-impact design and small scale BMPs. Email announcements will go out once dates have been set.

5. **Legislative Updates.** NCTCOG staff will give a brief update on State bills of interest in the current legislative sessions.

A short matrix of legislative bills from the Texas 87<sup>th</sup> Legislative Session, which may be of interest to members, was provided. Three of the bills (<u>H.B. 520</u>, <u>S.B. 1128</u>, and <u>S.B. 1772</u>) are viewed as pollinator friendly bills with the later having received the most traction. <u>House Bill 348</u>, and companion <u>S.B. 2990</u>, relate to a requirement to make certain environmental and water use permit applications available online. <u>House Bill 3814</u>, and the companion <u>S.B. 2097</u>, relate to the regulation by the TCEQ of the discharge of preproduction plastic from point and nonpoint sources to ensure zero discharge or release of plastic into water or onto land in the state and to ensure the prompt cleanup of any discharged or released plastic.

## **DISCUSSION/ACTION ITEMS**

6. **FY22 Program Discussion.** NCTCOG staff will start a discussion on work project ideas for the Fiscal Year 2022 Work Program. Staff will also kick off initial discussions on slogan and/or visual ideas for the 2022 March is Texas SmartScape Month campaign.

NCTCOG staff asked the group for input on a special project theme or idea for the FY22 Work Program. Ideas that were suggested by the group include social media toolkits, educational videos (such as Freddy the Fish which is one of the most popular videos currently in use), a focus on the water cycle (natural and water/wastewater) and how they intersect, and additional BMPs or trainings. Staff will follow up in the coming weeks with a survey for members to submit and vote on suggestions. After the initial survey has closed, a follow-up survey will be sent, if needed. The follow-up survey would include additional suggestions from the initial survey for a final vote on the special project for FY22. The special project topic will need to finalized and presented to the RSWMCC for their approval.

Members were asked for their input on a slogan for the 2022 March is Texas SmartScape slogan. Staff will be initiating work on this program earlier to allow for time to capture photos of plants and landscapes while still in season or bloom for use in corresponding visuals.

7. **Discussion on Stormwater Cooperative Purchase.** NCTCOG staff will poll the group to determine interest in and need for the Stormwater Cooperative Purchase program this summer.

Recent years has seen a significant decline in participation in the Stormwater Cooperative Purchase program. Due to this decline, members were polled to gauge their interest in participating in a cooperative purchase this summer should the Stormwater budget allow for work on this program. A majority of members indicated that they did not need to participate in the program, a few were not certain if they needed it, and no members indicated that they do need the program. NCTCOG staff will take the feedback into consideration and reminded members where they can find the **Stormwater Cooperative Purchase Vendor and Purchasing Guide** when planning to purchase items on their own.

8. Trash Free Waters Update and Brief Discussion to Gauge the Appetite of Local Governments in Engaging Recreational Groups in Litter Cleanup Activities. NCTCOG will provide an overview of the Engage and Educate initiative associated with the EPA Trash Free Waters grant. NCTCOG will facilitate a brief discussion on litter cleanup activities to gain an understanding of what our stakeholders are able and willing to do to promote and coordinate these events and also what support is needed from NCTCOG to advance these efforts. Additionally, volunteers will be requested to form an advisory group to guide the Trash Free Waters team's efforts on this initiative.

NCTCOG provided members with an update on tasks being undertaken for the EPA Trash Free Waters grant program, specifically those that fall under the deliverable "Engage and Educate". The project team will be initiating work under this task in the coming months and requested input from members on engaging in new or unique litter cleanup activities with recreation groups. Specifically, the project team is seeking to conduct pilot events which connect communities with recreational groups on cleanup activities such as plogging or integrating litter cleanups with cycling and paddling activities.

The outcome of the pilot will be the development of resources and/or toolkits to help communities who wish to connect with recreational groups and new audiences on unique cleanup activities. To help facilitate this work, the formation of a short-term Advisory Group is under consideration. NCTCOG is seeking communities to be a part of the Advisory Group and asked what members, as potential stakeholders, are able and willing to do to promote and coordinate on these types of events. Feedback from the members of the group indicated that due to small staff sizes, coordinating events is hard, especially when they fall on the weekend. Member do not feel that they have the capacity to take on new events, but they are very interested in working with recreational groups who would like to engage in litter cleanup activities.

The Regional Wet Weather Characterization Program is currently in the fourth year of their program term. They are in the beginning phase of implementation of Best Management Practices Analysis and Evaluation Plan (BANEP). Currently, NCTCOG staff are collecting BMP data and all participants have met with the consultant.

The next <u>TMDL Stormwater Technical Subcommittee Meeting</u> will be on May 4, 2021 at 9:30 AM via Microsoft Teams. NCTCOG will be presenting the final "What is a Total Maximum Daily Load?" educational explainer video.

The next <u>TMDL Wastewater Technical Subcommittee Meeting</u> will be on May 13, 2021 at 9:30 AM via Microsoft Teams. NCTCOG will be presenting the final On-Site Sewage Facility (OSSF) Social Media Toolkit.


Richardson: Will be hosting a contactless Trash Bash cleanup event on Saturday, April 24th.
