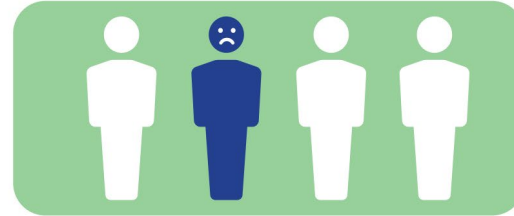


# The Digital Gap is Growing

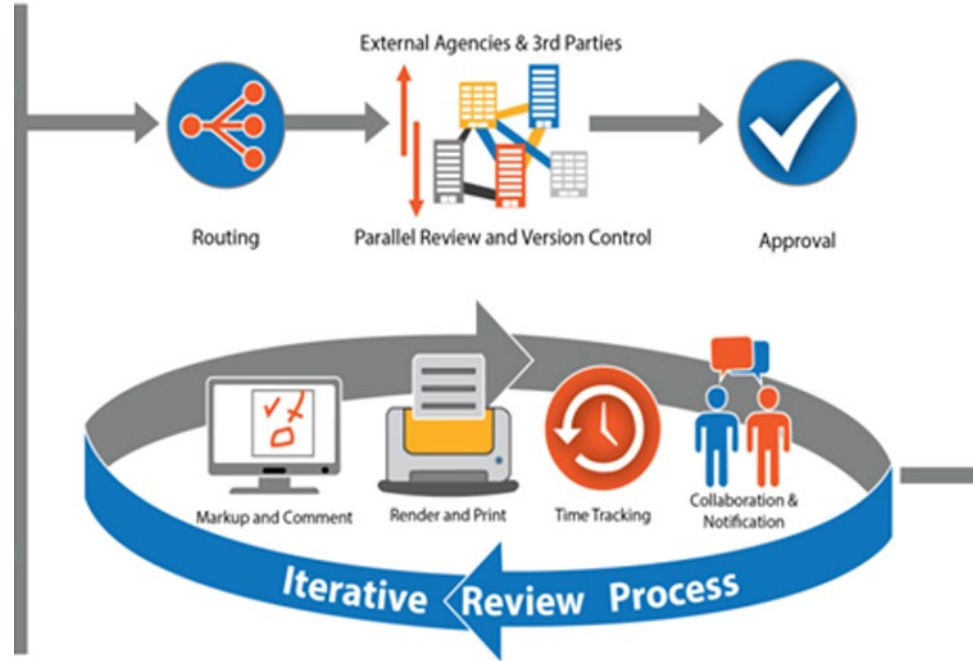

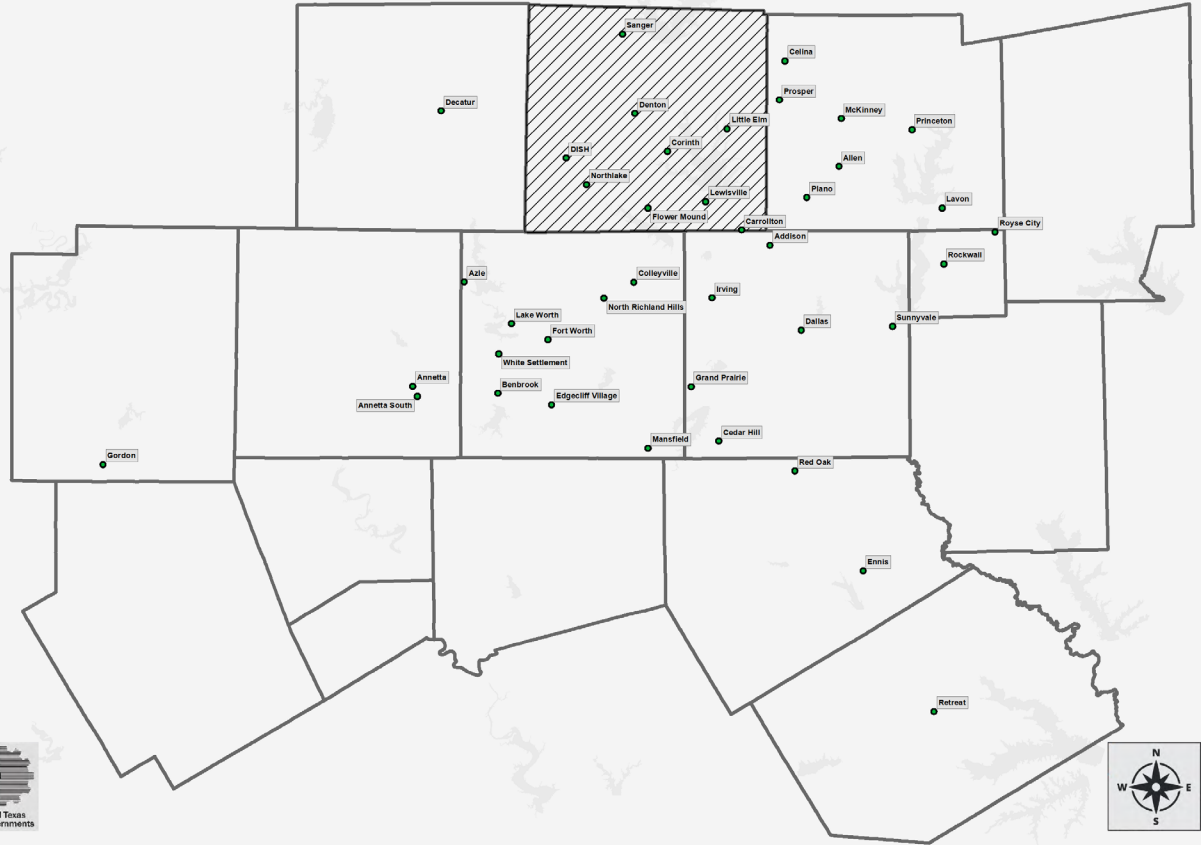
# **North Central Texas Council of Governments Regional Model Construction Code Survey 2023 Results**

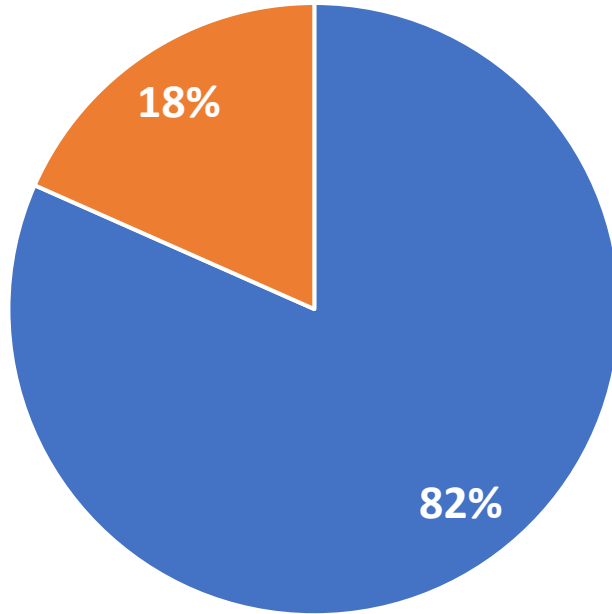
## 2023 NCTCOG Regional Codes Adoption Survey Responses

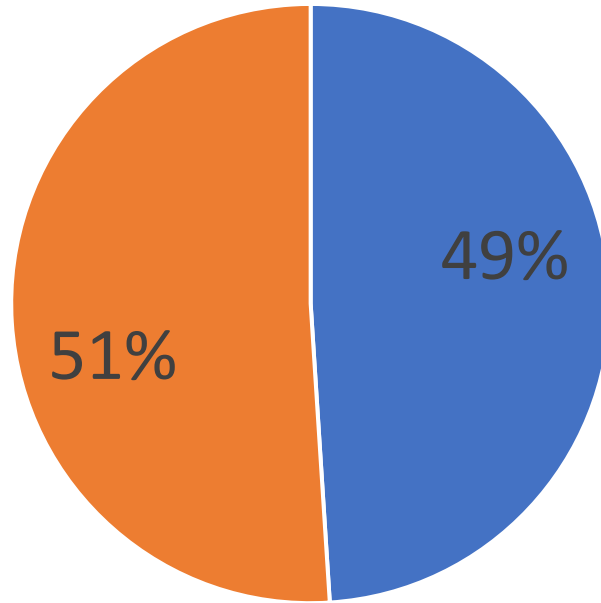

# Does your city typically adopt NCTCOG's recommended amendments as published?

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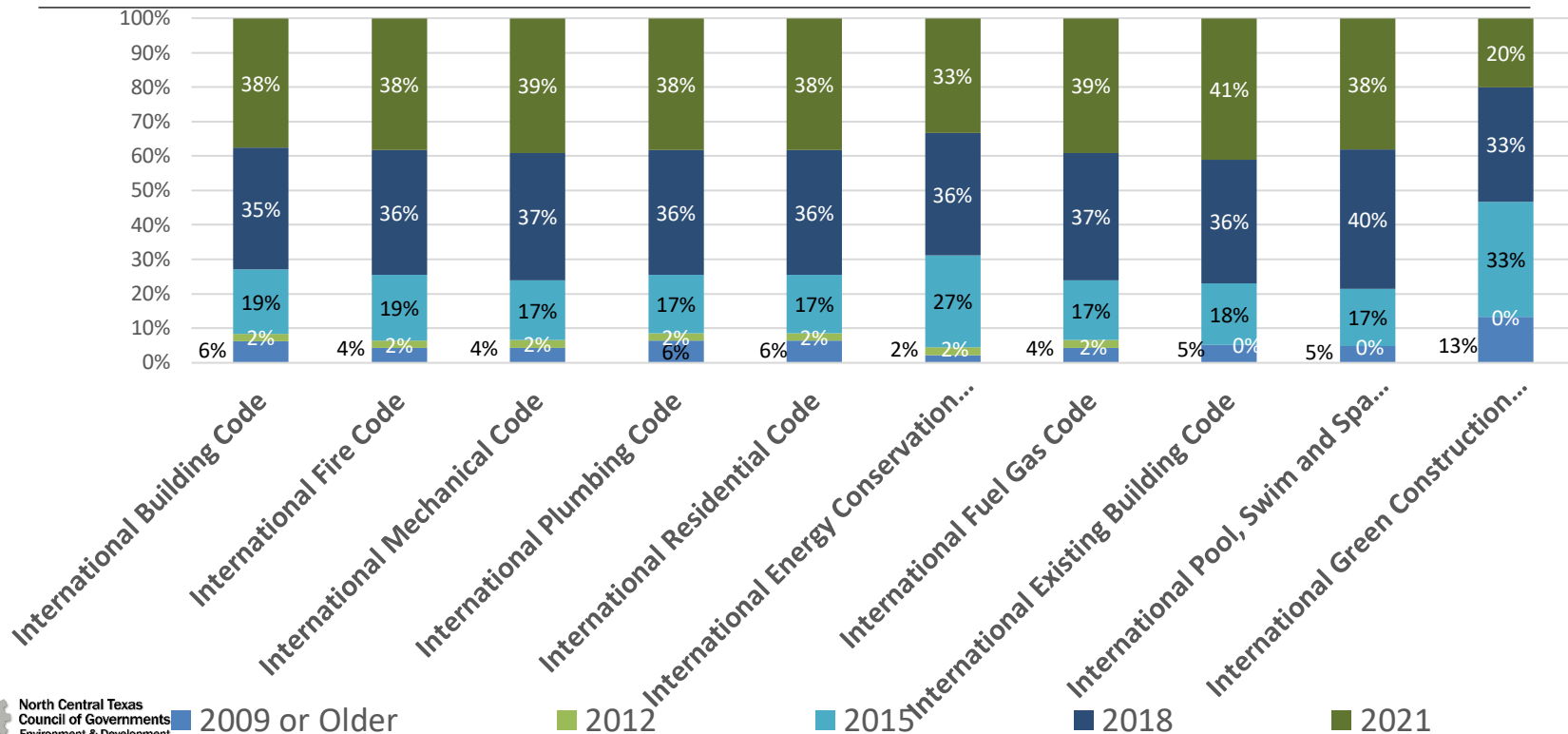

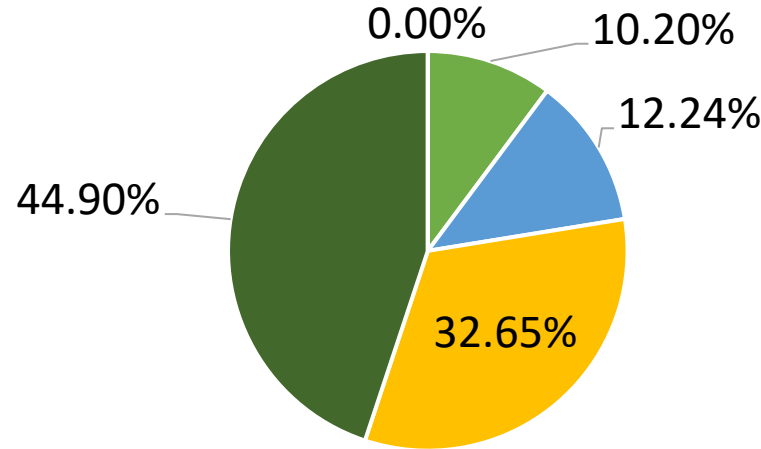




# Indicate the year of the code your city has most recently adopted (Cont'd).

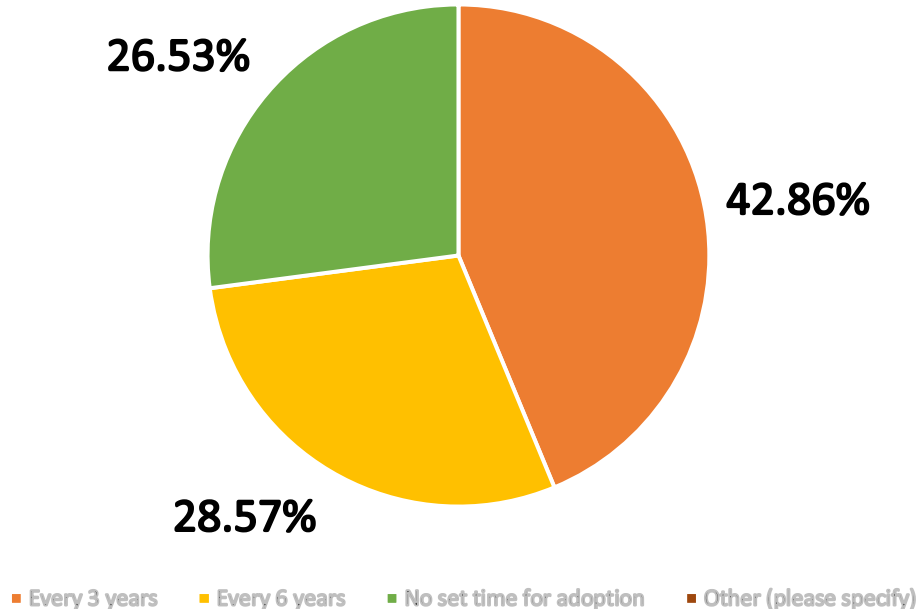

# What is your city's code adoption schedule?



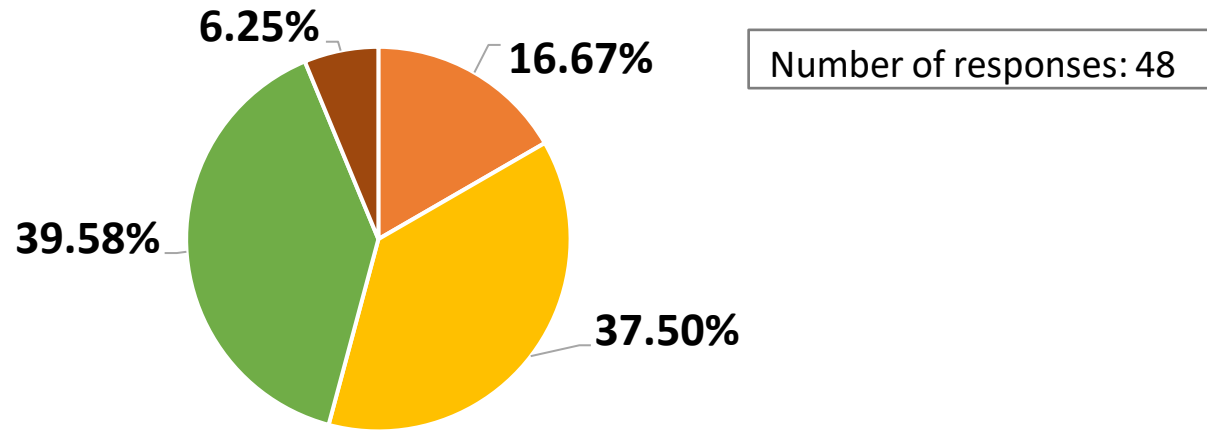

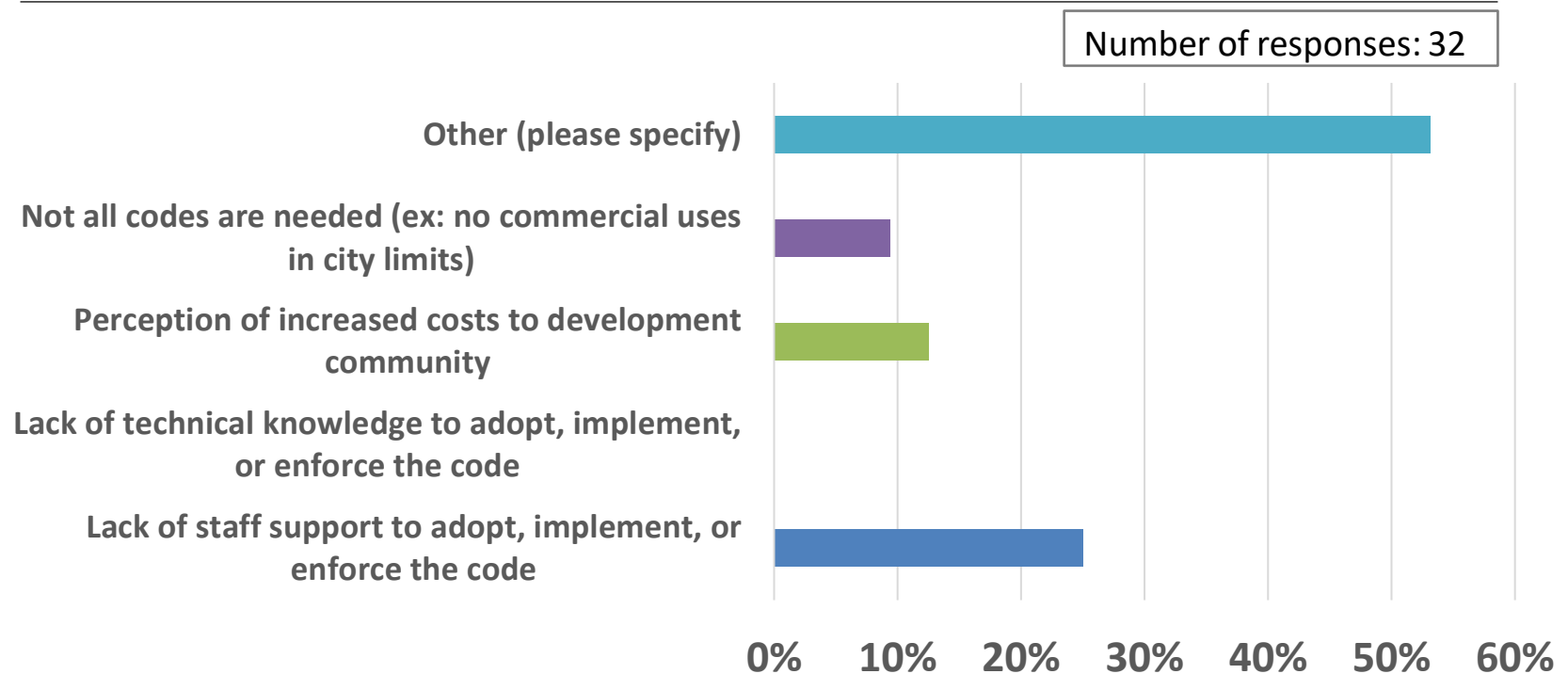

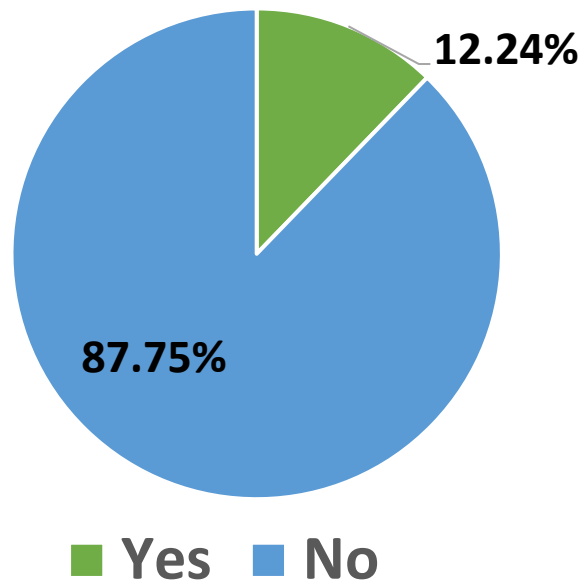
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- *“Did not agree with changes in code”*

# Some responses to why the city does not plan to adopt the 2021 International Green Construction Code (IGCC)

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- *“No way to enforce”*
- *“Not a town priority to enforce”*
- *“Overly costly and burdensome to development”*
- *“We adopt the state mandated IECC”*
- *“[Our city] is a very small city”*
- *“If an applicant wants to build a green building, they will be allowed to do so following the IGCC. The city will not require it.”*
