Fort Worth's PFAS Regulatory Initiative.** Jerry Pressley, Assistant Water Director, and Casey Nettles, Environmental Supervisor for the City of Fort Worth, will present on Fort Worth's PFAS Regulatory Initiative, which includes work to become one of the first municipalities in Texas to develop PFAS wastewater discharge limits for industrial users.

7. Pretty Fun Awesome Substances- Developing a Laboratory Program for PFAS. Brian Neal, Laboratory Supervisor for the Trinity River Authority, will present the techniques and standardized protocols used in laboratories looking to identify and quantify PFAS concentrations.
