
# Scope of Work


#### **Project Task Flowchart**




#### Defects in Fair Bridges (AASHTO Bridge Element Inspection Manual)





# Cracking of a Fair Bridge Deck

### Bridge ID: 180570000911196

- 2017 inspection report
  - Deck riding surface had cracks (~1/4" wide) along repairs.
  - Several cracks in deck soffit.
  - Deck component rating Poor.
- 2020 inspection report
  - Deck rating was still 4.
  - Had minor to moderate transverse and block cracking.
  - Most extensive in spans 5 and 6: some cracks spaced as close as 12 in.
  - Recommendation: replace deck.
