Federal Incentives

Qualified Plug-In Electric Drive Motor Vehicle Tax Credit

Individuals who purchase a qualified electric car* are eligible for up to a \$7,500, nonrefundable tax credit.

Previously Owned Clean Vehicle Tax Credit

Individuals who purchase a qualified used electric car* are eligible for up to a \$4,000, nonrefundable tax credit. The price of the used vehicle cannot exceed \$25,000.



State Incentives

Light-Duty Motor Vehicle Purchase or Lease Incentive Program (LDPLIP)

The LDPLIP can provide a \$2,500 rebate to individuals who purchase or lease a new electric car*. This rebate is available on a first-come, first-served basis starting September 1 of each odd-numbered year.

Electric Infrastructure

Alternative Fuel Infrastructure Tax Credit

Consumers who purchase qualified residential fueling equipment, such as charging infrastructure, between January 1, 2023, and December 31, 2032, may receive a tax credit of up to \$1,000.

*Electric car refers to both battery electric and hydrogen fuel cell electric vehicles.
