

SUMMARY

Illicit Discharge Detection and Elimination Task Force Thursday, December 20, 2018 9:30 AM, Pitstick Conference Room NCTCOG Offices, CPII 616 Six Flags Drive, Arlington, TX 76011

1. Welcome and introductions.

The meeting began at 9:30 a.m. with introductions of all present.

DISCUSSION/PRESENTATION/ACTION ITEMS

2. **Meeting Summary.** The July 12, 2018, meeting summary is available online for review. Comments will be sought at the meeting. (Mia Brown)

The Summary was approved pending a change to Item Five.

- 3. **FY 2019 Work Program.** NCTCOG staff will solicit input for FY 2019 work program items. (Mia Brown)
 - **a. Basic Dry Weather Field Screening Training.** NCTCOG staff will solicit input for possible training dates, locations, and instructors from the Task Force.

The Task Force decided that a date in June would be best. The City of Carrollton said they would host the training, and the City of Arlington said they would provide instructors.

b. Advanced Dry Weather Field Screening Training. NCTCOG staff will solicit input for possible training dates, locations, and instructors from the Task Force.

The Task Force decided that a date in September would be best. The City of Carrollton said they would host the training. The group requested that City of Denton lead the training, and City of Arlington said that they would teach it if the City of Denton could not.

c. Automotive Related Business Outreach Publications. NCTCOG staff will review first drafts of ARB materials with the Task Force to obtain further guidance and input.

A draft publication was presented to the Task Force in the form of a sheet and a trifold. After discussion, the group wanted to continue with both formats, with the trifold serving as an informational hand-out and the sheet serving as more of a guidance document for how to keep shops clean that could be posted. Mia Brown told the group she would send the draft documents out via email for comments and that a second draft would be available at the March Task Force meeting.

OTHER BUSINESS AND ROUNDTABLE DISCUSSION

4. **Roundtable Topics/Other Business.** The IDDE Task Force members and NCTCOG staff may share additional items as time allows.

Mia Brown, NCTCOG, told the group that TCEQ has posted the draft of the updated General Permit for Phase II MS4s, and that it is scheduled to be adopted by the Commission on January 16, 2019.

Cathy Matthews, City of Fort Worth, mentioned that the city recently hired an environmental specialist named David Hancock.

Tad Heimburger, DART, discussed how their program for track inspectors to report spills/discharges during safety inspections has been successful.

Rene Caraveo, City of Frisco, told the group that they currently have 150 active business/development sites and 1400-1500 new homes under construction at any given time. The city has spent a lot of time ensuring that sites have renewed their construction general permits.

Jon Bunner, City of Duncanville, announced he will be moving to the City of Carrollton Engineering Department in January.

Krista Pender, City of Carrollton, announced that they are beginning dry weather field screening in January. Krista then asked the group about how they will deal with floatables and construction controls with the new permit requirements, and there was discussion about different types of structural controls to capture floatables.

Howard Redfearn, City of Mansfield, discussed the ongoing process to capture an illegal dumper who has been dumping 55-gallon drums of automotive paint.

Zach Peterson, City of Denton, mentioned that they updated their stormwater criteria to require a drainage map for construction sites before grading and after grading at final plat. He also mentioned a new project that produces water quality data with a live feed that is viewable by the public. He then asked the other members in attendance how they deal with mobile trash can cleaning services, and a discussion began. The consensus was that it is usually covered under cosmetic services ordinances which prohibit this type of service unless the vendor captures the water, with some cities charging for a permit.



North Central Texas Council of Governments

Subha Pandey, Town of Flower Mound, is working on their annual report. They are also looking into updating their stormwater management plan and integrating MCM Seven into it. Some of the issues the Town is currently facing are fire hydrant flushing as well as unmaintained detention/retention ponds on HOA properties. The Town is also currently investigating an intermittent discharge of petroleum products that is entering their wastewater treatment plant.

Brigette Gibson, City of Arlington, told the group that they began automotive related business inspections on October 1st. They do not currently charge for inspections, and updates to their ordinance have not been approved yet. They will also have a paid intern position coming open soon for outfall mapping.

Tamara Cook, NCTCOG, gave the following updates:

- The first public activity report through December 15th is ready, and the next one will be out in January.
- The Post-Construction Workshop was held December 4th and the presentation is available on the iSWM website.
- The next iSWM Implementation Subcommittee meeting will be January 9th.
- The next Public Education Task Force meeting is January 16th.
- The next Pollution Prevention Task Force meeting is pending. Staff are currently working on video updates from the last meeting.
- The Standard Drawings Subcommittee is currently working on updating the stormwater section of standard detail drawings. If you would like to help with these updates, please let us know.
- The next TMDL Stormwater Subcommittee meeting is January 22nd.
- An announcement was made by the EPA regarding a new proposed Waters of the United States rule. The draft document has not yet been posted to the Federal Register.
- Applications for the 2019 CLIDE Awards are being accepted from February 4-March 1, 2019.
- The Texas Riparian Association has an upcoming conference and symposium from February 27-March 1. The call for abstracts has been extended to January 11th.
- City of Denton will be hosting the EPA Region 6 Stormwater Conference. David Hunter is setting up a conference committee and asking for volunteers.
- 5. **Schedule for the Next Meeting**. The next meeting date is tentatively scheduled for Thursday, March 28, 2019, at 9:30 a.m., location to be determined due to building renovations.
