Construction Standards

- Anticipated release date: October 2016
- Will be available for purchase online as a PDF. Costs TBA.
- Construction Standards Subcommittee has reviewed 3 out of 5 groups' edits.
 - Groups are working to revise their edits based on comments.
- Public Works Council has reviewed 1 out of 5 groups' edits.
- Public comment period will occur prior to release and final adoption by the Public Works Council and NCTCOG Executive Board.

Sustainable Public Rights of Way (SPROW)

• SPROW will focus on education, and will continue to support SPROW Education Forums.



integrated Stormwater Management (iSWM)

- Continuous outreach to City Managers and City Council members through "Benefits of iSWM" meetings.
- Issuing an RFQ to procure for iSWM consultant in summer 2016.
 - Contract will begin at the start of FY2017.

Pavement Analysis Services Procurement Update

- Subject matter experts met in July 2015 to discuss feasibility of shared services contract.
- Attendees at 2015 Roundup indicated by a survey that they may be interested in participating in this shared services contract.
- Subject matter experts assisted in drafting a procurement document to release to procure these services.
- RFQ was released on March 1st.

Pavement Analysis Services Procurement Update (cont'd)

- Submissions were due April 19th.
- After vendor selection, municipalities will be able to contract with the vendor for pavement analysis services from a menu of options.
 - Options include: sidewalk data, ADA ramp data, photos of signs, PCI scores, budget estimates, pavement rehab plan, and more.
- Overall goal of project: decrease costs for municipalities interested in doing pavement analysis by procuring as a shared service.

Utility Coordination

- As requested by the Public Works Council (PWC), we are reaching out to utility companies, and bringing them to our PWC meetings.
- Have met with AT&T, Atmos, and Oncor.
- Goals of these meetings:
 - to increase coordination between utility companies and municipalities, and
 - to discuss issues and work towards improving those issues.

Cost Shares

- Cost shares will remain the same as they were in FY2016.
- Commitment Response Forms will be sent out at the end of June or in July by email.

FY 2017 Additional Activities

- Public Works Council voted on additional activities for the FY 2017 Work Program.
