





Q4 Would water related social media toolkits be useful to your organization?




Q6 Please rank the water resources issues listed below in order of priority with 1 being the highest priority and 7 being the lowest priority.

- > WQMP funded by 604 (b) of Clean Water Act
- ➤ What is the purpose of this funding?

EPA - "Determine the nature and extent of point and nonpoint source water pollution and to develop plans based on a watershed approach."

TCEQ - "To develop and maintain the WQMP; to review projects for conformance with the Plan, and to support public education."

- > TCEQ allows flexibility regarding the information included in the WQMP.
- > 2021 WQMP contract already underway. Will include data collection for OSSFs in region.
- > 2022 WQMP contract will be developed in fall 2021. NCTCOG will seek WRC input on the content of 2022 WQMP.


