1. **Welcome and Introductions**. The Public Works Council (PWC) Chair will welcome everyone to the meeting.

The Council Chair, Keith Marvin, read through the attendance list on WebEx and welcomed everyone.

#### **ACTION ITEMS**

2. **Meeting Summary**. The February 13, 2020 meeting summary is available for review. Approval will be sought at the meeting.

Manny Palacios motioned for approval of the summary, Gerald Cosgrove seconded; and the motion passed unanimously.

3. **iSWM Cost-Share Recommendation.** The iSWM Subcommittee Chair will introduce the subcommittee's recommendation on encouraging iSWM users to be cost-sharing participants of the Public Works Program. (Ranjan Muttiah)

Ranjan explained the Subcommittee's recommendation is to require that applicants for the Gold Certification must be annual cost-sharing members of the Public Works Program. It was suggested that Silver applicants also be required to be cost-sharing members since there are currently no Gold Certified cities or applications. Manny Palacios motioned to approve applicants for Gold Certification must be cost-sharing members. George Marshall seconded; and the motion passed.

### **DISCUSSION ITEM**

4. **Regional Public Works FY21 Work Program.** NCTCOG staff will introduce the FY21 Work Program for the Regional Public Works Program. The Council will be given a chance to make comments before it is voted on in the August meeting. (Olivia Kale)

Box 5888, Arlington, Texas 76005-5888 (817) 640-3300 FAX: 817-608-2372 www.nctcog.org NCTCOG staff explained that cities will be facing a tight budget next year due to COVID-19 and some will not be able to pay their cost-share. This will impact the Regional Public Works Budget which could impact how much of the Work Program NCTCOG staff is able to complete. Since cost-shares will be mailed out on Oct. 1st, NCTCOG won't know what the budget is until cost-shares are paid after the fiscal year has started. To help NCTCOG staff work on a possibly low budget, they asked the Council which activities they would like to prioritize at the beginning of the year.

Keith Marvin suggested local training since cities won't have the budget to host these. Jim Lockart said hydrology projects that have been started need to finish. Shawn Poe asked that COG staff send out a survey for Council members to prioritize the activities. Keith added that a question should be included at the bottom asking cities what challenges they are facing in their communities' budget and what pressure they are seeing on their budget. NCTCOG confirmed that they will be hosting the Public Works Roundup next year and that training will be a high priority.

5. Regional Construction Working Group. NCTCOG staff will inform the Council of a project to coordinate construction contracts in the region. (Jonathan Blackman) Jonathan Blackman introduced the Regional Construction Working Group. NCTCOG heard frustration from cities who were getting few bids on construction projects. NCTCOG held a meeting in November with 26 entities to see if there was a way that NCTCOG could help. They decided to see if more construction companies would respond if there was guaranteed work in a certain area. NCTCOG is also researching the possibility of a regional depository for contracts that other cities could join. These contracts would already be vetted so that cities would not have to go through the solicitation process.

Right now, they are looking for feedback on contracts that are used most. The Group recently sent out a survey to construction companies and the Group is working to send out a follow-up with more direct questions. The first survey results are available to the Council as a handout and will be sent in the meeting follow-up. If anyone is interested in joining the Group please contact Olivia Kale.

#### **INFORMATION ITEMS**

- 6. FY 2020 Public Works Work Program Update. NCTCOG staff will update the Council on recent Public Works efforts and Subcommittee activities. (Olivia Kale)
  There are 56 communities that cost-shared into the Regional Public Works Program this year. The Public Works Council had set a goal of going from an average of 46 communities to 70 communities participating, so this is a great step forward. Money that is not spent this fiscal year will be put into a deferred account for future use.
  - Standard Drawings Update. Subcommittee Representative will brief the Council on progress made towards updating the drawings in the Construction Standards Fifth Edition. (Keith Marvin)

#### **North Central Texas Council of Governments**

The subcommittee met February 4, 2020 and postponed the March meeting due to COVID-19. They will begin meeting again virtually in June to continue the discussion on landscape planning and vegetation maintenance.

• integrated Stormwater Management (iSWM) Activities. Subcommittee Chair will present an update of iSWM program activities. (Ranjan Muttiah)
Task Order 3 for the contract with Halff is complete. All criteria from the iSWM Program Implementation Tiered Measurement have been reviewed for 53 communities. Halff created maps that summarized seven criteria for eight counties. NCTCOG staff will upload the new maps to the iSWM website. Updates were made to the methodology in the Technical Manual rainfall intensities and USGS rainfall tables were removed and replaced with the new information. The draft iSWM BMP Installation Video has been developed. The Subcommittee members and NCTCOG staff will review the video for future posting to the website.

Task Order 4 was approved by the Subcommittee on April 27, 2020 and will go from May 1, 2020 through April 30, 2021. The tasks include:

- 1. Project Management and Meeting Attendance
- 2.Reorganize/Re-evaluate Site Development Controls
- 3. Guidance on developing a regional detention program
- 4. Detention criteria guidance research
- 5.Re-evaluate 85th Percentile (1.5") Rainfall Requirements
- 6.5-Year Outreach and Implementation Strategy (High priority)
- 7. Provide details and specifications for water quality BMPs

## 7. Other Program Activities.

Cooperative Technical Partnership Program and the Community Rating System Users Group. NCTCOG staff will provide an update on FEMA's Cooperative Technical Partner (CTP) Program activities and the Floodplain Administrators/Community Rating System Users Group. (Mia Brown) For FY17 CTP Projects the Flood Risk Review meetings for Town Creek and Stream CF-5 were held in November/December. The Richland-Chambers Watersheds Post-Discovery Webinar was held April 2nd. The recording and Draft Discovery Report can be found here: <a href="https://www.nctcog.org/envir/watershed-management/cooperating-technical-partners/discovery">https://www.nctcog.org/envir/watershed-management/cooperating-technical-partners/discovery</a>. For the FY18 CTP Projects the Flood Risk ID on Marys Creek in Parker County is ongoing and hydrology is nearly complete. For the FY19 CTP Projects the Harriet Creek (Denton County, 7 miles) and Waxahachie Creek (Ellis County, Midlothian, Waxahachie; 19 miles) flood risk identification projects kicked off in April. For the FY20 CTP Projects NCTCOG will apply for a communications grant related to the Transportation-Stormwater Infrastructure project. An application for a flood risk identification project on Catherine Branch in Denton County is tentative.

A Community Rating System (CRS) Users Group meeting was held Monday, May 4<sup>th</sup> from 8:30 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. with speakers from FEMA Region 6, City of Dallas, City of Fort Worth, and Harris County. The topics were updates to the CRS Manual, NFIP legislation, repetitive loss, and substantial damage. CFMs received 3.5 CECs for attendance. Planning is underway for a tentative Combined Elected Officials Floodplain Seminar/CRS Users Group in the summer. Details will be released when they are available.

- Public Works Emergency Response Team (PWERT). A PWERT representative or NCTCOG staff will give an update on recent PWERT activities. (Manny Palacios) There have been no requests recently for PWERT assistance. If assistance is needed the response might be limited with staff and jurisdictions.
- Texas Chapter of the American Public Works Association (APWA) Update. A
  representative will update the Council on upcoming local events and meetings. (Shawn
  Poe)

The TX Chapter of APWA Award Nominations were due May 1st. The June TX Chapter of APWA Annual Conference in Galveston at Moody Gardens is postponed until May 17-19, 2021. The PWX 2020 in New Orleans, LA has been canceled.


