- 2012 EPA Awards Grant
  - Stewardship Action Council to develop a sustainability forum in the DFW area
- July 2012 Kick Off
  - Discussions begin with Cities and other interested parties to develop sustainability workshops
- October 2012 February 2013 Workshops
  - Develop mission and vision statements, goals, and workgroups



# Developing the North Central Texas Stewardship Forum

- October 2013 First Annual Forum Conference
  - Held the Forum's first conference at UTA. Shared workgroup successes, and discussed the need and value for group.
- January 2014 Grant Project Completed, but now what...
  - Group wants to continue and forms a volunteer group to shape the Forum. Begin discussions on how to organize and structure the group.
- December 2014 NCTSF Framework Formalized
  - The founding cites (Fort Worth, Dallas, Plano, Denton) sign voluntary structure agreement.

## Background

- Focus on reducing landfilled recyclables
- Equal Recycling Services to all residents
- Prior NCTCOG Grant Program in 2005
- Crime Free Multi-Housing Ordinance passed in December 2011
- Focus area within 20 Year Comprehensive Solid Waste Management Plan

### Multi-Housing Recycling Program Requirements

# Multi-Housing Landlord (8+ Units) must submit recycling plan

- Plan must include
  - Materials to be recycled
  - Method of collection & storage of recyclables
  - Frequency of pick-ups by approved waste hauler
  - Property diagram showing the container location(s)



# Multi-Housing Recycling Plan Submission Dates

 For complexes (8+ units) in operation on or prior to October 31, 2013 recycling plan must be submitted by January 1, 2014

 For complexes (8+ units) in operation after November 1, 2013 recycling plan must be submitted NLT sixty days after Certificate of Occupancy is issued.



#### Recycle Plan Implementation

- Submitted plans approved by City
- Landlord implements plan within 30 days





#### Recycle Plan Waivers

- A waiver to providing a recycling plan may be granted by Director if –
  - Implementation is impossible
  - Implementation is impractical
  - Landlord can show no tenants wish to recycle

#### Participation & Contamination

#### Reduced Garbage

 27/30 respondents. 56% reported a noticeable reduction in amount of garbage, but only one complex reported reducing garbage service frequency.


#### Contamination

- 38/40 Respondents. 50% reported contamination as a problem
- Those that provided education material experienced less contamination



#### Inconvenience/or Access


Co-locating garbage & recycling

## Summary

- Multifamily recycling rate approximately 6%
- Participation rate approximately 50%
- Biggest challenge: Tenant Apathy
- Managers request more educational tools and help with education programs
- Strengthen Fort Worth ordinance
- Broader Study of All Price Class & Exempt/Wavier Sites
