heads and water moccasins (above). So what are we killing needlessly? In wet places, lots of nonvenomous snakes like the Broadbanded water snake, which can be aggressive and is basically not pretty.

Any other big scary snake, like the Rat snake. The irony is that virtually all of our snakes eat things that cause real damage — rats and mice. Just remember: The great majority of victims are bitten while messing with the snake. Such an easy group to avoid.






































2015 Compost Class Pile Temperatures




