



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- Own and operate 4 water supply reservoirs
 - Lake Bridgeport
 - Eagle Mountain Lake
 - Cedar Creek Reservoir
 - Richland-Chambers Reservoir
- Provide raw water to Tarrant Co. and surrounding areas
- Flood Protection
 - Reservoirs
 - Run of river operations
 - Provide varying levels of flood protection
 - Fort Worth Floodway
 - Local sponsor of Federal project
 - Maintain 27 miles of levee through Fort Worth



TRWD Flood Operations Before an Event


- System Monitor Designated staff member watching system 24/7
- System Monitor Duties
 - Tracks forecast (5-days out for flood)
 - Gage system maintenance
 - Data feed maintenance
 - Determine the potential for spillway operations
 - Determine need for official "Flood Monitoring"





TRWD Flood Operations During an Event

- Flood Teams Activated
 - Team size and shift duration are event driven
 - 2-4+ members
 - 8 to 24-hour shifts
- Flood Team Duties
 - Track rain Observed and forecast
 - Compute inflow and route to reservoirs
 - Evaluate/determine spillway operations
 - Communicate





TRWD Flood Operations During an Event Communication

- Internal Regular updates to management and staff
- External Partners
 - Spillway operation changes
 - **TRWD EOC** is responsible for notification
 - Notification via e-mail
 - State-wide calls with RFC
 - USACE communication
 - City of Fort Worth Lake Worth
