## **KEY STEPS TO SILVER**



- » Adopt a Complete Streets policy and create implementation guidance.
- » Continue to increase the amount of high quality bicycle parking throughout the community and to upgrade the quality of existing bike parking. Ensure that APBP-compliant bicycle parking is available in areas near popular destinations.
- » Consider lowering posted speed limits, particularly on neighborhood greenways and in residential areas, to under 25 MPH. Introduce road diets and traffic calming measures to ensure compliance.
- » Expand bicycle safety education to be a routine part of education for students of all ages, and ensure that schools and the surrounding neighborhoods are particularly safe and convenient for biking and walking. Work with local bicycle groups and interested parents to create Safe Routes to School programming for all K-12 schools.
- >> Continue to expand bicycle education opportunities for adults.

- Consider ways to target demographics who currently do not feel safe riding with classes or events that address their concerns.
- » Host a League Cycling Instructor (LCI) seminar to increase the number of local LCIs in your community, allowing you to expand cycling education for youth and adults, deliver Bicycle Friendly Driver education to motorists, and have more experts available to assist in encouragement programs. - » Adopt a comprehensive road safety plan or a Vision Zero policy to identify specific trategies to reduce traffic crashes and deaths for all road users, including bicyclists and pedestrians. Road diets, lane diets, and traffic calming treatments are important engineering components for addressing safety.
- » Adopt a target level of bicycle use (percent of trips) to be achieved within a specific timeframe, and ensure data collection necessary to monitor progress.
