<u>iSWM Subcommittee & Halff Associates</u> Scope of Services – Task Order 2

- 1. Project Management and Meeting Attendance
- 2. Additional specifications and details for site development controls There is hesitation that developers and contractors in the region will not know how to install the site development controls. The schematics in the manual are a good start but many want the specifications and details to the level of the NCTCOG Construction Standard Details book.
- 3. **Provide additional detail and standards for proprietary devices** Provide information on the specifications that should be considered for approval of a proprietary device and acceptable minimums that they should achieve.
- 4. Add more detail on maintenance and inspection Still a need in the region for more information on maintenance costs and variability. Could research long standing applications and gather maintenance data/records/costs/methods. We could include some best practices in developing and tracking a cities maintenance and inspection program. Could also look outside of Texas for more long standing applications.
- 5. Miscellaneous Technical Assistance:
 - Assistance preparing educational materials including but not limited to: Pollution Prevention During Construction Class.
 - Coordinate with companion efforts when and if possible to help with efforts such as design parameters, as well as gather data on methods to set up a public/private partnership and other means for regional detention.
 - Assist NCTCOG staff in creating survey to learn about current activities and standards that are being applied. Also, help in creating a watershed based inventory of iSWM principals being utilized by communities in the NCTCOG region.
 - Attend up 3 Outreach Meetings and 1 technical assistance meeting.




- Currently under contract. advertised RFQ, quals based selection, SWIFT funded. considered ESPC, determined that mechanism to be too costly

Are you currently using manual meters, advanced metering infrastructure (AMI), or automatic meter reading (AMR)?





If you are using manual meters, do your manual meters have AMR/AMI compatible registers?





Are you paying a contractor to read your manual meters, or do you use in-house meter readers?





Would you be interested in purchasing water system smart meters through a regional NCTCOG cooperative services procurement offering?





If you are interested, would you prefer the pricing for equipment only or pricing to include installation?





- Not sure how to answer many of these questions. Our AMI meter installations (contracted installers) will be done by the end of May. Our network including remediation will be done by June. Our Customer Portal will be launched in July.
- Biggest concerns relate to battery life and manufacturer warrantees, life expectancies and failure rate data.
- Purchase and install of retro fit registers only vs complete meters
- Nothing outside standard.
- I am concerned about the ability of our software to provide the billing capability so that customers are able to access the data on either an hourly basis or 15 minute increments.
- **Ability to order equipment with different meter reading resolutions** (different cities bill differently). integrations with billing will require some collaboration for meter swap fields
- FYI: JCSUD has gone through the procurement phase via soliciting proposals. We are negotiating contract with Ferguson (supplier) / Mueller (equip)




