## ALTERNATIVE APPROACHES FOR FY2020 COST SHARES

### Why does the PW cost share need to be revisited?

- Current Calculation is out of date
  - Current calculation can be traced back to 2005
  - Not all cities are included current calculation includes 113 entities (entity included if city's 2001 population was over 10,000 or if the city or county were expected to be designated as an MS4)
  - Dated budget share amounts
- Based on 2001 population estimate and 2025 projected population
  - 2045 estimated data is now available
  - Need to take growing population into account
- More active Council and Subcommittees = More COG time and effort
- Goal: Vote for final FY2020 Cost Share approach at February 2019 PWC meeting, to allow members enough time to integrate new cost share amounts into their budgets

Part 1: Equal Share (57% of Budget: \$326,937.75) (57% Budget Estimate / Number of Entities)


**Part 2: Population** (14% of Budget**: \$80,300.50**) (Jurisdication's 2001 Population / Total Population of Group) \* 14% Budget Estimate

**Part 3: Growth** (7% of Budget: **\$40,150.25**)
(Jurisdiction's Projected Population Increase / Total Projected Population Increase of Group) \* 7% Budget Estimate

Part 4: Land Area (21% of Budget: \$120,450.75) (Jurisdiction's Land Area (sq. mi.) / Total Land Area of Group) \* 21% Budget Estimate

## Alternative A Current Calculation with updated data

- Continue using the current calculation and weights, with updated budget of \$360,000 and 2018 population estimates
- Update to 2045 population projections from NCTCOG RIS for 12 counties and 2050 population projections from Texas Water Development Board for additional 4 counties


**Part 2: Population** (14% of Budget**: \$50,400**) (Jurisdication's 2018 Population / Total Population of Group) \* 14% Budget Estimate

**Part 3: Growth** (7% of Budget: **\$25,200**) (Jurisdiction's Projected Population Increase / Total Projected Population Increase of Group) \* 7% Budget Estimate

Part 4: Land Area (21% of Budget: \$75,600) (Jurisdiction's Land Area (sq. mi.) / Total Land Area of Group) \* 21% Budget Estimate

## Alternative B No Equal Share

- Continue using the current calculation with some alterations
  - Updated 2018 population estimates
  - Remove equal share amounts
  - Adjust weights to accommodate equal share removal



#### Alternative B has 3 scenarios (see handout) and a budget of \$360,000




**Part 2: Population** (33.3% of Budget**: \$119,880**) (Jurisdication's 2018 Population / Total Population of Group) \* 33.3% Budget Estimate

**Part 3: Growth** (16.7% of Budget: **\$60,120**) (Jurisdiction's Projected Population Increase of Group) \* 16.7% Budget Estimate

**Part 4: Land Area** (50% of Budget**: \$180,000**) (Jurisdiction's Land Area (sq. mi.) / Total Land Area of Group) \* 50% Budget Estimate

## Alternative C Population Tiered Rate

- Tiered rate is based on population solely. Population number would be updated to 2018 population data.
- Similar to NCTCOG's WATER group and Codes Committee



Part 2: Population (100% of Budget: \$360,000)

(Jurisdication's 2017 Population / Total Population of Group) \* 100% Budget Estimate


Instead of having cost shares based on population proportion, cost shares would be determined using a tiered rate.

## Alternative D Current Calculation with a 10% increase

- Continue using the current calculation, without any updates
- Increase all cost shares by 10%
- Increase from a \$330,000 budget to \$360,000 for FY2020
- Does not include all cities in region and maintains old data

**Part 2: Population** (14% of Budget**: \$81,192**) (Jurisdication's 2001 Population / Total Population of Group) \* 14% Budget Estimate

**Part 3: Growth** (7% of Budget: \$40,596) (Jurisdiction's Projected Population Increase / Total Projected Population Increase of Group) \* 7% Budget Estimate

Part 4: Land Area (21% of Budget: \$121,787) (Jurisdiction's Land Area (sq. mi.) / Total Land Area of Group) \* 21% Budget Estimate




