





Litter in the Gulf of Mexico

- Litter on the Texas coastline accumulates at a rate 10x higher than other Gulf of Mexico coastlines.*
- Microplastic concentrations in the Gulf of Mexico among the highest reported globally.**
- Why?
- 1. Surrounded by land
- 2. Currents
- 3. Litter inputs






Increase Adopt-A-Spot locations on the Trash Free Texas map and promote a statewide trash collection database 🖚 The Texas Litter Database



Support regional clean-up events through partnerships with local governments, recreational clubs, and Keep Texas Beautiful affiliates








Project Tasks and Outcomes So Far

 - Online site for entering, organizing, storing, and viewing all trash and marine debris data collected in Texas
 - Created by Keep Texas Beautiful, Houston Advanced Research Center, Black Cat GIS, and funded by the Garver Black Hilyard Family Foundation
 - Free and available to all
 - Linked on the Trash Free Texas map

- Provided input on draft toolkits for Trash Free Texas Restaurant Program


