1. **Welcome and Introductions**. The Public Works Council (PWC) Chair will welcome everyone to the meeting.

The Public Works Council Chair, Michael Owen, welcomed all the attendees to the meeting.

## **ACTION ITEMS**

2. **Meeting Summary**. NCTCOG staff is seeking approval of the November 18<sup>th</sup> meeting summary.

Jim Lockart motioned to approve the November 18<sup>th</sup> meeting summary; George Marshall seconded.

## DISCUSSION ITEM

 Pavement Analysis Contract Update. NCTCOG SHARE's Pavement Analysis contract expires Dec 31<sup>st</sup>. NCTCOG is seeking feedback on if the contract can be improved. (Craigan Johnson)

Craigan Johnson explained that NCTCOG will need to publish a Request for Proposal (RFP) for the SHARE Pavement Analysis Contract by August. He asked if the Council wanted to make any changes to the contract based on new technology, price changes, or how it's worked so far.

# 4. **Public Works Roundup.** NCTCOG staff will ask for feedback on the Public Works Roundup venue and date. (Olivia Kale)

Olivia Kale asked which date would work best for the Public Works Roundup at the Grapevine Convention Center in September. The venue is available September 7<sup>th</sup>, 13<sup>th</sup>, and 20<sup>th</sup>. The Council said Tuesdays-Thursdays often conflict with city council meetings. They told Olivia to pick whichever date works best for NCTCOG because there will always be conflicts with member governments.

# 5. **Winter Freeze.** The Council will have time to discuss the recent winter freeze. (Michael Owen)

Michael Owen opened the discussion on the recent winter event. He asked what problems communities faced and how they implemented lessons learned from last year's storm. Greg Ramey from Duncanville said their logistics team prepared by having food available for the crews and offering hotel rooms for those that lived further away. Shawn Poe with Richardson said they planned ahead with logistics and communicated early with facilities that had potential problems. Paul Sparkman from McKinney said they had a lack of fuel last year so they fueled up early this year.

#### **INFORMATION ITEMS**

6. **FY 2022 Public Works Work Program Update**. NCTCOG staff will update the Council on recent Public Works efforts and Subcommittee activities. (Olivia Kale)

There are 52 cost-sharing members of the Public Works Program for FY22 so far. This makes up 87% of the needed budget. Invoices for FY22 were mailed the first week of October. If a community has not received their invoice or has questions, please reach out to Olivia Kale.

 Standard Drawings Subcommittee. A Subcommittee representative will brief the Council on progress made towards updating the drawings in the Construction Standards Fifth Edition. (Chris Cha) Chris Cha explained that the subcommittee is finishing the final review of Division

2000, 4000, 5000, and 6000. These should be ready for the Council's approval at the May meeting. All divisions will be released as one amendment to the 5<sup>th</sup> Edition Public Works Construction Standards.

• Sustainable Public Rights of Way (SPROW) Subcommittee. The Subcommittee Chair will update the Council on the activities of the SPROW Subcommittee. (Robert Woodbury)

Robert Woodbury updated the Council on SPROW's efforts to create a utility coordination chapter for the BMP Guidebook. They are currently discussing shared duct banks. If anyone has any experience, their knowledge would be greatly appreciated at the next meeting.

• *integrated* Stormwater Management (iSWM) Activities. The Subcommittee Chair will present an update of iSWM program activities. (Ranjan Muttiah)

### North Central Texas Council of Governments

Halff Associates is working with the subcommittee to complete tasks. For Task 2 – Reorganize/Re-evaluate Site Development Controls, a draft of 5 BMP summary pages was provided for feedback at the January subcommittee meeting. For Task 3 – BMP Design and Maintenance Training, the virtual training on permeable pavement was held December 9<sup>th</sup>. For Task 4 – Technical Manual Updates, a draft of the updates was provided for the subcommittee to review in January. For Task 5 – Guidance on Forebay Design, the subcommittee provided feedback on 3 different options in the January meeting. For Task 6 – Hydrologic Mimicry Research, Halff is drafting memo with recommendations and goals. For Task 7 – Technical Assistance for Case Studies, Halff is identifying and evaluating potential case studies and reviewing language on Outcome 17. For Task 8 – Economic Benefits of iSWM, Halff developed educational document with commentary of participating communities for review in January.

#### 7. Other Program Activities.

 Cooperative Technical Partnership Program and the Community Rating System **Users Group.** NCTCOG staff will provide an update on FEMA's Cooperative Technical Partner (CTP) Program activities and the Floodplain Administrators/Community Rating System Users Group. (Olivia Kale) The FY19 flood risk project on Harriet Creek (Denton County, 7 miles) is 54% complete. The survey is complete, and hydrologic and hydraulic analysis are complete. The other FY19 flood risk project on Waxahachie Creek (Ellis County, Midlothian, Waxahachie; 19 miles) is 67% complete. The survey is complete. and hydrologic and hydraulic analyses are complete. The FY20 flood risk and outreach project on Catherine Branch (Denton County) is 40% complete. The survey is complete and hydrologic and hydraulic analyses is underway. The FY20 Transportation and Stormwater Integrated Project Engagement is in progress. The community survey is complete, stakeholder list developed, and the initial community meetings will be held in early 2022. NCTCOG was awarded FY21 CTP grants for five projects including: Program Management; Hog Branch (Denton County); East Fork (Lowery Crossing and McKinney); Upper West Fork Discovery; COMS Project (CHARM Outreach Workshops).

- Public Works Emergency Response Team (PWERT). A PWERT representative will give an update on recent PWERT activities. (Manny Palacios) Manny Palacios told the Council that PWERT has grown to 72 member jurisdictions. They are working to create similar groups in Houston and San Antonio area.
- Texas Chapter of American Public Works Association (TX-APWA). The Council will be updated on upcoming local events and meetings. (Shawn Poe) The Texas Chapter of American Public Works Association held a successful Public Workshop in College Station February 7-9. They're planning the 2022 Annual
