



#### PROJECT OVERVIEW


- RTC approved funding in 2018 to develop a comprehensive approach in planning and implementing transit services in Collin, Southern Dallas, and Tarrant Counties





#### 2018 Levels of Congestion/Delay





#### 2045 No-Build Levels of Congestion/Delay






