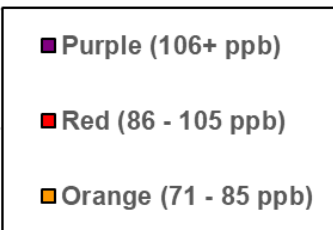


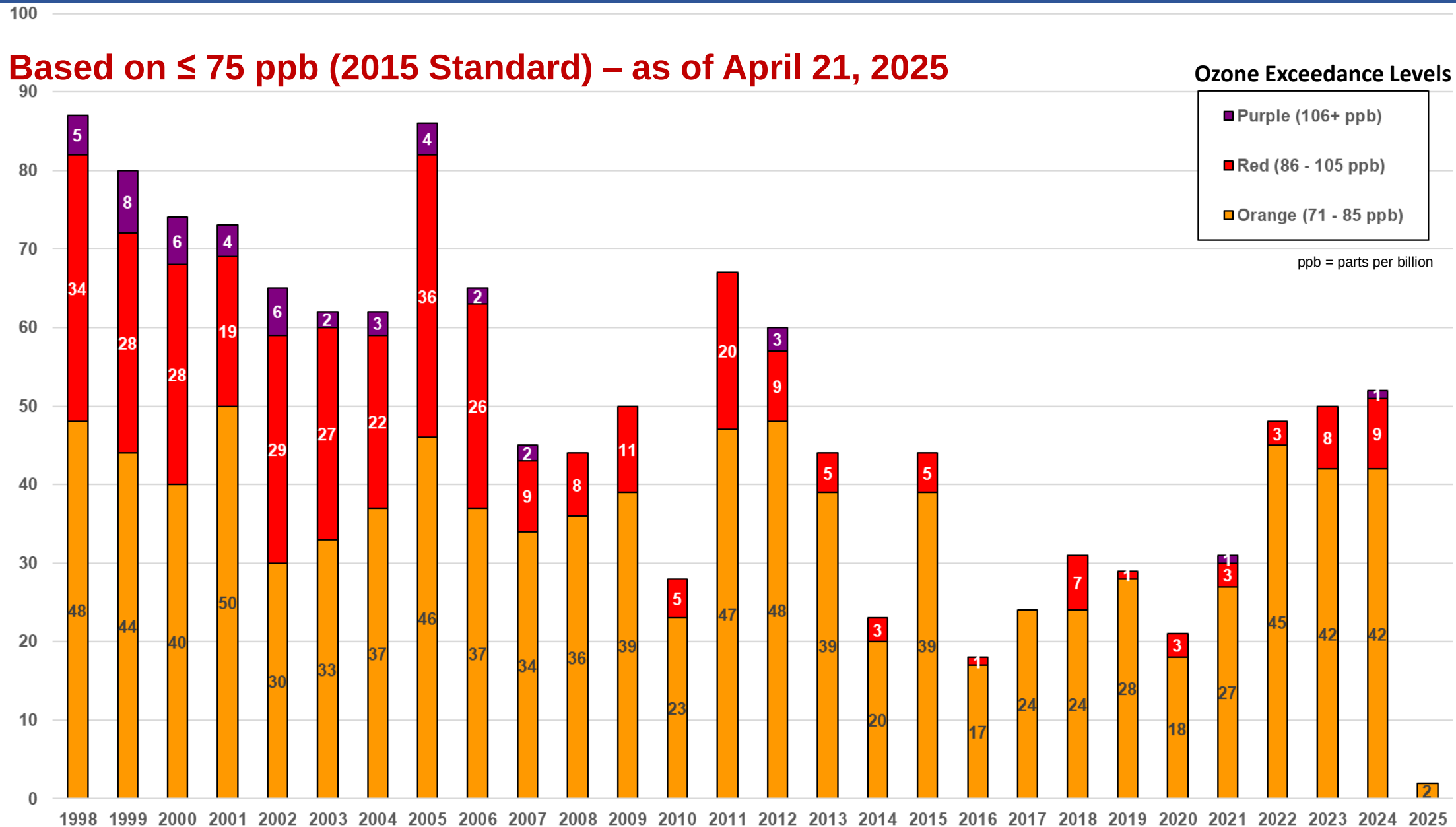
8-HOUR OZONE NAAQS HISTORICAL TRENDS

ppb = parts per billion

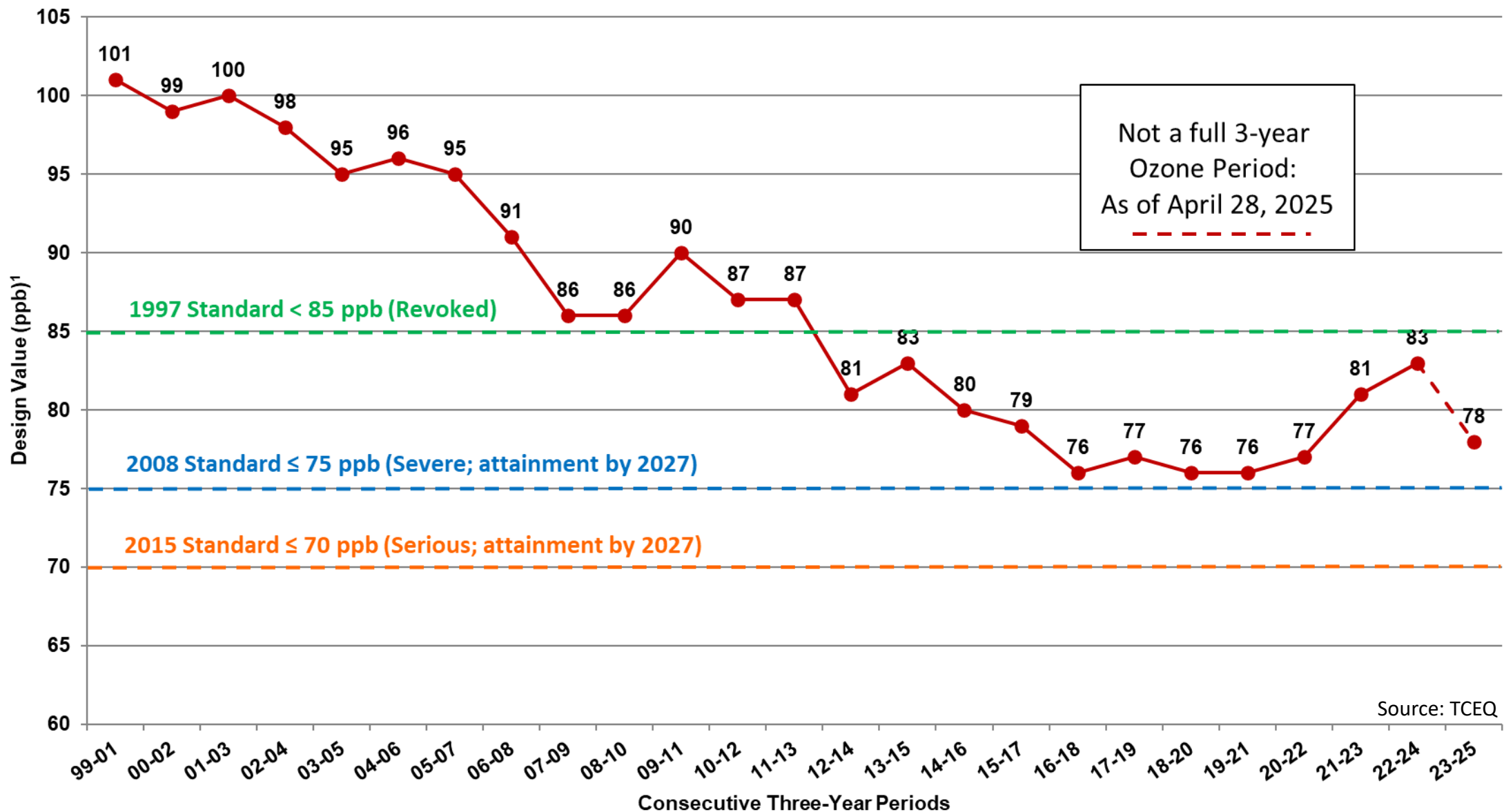


Exceedance Level indicates daily maximum eight-hour average ozone concentration.

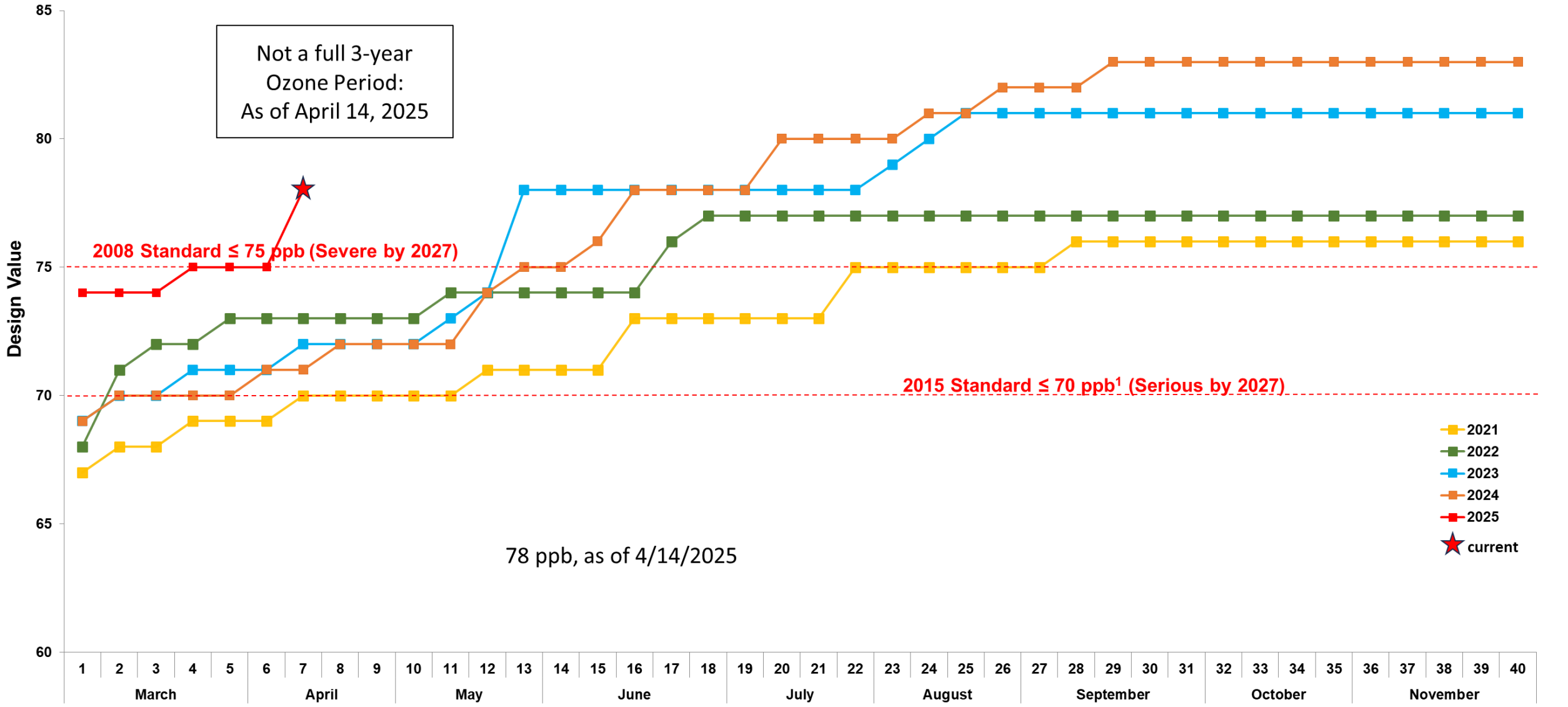

Historical Ozone Season Weekly Design Values: 2021-2025

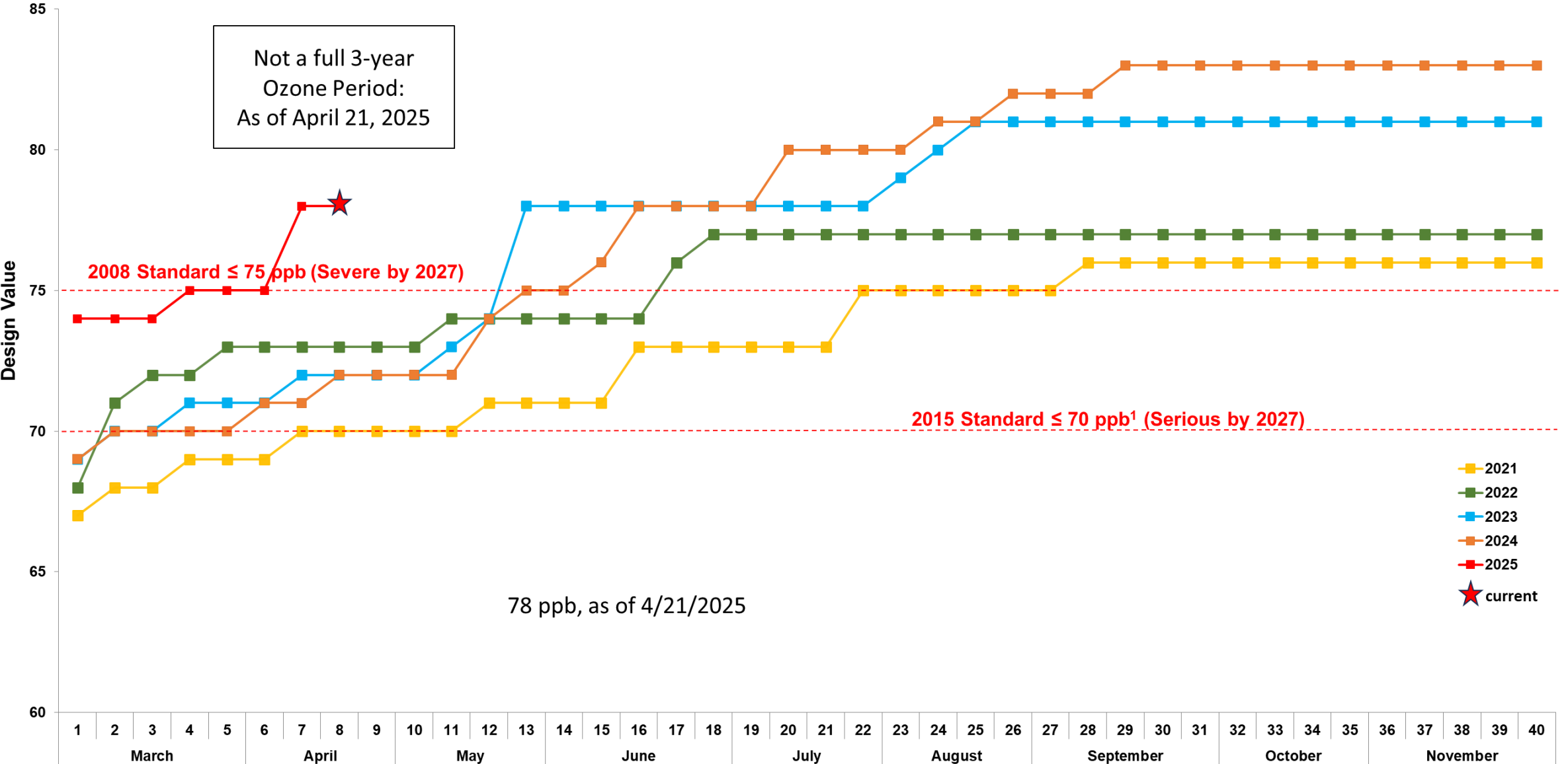

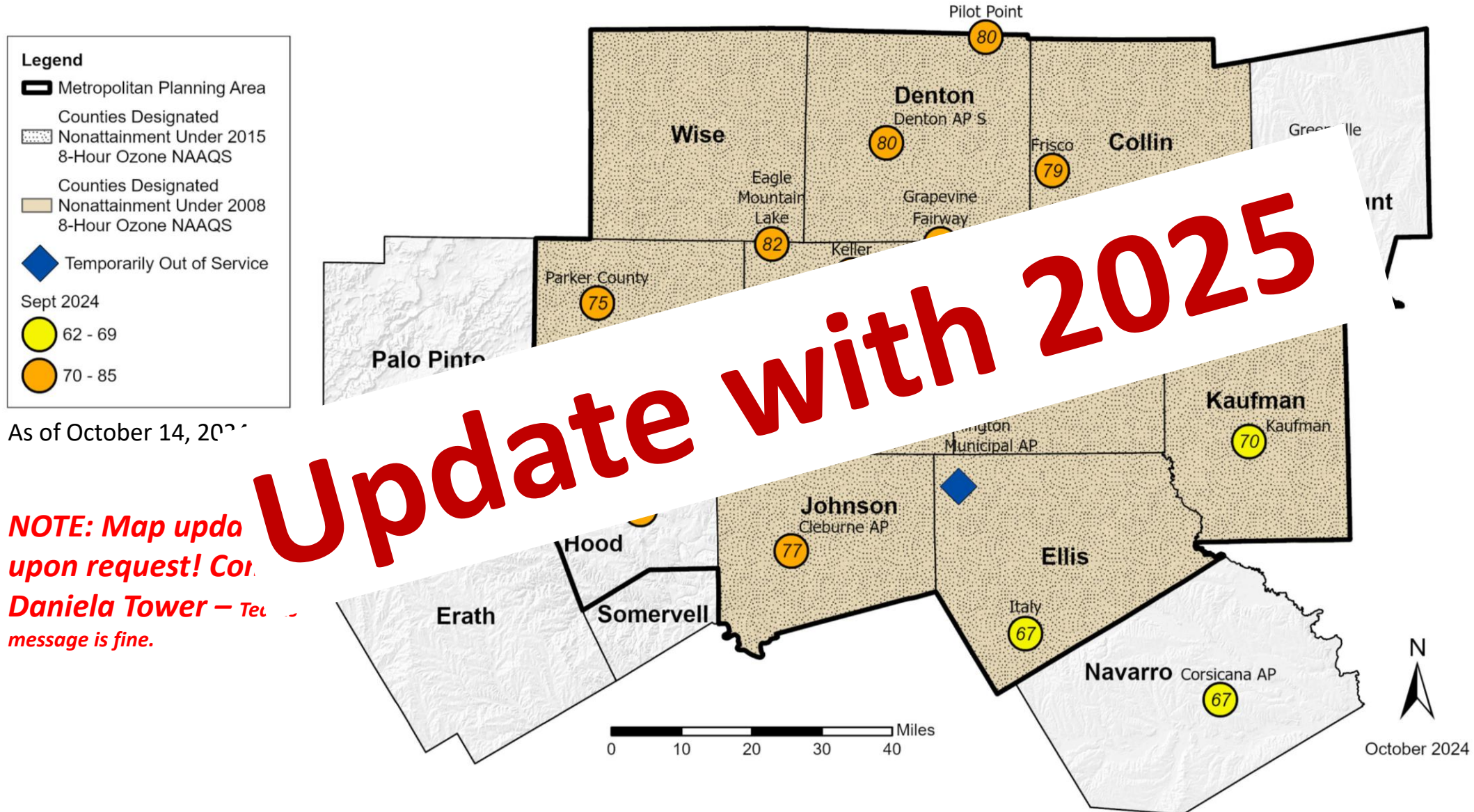

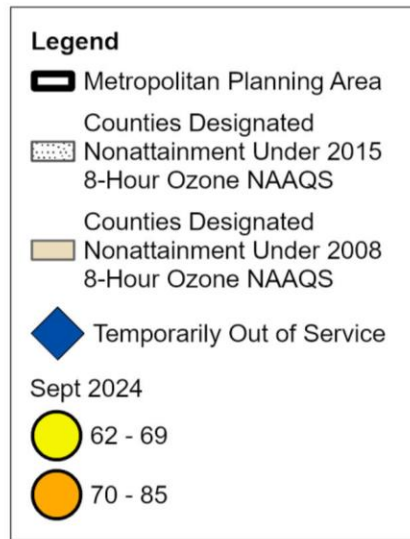

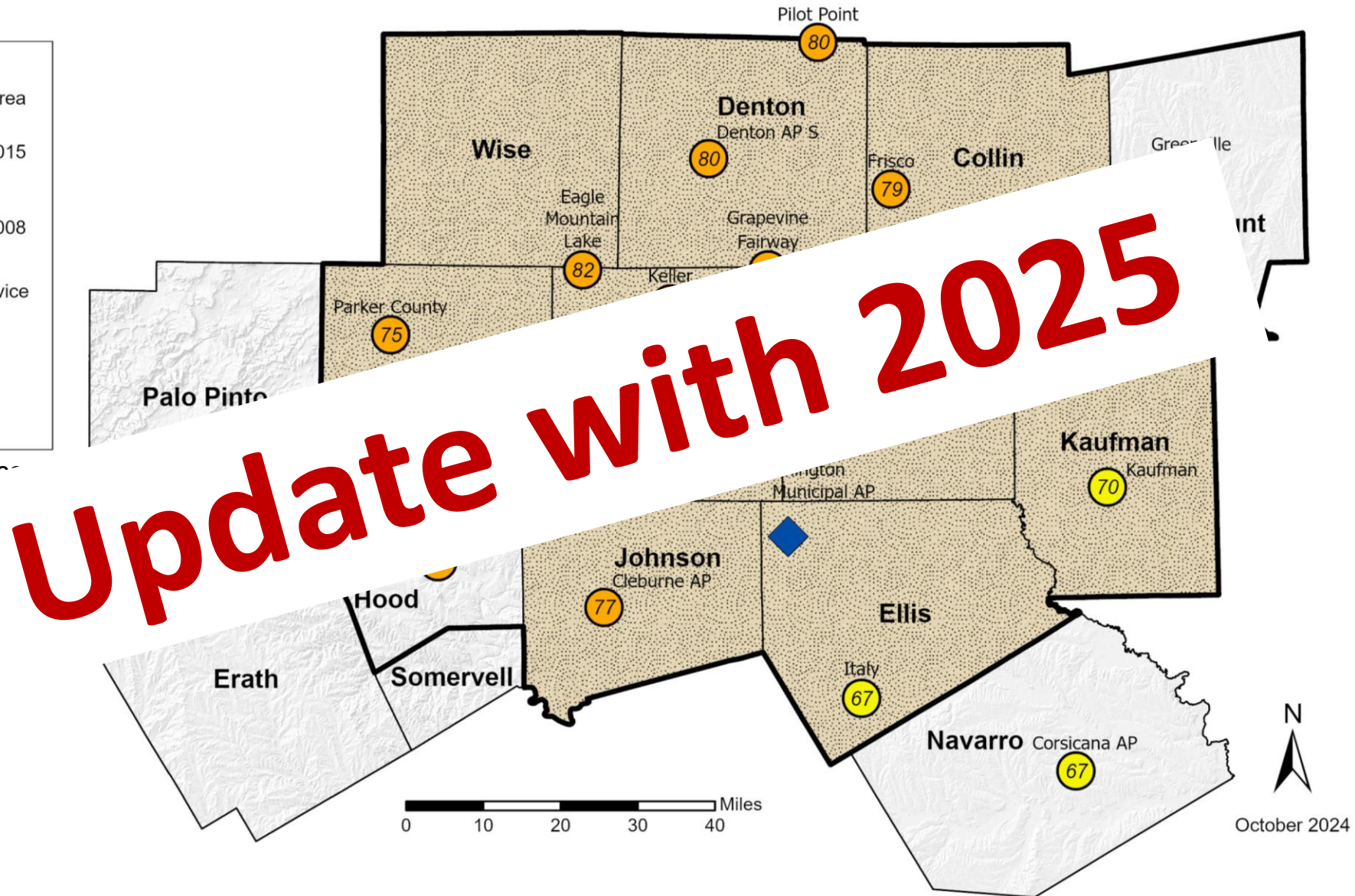

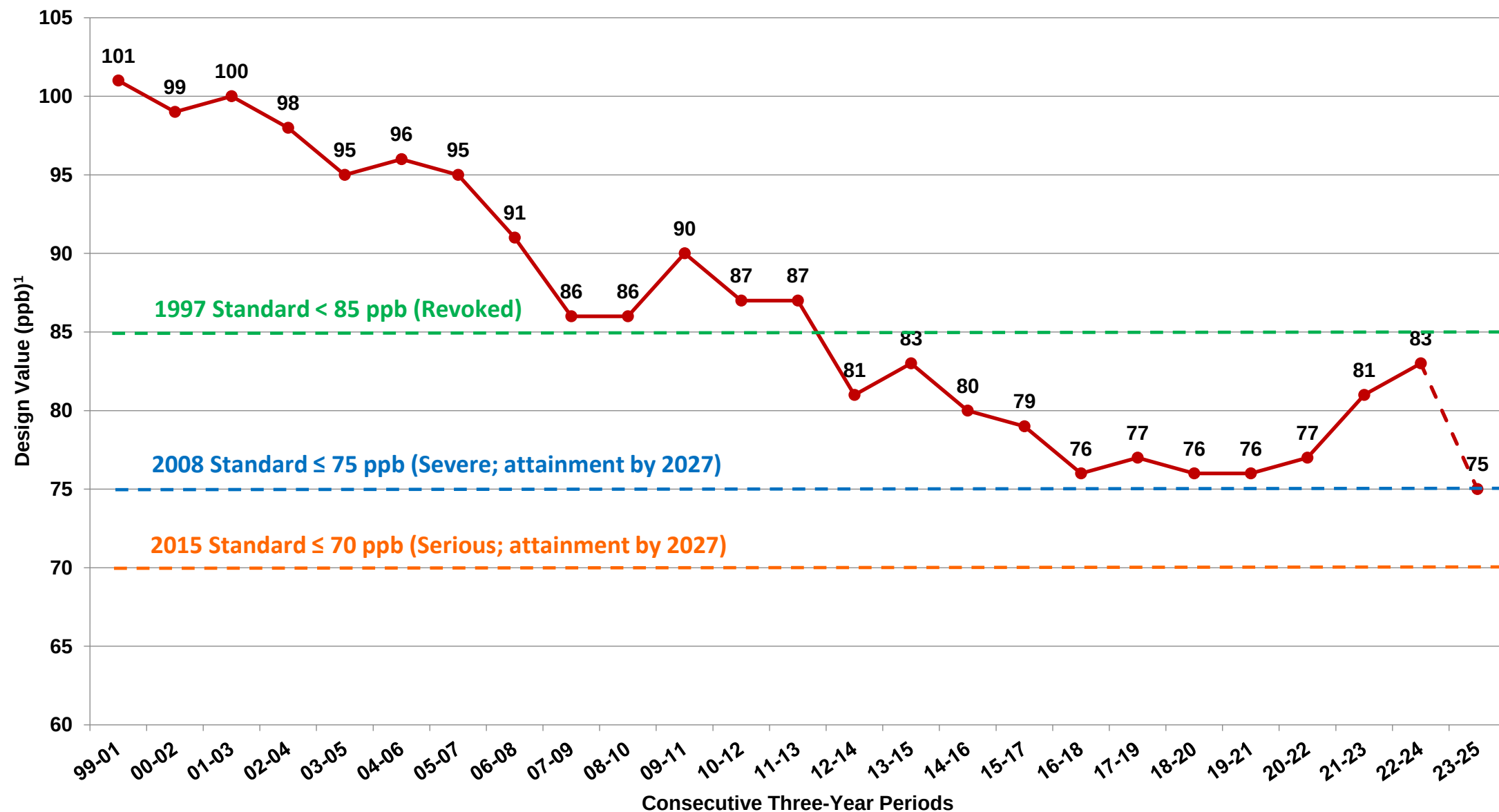
