COMPREHENSIVE RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING FISCAL YEARS 2026-2027 FUNDING INITIATIVES SUPPORTING SUSTAINABLE ENVIRONMENTAL EXCELLENCE

WHEREAS, the North Central Texas Council of Governments (NCTCOG) is a Texas political subdivision and non-profit corporation organized and operating under Texas Local Government Code Chapter 391 as the regional planning commission for the 16-county North Central Texas region; and,

WHEREAS, NCTCOG is a voluntary association of, by and for local governments established to assist in planning for common needs, cooperating for mutual benefit, and coordinating for sound regional development; and,

WHEREAS, NCTCOG's 2021-2025 Strategic Plan establishes a vision of success for Sustainable Environmental Excellence; and,

WHEREAS, the vision reaches across a broad range of specialties to aid the region in sustainable development and redevelopment efforts; and,

WHEREAS, the Strategic Plan provides the framework which presents the vision of success through preferred outcomes, an overview of high-level opportunities and goals, and strategic priorities established for delivery of services to achieve the outcomes; and,

WHEREAS, NCTCOG is working with local governments, federal/state agencies, and other partners to implement the adopted vision and strategic plan through numerous grants, fee-for-service programs, and the pursuit of other opportunities for the continuation of programmatic initiatives.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED THAT:

- Section 1. NCTCOG is authorized to execute necessary agreements with the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) for funding in an amount of approximately \$290,000 in federal/state funds per annum through FY2027 to allow NCTCOG to carry out its responsibilities as the designated area-wide water quality management planning agency, consistent with the work program initiatives endorsed by NCTCOG's Water Resources Council and approved by the TCEQ.
- Section 2. NCTCOG is authorized to execute necessary agreements with TCEQ and associated program recipients for Watershed Nonpoint Source Pollutant funding in an amount of approximately \$150,000 in federal/state funds per annum through FY2027 to allow NCTCOG to conduct a nonpoint source management initiative in water quality impaired watersheds in the Greater Trinity River basin.
- Section 3. NCTCOG is authorized to seek and accept fee-for-service funding from local governments and regional agencies in an amount of approximately \$800,000 per annum through FY2027 for stormwater management initiatives and monitoring contract services consistent with the work programs endorsed by NCTCOG's Regional Stormwater Management Coordinating Council.
- Section 4. NCTCOG is authorized to seek and accept fee-for-service funding from cities and counties, and also funding from state or federal agencies for flood risk reduction efforts along the Trinity River corridor in an amount of approximately \$300,000 per annum through FY2027 for the Trinity River COMMON VISION program, consistent with the work program initiatives endorsed by the Trinity River COMMON VISION Steering Committee.
- Section 5. NCTCOG is authorized to seek and accept fee-for-service funding from local governments and regional agencies in an amount of approximately \$600,000 per annum through FY2027 for public works initiatives consistent with the work programs endorsed by NCTCOG's Public Works Council.

- Section 6. NCTCOG is authorized to seek and accept fee-for-service funding from local governments and regional agencies in an amount of approximately \$150,000 per annum through FY2027 for wastewater and treatment initiatives consistent with the work programs endorsed by NCTCOG's Wastewater and Treatment Education Roundtable.
- Section 7.
 NCTCOG is authorized to execute necessary agreements with the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) and/or the Texas Water Development Board for funding in an amount of approximately \$100,000 per annum through FY2027 to build on the Cooperating Technical Partners for flood risk reduction, consistent with the work program initiatives endorsed by NCTCOG's Public Works Council.
- Section 8. NCTCOG is authorized to execute necessary agreements with the Texas Department of Agriculture to support the Texas Community Development Block Grant program in an amount of approximately \$25,000 in federal/state funds per annum through FY2026 for providing administrative services and technical assistance through Community and Economic Development Assistance funding.
- Section 9. NCTCOG is authorized to seek and accept fee-for-service funding from local governments and regional agencies in an amount of approximately \$100,000 per annum through FY2027 for building codes coordination initiatives consistent with the work programs endorsed by NCTCOG's Regional Codes Coordinating Committee.
- Section 10. NCTCOG is authorized to execute necessary agreements with the State Energy Conservation Office (SECO) for funding in an amount of approximately \$650,000 in federal/state funds through FY2027 to build upon efforts towards reductions in energy consumption and resulting improvements to air quality, consistent with the Principles of Development Excellence and recommendations within Vision North Texas.
- Section 11. NCTCOG is authorized to seek and accept fee-for-service funding from local governments and regional agencies in an amount of approximately \$100,000 per annum through FY2027 for engaging interested local governments in peer-exchange opportunities to support sustainability and environmental initiatives consistent with the work program requested by NCTCOG's Regional Integration of Sustainability Efforts (RISE) Coalition.
- Section 12. NCTCOG is authorized to continue to conduct Center of Development Excellence and Vision North Texas outreach to member local governments, the development community, and other interested parties.
- Section 13. NCTCOG is authorized to pursue other opportunities for cooperation or funding to implement the Sustainable Environmental Excellence visions, strategic plan, and objectives through FY2027, including but not limited to, cooperative activities and drafting of memoranda of agreements with state and federal partners, extension of interagency agreements to other local governments, identification of additional funding sources, and participation in and support of initiatives by other agencies.

Section 14. NCTCOG is authorized to receive the funding amounts identified in the proceeding Sections and such funds shall be incorporated into the appropriate fiscal year budget.

Section 15. The Executive Director or his designee is authorized to execute necessary agreements to carry out the programs and activities described in the proceeding Sections.

Section 16. This resolution shall be in effect immediately upon its adoption.

WHEREAS, the North Central Texas Council of Governments (NCTCOG) is a Texas political subdivision and non-profit corporation organized and operating under Texas Local Government Code Chapter 391 as the regional planning commission for the 16-county North Central Texas region; and,

WHEREAS, NCTCOG is a voluntary association of, by and for local governments established to assist in planning for common needs, cooperating for mutual benefit, and coordinating for sound regional development; and,

WHEREAS, NCTCOG has been designated as the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) for the Dallas-Fort Worth Metropolitan Area by the Governor of the State of Texas in accordance with federal law; and,

WHEREAS, the Regional Transportation Council (RTC) serves as the MPO Policy committee, comprised primarily of local elected officials, and is the regional transportation policy body associated with NCTCOG, and has been and continues to be a forum for cooperative decisions on transportation; and,

WHEREAS, the Dallas-Fort Worth region is in nonattainment of the federal air quality standard for ozone and may soon enter into nonattainment for fine particulate matter ($PM_{2.5}$) and NCTCOG is actively involved in the development and implementation of the State Implementation Plan for air quality; and,

WHEREAS, the RTC is committed to the development and implementation of policies, projects, and programs to improve air quality and reduce emissions that create ozone, including electrification of the transportation system; and,

WHEREAS, Subtask 3.03 of the Fiscal Year (FY) 2024 and FY2025 Unified Planning Work Program for Regional Transportation Planning includes implementation of air quality initiatives; and,

WHEREAS, on May 25, 2023, the Executive Board approved submittal of a grant application by NCTCOG on behalf of the region under the FY 2022 and 2023 Charging and Fueling Infrastructure (CFI) Community Program to implement a project that would deploy publicly accessible charging infrastructure throughout the NCTCOG region and hire a consultant to expedite project implementation, and,

WHEREAS, the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) has awarded \$15 million in federal funding to NCTCOG under the CFI Community Program; and,

WHEREAS, on October 24, 2024, the Executive Board authorized NCTCOG to enter into an agreement with the FHWA for an amount of approximately \$15 million in federal funds, with up to 607,577 regional Transportation Development Credits as funding match for development costs, and \$2,990,529 local match for the implementation of the CFI Community Program project; and,

WHEREAS, on July 10, 2025, RTC approved the Call for Projects, including eligibility, screening and scoring criteria, and the schedule; and,

WHEREAS, NCTCOG will initiate a Call for Projects to select public sector EV charging station locations; and,

WHEREAS, NCTCOG will comply with all Federal and State regulations regarding contract and procurement proceedings.
