


8-HOUR OZONE NAAQS HISTORICAL TRENDS

Based on ≤ 70 ppb (As of July 16, 2020)



¹Attainment Goal - According to the US EPA National Ambient Air Quality Standards, attainment is reached when, at each monitor, the *Design Value* (three-year average of the annual fourth-highest daily maximum eight-hour average ozone concentration) is equal to or less than 70 parts per billion (ppb).







Freeway Volumes During COVID-19


Decrease in Weekday Traffic with Respect to March 1, 2020





Cumulative Ozone Exceedances, 2016-2020




Regional Monitor Data: Percent Change 2019 vs 2020

Regional Monitor Data: Daily Average Emission Concentrations



Average Daily Concentrations in 2020: As of 7/1/2020



Regional Nitrogen Dioxide (NO₂) Tracking






