Approve Summary from March 30, 2021 Meeting

- NCTCOG staff will send a survey (matrix) for utility representatives to submit information on how they prefer to conduct projects and specific regulations they have.
- The Subcommittee asked for presentations from utility representatives on their overall business model and long-term goals in the NCT region.
- The group discussed communication problems with staff turnover at different agencies and how monthly/quarterly meetings have helped keep all parties informed of progress.



Utility Coordination

- The next chapter of the BMP Guidebook is Utility Coordiantion (Coexisting Types, Franchises, Documentation, Coordinated Needs, etc.)
 - Each franchise has a different process and set of BMPs. As we develop BMPs the group should think about how to break down the chapter into different sections.
 - The BMP Guidebook should be beneficial and communicate the right information without getting too detailed.
 - The Guidebook needs to provide guidance that pertains to every jurisdiction in the NCT Region.
 - The Guidebook should consider sustainable practices for utility projects.

- · Files of city facilities shared with utility partners.

Quarterly Meetings

- City provides updates on status of projects.
- · Utilities provide updates on any relocations.

Monthly Meetings

Format is similar to quarterly meetings. Valued on larger projects or as project nears completion.

 Arlington, Denton, Flower Mound (pre covid), Frisco, and Plano


Early coordination meetings contribute to the success of the project whether it be a municipal or Atmos Energy project.
