Fats, Oils, and Grease

- When not disposed of properly, FOG builds up in the sewer system and constricts the flow of water, which can cause sewer back-ups into homes and overflow discharges onto streets. #DefendYourDrains throughout the holidays at DefendYourDrainsNorthTexas.com
- #DefendYourDrains! Pouring cooking oil, poultry fat, or grease into the kitchen sink or toilet can cause sewer backups. DefendYourDrainsNorthTexas.com has instructions for proper fat, oil, and grease disposal.

General Stormwater/Yard Waste/Landscape BMPs/Litter-free waterways

- Yard waste makes up about 18% of America's trash. Reuse yard waste as mulch or compost and #YardSmart
- Reuse yard waste whenever possible. Grass clippings and leaves can be collected and used as mulch to protect garden and landscape plants during the cold months to come. #YardSmart and #RethinkWaste at TXSmartScape.com
- Run-off from your sprinkler, watering hose, or from the rain can carry yard waste and fertilizer into storm sewers. #YardSmart and water efficiently to protect our community's health and save money.
