Texas SmartScape

- Save water on these hot days. Deep, infrequent watering creates deep roots, which helps plant to absorb water from the deeper soil over a longer period of time. This also reduces disease, helps air movement in the soil, and conserves water-#SmartScape it at TXSmartScape.com
- Almost 95% of drip irrigation water can reach a plant, while traditional automatic sprinklers are much less efficient. Easy to install and maintain, drip irrigation systems are a lot like #SmartScape plants. Start saving now and find out more at TXSmartScape.com

- Pet waste left anywhere is a potential public health risk. Pet waste on playing fields, sidewalks, or parks can be unhealthy and messy. Even at home, responsible pet owners should #DooTheRightThing and throw pet waste in the trash or flush it down the toilet – DFWStormWater.com/PetWaste
- Dog waste is more than a nightmare for our shoes. Just like human sewage, untreated pet fecal matter is harmful to waterways. #DooTheRightThing and pick up after pets DFWStormWater.com/PetWaste

- Large amounts of household chemicals should not be disposed by way of your household plumbing. Bleach, disinfectants, and other household cleaners are difficult to extract from water, and chemicals can be harmful to workers and the environment DefendYourDrainsNorthTexas.com
- Leftover paint, insecticides, herbicides, fertilizer, and paint remover are hazardous, and should NOT be poured down drains. These chemicals are difficult to remove from the water and could damage your home.
