

DISCUSSION ON OUTCOME 17

 Background: In 2014, the iSWM contractor was tasked with meeting with community members. NCTCOG learned that communities did not like the point system, and that the pass/fail grade was perceived as a barrier to communities becoming certified. The subcommittee determined that the point system would not be used moving forward. It was recommended that the water quality option 1 be revised or replaced.

DISCUSSION ON OUTCOME 17

STATUS OF REVIEW

- NCTCOG staff and Halff Associates collaborated to develop initial recommended updates
- Volunteer members recommended putting a greater emphasis on treatment of the water quality volume than on the *integrated* site design practices
- Volunteer group will provide written comments on the changes, which will be taken into consideration by Staff and Halff Associates


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
