

Instead of having cost shares based on population proportion, cost shares would be determined using a tiered rate.






<u>Alternative D</u> Current Calculation with a 10% increase








Section 3: Terms of Office, B. Vacancy

In the event of a Council member vacancy, the **replacement may** be appointed from within the said vacated representative's member organization (within a three-month time period) and shall serve for the remainder of the vacated representative's **unexpired term.** Otherwise, the PWC and/or NCTCOG staff shall *request a nomination* from the primary member who previously recommended the prior incumbent member.

Section 4: Attendance

Members may send designated alternates when necessary to avoid an absence being counted. Designated alternates are individuals identified and appointed by the member organization to represent them. The designee will have the same voting rights as the *member.* It's the member's responsibility to sufficiently brief the designated alternate on the PWC meeting agenda items. A representative's attendance and participation in meetings, subcommittees, and related activities will be evaluated during the

PWC member re-appointment process.

Section 4: Attendance

If an agency representative <u>accrues two (2) absences</u> at regularly scheduled or other meetings of the full Public Works Council <u>in a twelve (12) month calendar period</u>, a phone call will be made to the primary seat of that agency <u>requesting an active</u> <u>replacement</u> and/or the naming of a new alternate seat. If this phone call does not result in an active replacement and/or the naming of a new alternate seat, a <u>Notice of</u> <u>Inactivity will be sent</u> to the participating agency requesting an active replacement and/or the naming of a new alternate seat.

If no response is received from the member jurisdiction in response to the sent Notice of Inactivity, an <u>additional Notice of Inactivity will be sent to leadership officials</u> of that participating agency, including but not limited to, the political leader of agency.

Section 6: Voting

The presence of any combination of *fifteen (15) or more* **Council members constitutes a quorum** for conducting PWC business. A simple majority vote of the representatives present at a meeting at which a quorum is achieved is necessary to approve a motion by the PWC. Alternatively, electronic communication will be assumed to reach all members, and therefore achieves a quorum for the purpose of electronic business and action.



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Public Works Cost Share Program: Barriers to Participation Survey Results


Are you aware of NCTCOG's Regional Public Works Cost Share Program?




Does your entity currently participate in NCTCOG's Public Works Cost Share initiative?




Why does your entity choose to participate in NCTCOG's Public Works Cost Share Program? Select all that apply.




Standard Drawings Subcommittee

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

 - FY18 Flood Risk ID Project on Marys Creek in Parker County has been awarded. Task Order with Halff currently being executed. Project kick-off in April.


