2. Meeting Summary. The October 11, 2023 meeting summary will be presented for approval.

Billy George, North Texas Municipal Water District, made a motion to approve the minutes. Glenn Clingenpeel, Trinity River Authority, seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

PRESENTATIONS

3. Best Practices in Water Conservation. Jason Pierce, Manager of Governmental Affairs and Communications, Upper Trinity Regional Water District (UTRWD), will share on water conservation through the district's irrigation system checkup program.

Jason Pierce, Upper Trinity Regional Water District (UTRWD), presented on using the irrigation check system as a means of water conservation. 4. Tarrant Regional Water District's Recognized Water Conservation Program Efforts. Dustan Compton, Conservation Manager, Tarrant Regional Water District (TRWD), will share how his organization won the 2023 EPA WaterSense Award.

Dustan Compton, Tarrant Regional Water District (TRWD), presented on the TRWD's award-winning practices for promoting water conservation. Cynthia Baughman, City of Garland, shared about the wastewater treatment plant converting to UV disinfection, the development of a new water utilities building for staff, and a garden to demonstrate smart scaping.

Bill Gase, City of Arlington Water Utilities, states the city is looking for a new Director of Water Utilities due to the current one retiring.

Haley Salazar, alternate for Stephen Gay, City of Denton, shared about work being done to update the drought contingency plan.

Billy George, North Texas Municipal Water District, discussed eagerly awaiting EPA's release of water regulations regarding PFOA and PFOS.

Michael Nieswiadomy, University of North Texas, encouraged council members to consider at-home monitoring equipment to reduce water use.

Sally Wright, City of Dallas, discussed winter weather preparations, the EPA regulations regarding PFOS and PFOA, and the finished master plan for a water treatment program.
