In the event funding is not available, NCTCOG has no obligation to provide funding to any projects that may be selected in association with this call for projects.



Funding & Eligibility

- **Estimated** Funding Available: \$1.1 to 1.3 Million
- Eligible Applicants:
 - Cities
 - Counties
 - Public and Independent School Districts (excludes Universities and other postsecondary educational institutions)
 - General and special law districts created in accordance with state law and having the authority and responsibility for water quality protection or MSW management, to include river authorities
 - Councils of Governments



Project Categories

- The following project categories are eligible for grant funding:
 - Local Enforcement
 - Source Reduction and Recycling
 - Household Hazardous Waste
 - Litter and Illegal Dumping Programs
 - Citizens' Collection Stations and "Small" Transfer Stations

 - Technical Studies with a Regional Scope/Impact
 - Educational and Training Projects


