1. Welcome and Introductions.

The Chair, Echo Rexroad, welcomed everyone to the Regional Stormwater Management Coordinating Council (RSWMCC) meeting.

ACTION ITEMS

2. Regional Stormwater Management Coordinating Council (RSWMCC) Meeting Summary. The May 18, 2022 meeting <u>summary</u> is available on the website for viewing and will be presented for approval.

3. FY2023 Work Program. NCTCOG staff will initiate a discussion and vote on the final draft of the FY2023 RSWMCC Work Program.

The draft Work Program for FY23 was approved through a unanimous vote, as submitted with no changes.

INFORMATION ITEMS

- 6. FY2022 Work Program. The NCTCOG staff will discuss on-going and planned task force activities and other components of the regional stormwater management program. Topics include:
 - General program activities
 - The Committee Chair, Echo Rexroad, presented to the committee a request to form an ad hoc committee to shore up language in the committee procedures related to Watershed Representatives and Council Membership. Echo will lead the ad hoc committee and be joined by volunteers Krista Pender of Carrollton, Brigette Gibson of Arlington, and Perry Harts of Frisco.
 - The proposed recommendations will be brought back before the committee members at a future meeting for a vote and acceptance.
 - FY2022 Cost Share participation
 - We are currently at 92.5% committed for FY2022 as of August 10, 2022.
 - FY2023 Cost Share Information
 - Fiscal Year 2023 cost shares amounts will remain the same as FY22. Program participants may request an invoice through the cost share webpage, or by asking staff to mail an invoice. The cost share webpage, listed below, will be updated at the end of the fiscal year.

- For the Stormwater Monitoring Program, there will be no LOAs for payment in FY2023 as the program is at the end of its term. NCTCOG staff are in discussion with TCEQ and working on an RFQ for a new term.
- For the FY23 Regional Urban Stormwater Program, entities who participate in the program through an ILA and LOA, please contact staff to request an amendment to the current ILA term set to expire on August 31, 2022.
- Public Education Task Force (PETF)
 - The Doo the Right Thing summer contest and campaign has experienced great engagement this summer with over 200 contest entries. The contest voting period closes on August 19th. To help with campaign and contest promotion, please share the <u>contest voting link</u> widely.
 - The 2022 North Texas Community Cleanup Challenge (NTCCC) results have been tallied and, after addressing a participant concern over missing event data, the results were updated after the July 20th PETF meeting. The City of Grand Prairie is the 2022 winner after those adjustments were made. Please save the



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date of March 1st – May 31st, 2023, for the next NTCCC. A post-event survey will be sent to participants of the 2021 and the 2022 NTCCC in the coming months to collect feedback.

- The FY22 Special Project is making progress towards a storyboard for the videos and have identified and drafted teacher resources.
- PETF Activity Reports are forthcoming for all reporting periods over the coming months. Please contact Crysta Guzman, <u>cguzman@nctcog.org</u>, if there has been a change in contact at your entity for receiving the reports.
- Pollution Prevention (P2) Roundtable
 - NCTCOG staff sought 2-3 volunteers for the "What Would Your Entity Do?" constructed case study. Kevin Hurley, City of Dallas, volunteered to be a panelist. If interested, please contact Crysta Guzman, <u>cguzman@nctcog.org</u>, for more information. A date for the training will be set shortly.
 - The next P2 meeting will be on December 7, 2022. Staff are seeking a member presentation for the upcoming meeting. Please contact Crysta Guzman for more information if your entity is interested.
- Illicit Discharge Detection & Elimination Roundtable
 - The IDDE Roundtable is scheduled to meet next on December 8, 2022, at 9:30 am via Microsoft Teams.
 - There is an Industrial Inspectors Workshop scheduled for September 20, 2022, at the City of Mansfield. Registration is available <u>online</u>.
- <u>Stormwater Monitoring Program</u>
 - The Stormwater Monitoring Program is in the fifth and final year of the permit term. NCTCOG is working with our consultant, Atkins, on finishing and finalizing the Best Management Practices Analysis and Evaluation Plan (BANEP) and final summary report.
 - NCTCOG staff is working with TCEQ and monitoring participants to develop a proposal to continue the program in a new permit term. Our current plan is to develop the proposal and select a consultant in 2023 and continue monitoring in 2024.

7. Other NCTCOG Program activities:

- Integrated Stormwater Management (iSWM) Program Activities Casey Cannon, who is the iSWM program point of contact gave an update on the program.
 - The iSWM Contract that we had been working under expired this year. Task Deliverables from final Task Order 6 have been completed and are available online.
 - Request for Statement of Qualifications (RFSQ) for the new iSWM contract is being finalized and will be posted for public bid soon.
 - o The next iSWM Subcommittee Meeting is scheduled for October 5, 2022.
- <u>Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL) Program Activities</u> Hannah Allen, who is the TMDL Program point of contact for NCTCOG, gave an update on the program.

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- The group has under development a draft video and script for several educational videos.
- TMDL Implementation Plan Updates:
 - The Dry Branch Creek TMDL Support Document is under development by the Texas Institute for Applied Environmental Research (TIAER). TIAER's presentation from the recent TMDL Coordination Committee meeting is <u>available online here</u>.
 - TCEQ's Public Comment Period for the North Fork Cottonwood Creek Addendum and State WQMP closed in early June. These documents are awaiting EPA's approval and then the NFCC Addendum will be incorporated into the North Central Texas Implementation Plan.
- The TMDL Monitoring Coordination Forum Technical Subcommittee is scheduled to meeting on September 29, 2022.

• EPA Trash Free Waters Grant

Elena Berg, who is one of the Trash Free Waters grant project leads, gave a status update on recently completed work.

- The toolkit for recreational litter cleanups, that combine activities such as paddling, running, or walking, with litter cleanup has recently been posted to the Trash Free Texas website and can be found <u>here</u>. Staff are seeking feedback on the toolkit from local governments and recreational groups before October 1st. Please contact Crysta Guzman, <u>cguzman@nctcog.org</u>, with interest or questions.
- Project staff are currently working on Task 4 Changing Business Practices. This work consists of crafting a community-run restaurant certification toolkit. The toolkit will be accompanied by single-use plastic reduction resources for restaurants. The project team expects to have drafts completed in early Fall and plan to conduct outreach to cities and restaurants to pilot test the materials and provide feedback. 10. Roundtable Discussion. Discussion of activities within individual jurisdictions as time allows.

Plano: Called TCEQ about status of their permit other than TCEQ's confirmation of receiving permit. Started Clean Rivers program with TRA yesterday. Submitting mosquitos for resistance testing; trying to determine if pesticides they are using are effective against them.

Carrollton: Still waiting on TCEQ to approve their permit.

Frisco: Have been focused on dry dust control. Received notice from TCEQ that the technical review has been completed. Next up is a public notice.

Lewisville: Posted a public notice which expired a few weeks ago. Have not heard back from TCEQ. Last step would be issuance of renewal notice.

Dallas County: Their SWMP has come through this year from TCEQ.

Dallas: Have been busy with public meetings related to budget, fiscal year, etc. Requesting that NCTCOG help facilitate a discussion with TCEQ staff regarding permits continually being late all throughout the process. If a discussion with them is not possible, perhaps submitting a request for a guidance document for MS4s that can help alleviate their stress, especially with turnover. All Phase II permits expire at the same time, so they

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are set up to be in a position where they can never get caught up. Would be nice to get something in writing from them, so folks know officially how to handle these situations.

Irving: Haven't heard back from TCEQ on the SWMP. Irving has an Innovation Grant Program every year; this year two stormwater personnel applied and won. Jayce Proctor was approved for funding for a large bioswale treatment train near City Hall. SWMP inspector Ehsan Shirani was approved for drone software for use in Stormwater Management/SWP3. Agrees with Dallas' comment on a need for TCEQ guidance.

Cleburne: TCEQ has MS4 and MSGP outreach meetings coming up. Would encourage people to attend those if they are available. They are public meetings in person, in Austin, or via online attendance. Encourage everyone to make comments/discussion to be put on record for the stakeholder process. Will share the latest Water Quality Advisory Work Group (WQAWG) Stakeholder Meeting with NCTCOG staff to distribute to group members. Leland Peffley introduced himself – he is the newest team member and is working at the water plant and in Environmental Services. He is getting familiar with all the programs.

Denton: Waiting on SWMP approval, have a Stormwater inspector posting. Stream clean event is coming up.

North Richland Hills: Holding a neighborhood cleanup October 15. At least 100 volunteers and city staff to clean up about 45 households.

11. Schedule for the Next Meeting. The next meeting date is scheduled for Wednesday, November 9, 2022. This meeting format is TBD.

NCTCOG staff requested feedback on whether the committee would like to hold the meeting in person or virtually. Of those who voted, 6 were in favor of virtual and 3 in favor of in person. Staff will decide on the format closer to the meeting date.
