

# SUMMARY

Regional Stormwater Management Coordinating Council Wednesday, May 18, 2022 Microsoft Teams

1. Welcome and Introductions.

Vice-Chair nominations, from Phase 1 communities, will be accepted after the Watershed Representatives have been confirmed. All voting will be held electronically.

NCTCOG staff presented the <u>Draft FY2023 RSWMCC Work Program</u> for input and discussion with RSWMCC members. Staff requested feedback from members and invited their questions. PETF have selected a continuation of the FY22 Special Project; P2 will confirm their FY23 Work Plan at their next meeting in June; IDDE Task Force will continue

## Public Education Task Force

- The Doo the Right Thing campaign and photo contest kicked off on May 1<sup>st</sup> and runs through June 30<sup>th</sup>. Members can access a promotional toolkit on the <u>PETF's</u> program page under the green Outreach Materials and Resources banner.
- The North Texas Community Cleanup Challenge has 10 participants this year. The challenge timeframe ends on May 31<sup>st</sup> with participants having until June 30<sup>th</sup> to submit all their data. All data should be reported through the <u>Texas Litter Database</u> using the code "CCC22" in the external ID field on the trash reports. - Work on the Special Project, TEKS standards aligned videos and materials on stormwater education for teachers, is underway. The PETF have narrowed down the target grade range to allow the materials to better fit to TEKS standards.
- The PETF have selected a slogan for the 2023 March is Texas SmartScape Month campaign – When In Drought, Plant Native. Corresponding graphics will be available later this year.

#### **North Central Texas Council of Governments**

**Plano:** Still waiting to hear back on reissue of their permit. Wondering if other Phase I's have had to wait such a long time. Submitted BANEP data – in addition to what's required for annual reports. Will be hiring an intern and will have a specialist position posted in a few weeks.

**Carrollton:** TCEQ compliance investigation has been completed and went well. TCEQ wanted to review their 2019-2021 SWMP, NOI, and supporting data. They went through the most recent annual report, looking at everything – all BMPs on MCMs and supporting data. They did one site visit to Fleet Services.

**Lewisville:** Received their Draft Notice to Publish Public Notice several weeks prior. Expecting to receive and publish the final version soon. Had a high attendance at the recent Colorpalooza event held by the city in April. They had an eco-alley area and ran out of supplies to give out this year.

**Mansfield:** Had high attendance at the Earth Day event. Brought the TRWD storm trailer to the event for community engagement. Will have a Health Specialist position posting soon.

**Dallas County:** Holding a cleanup event this weekend that is focused on the unincorporated areas of the county. Recently completed their Annual Report but the SWMP has still not been approved.

**Arlington:** It has taken two years for SWMP review and permit. Have hired Amesha Morris as the new Senior Environmental Specialist.

**Allen:** Have been notified by TCEQ with a Draft Public Notice, , but haven't received any information to proceed with public notice.

**Cleburne:** Have done recent clean-up events with their Keep Cleburne Beautiful affiliate; have a HHW collection event coming up in June; there will be a new position posting coming soon to transition covering Julie's duties after she retires. Had two of their Adopt-A-Spot sites that were posted on the Trash Free Texas website adopted. Have two new industries that have adopted roadways.

**Denton:** Have three position to be posted; have a new Stormwater Inspector, Marina Kraft.

**DFW Airport:** Have received email approval of permit but not the official approval.

**Halff:** Sam Sarkar did not have any updates to share but wanted to join the meeting as Halff works with the iSWM program.

Quiddity Engineering: Michelle Troy with Quiddity introduced herself to the group.
