WHEREAS, the proposals were reviewed, and the evaluation committee recommends award of a contract to Gallagher Benefits Services, Inc.; and,


WHEREAS, NCTCOG has complied with federal and State regulations regarding contract and procurement proceedings.







WHEREAS, the project's scope of work is consistent with that of Aging's home-delivered meal, volunteer recruitment, and benefits counseling programs.



**RESOLUTION ENDORSING GRANT APPLICATION TO THE FEDERAL RAILROAD
ADMINISTRATION FOR THE FEDERAL-STATE PARTNERSHIP FOR STATE OF GOOD
REPAIR PROGRAM**

WHEREAS, the North Central Texas Council of Governments (NCTCOG) is a Texas political subdivision and non-profit corporation organized and operating under Texas Local Government Code Chapter 391 as the regional planning commission for the 16-county North Central Texas region; and,

WHEREAS, NCTCOG is a voluntary association of, by and for local governments established to assist in planning for common needs, cooperating for mutual benefit, and coordinating for sound regional development; and,

WHEREAS, NCTCOG has been designated as the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) for the Dallas-Fort Worth Metropolitan Area by the Governor of the State of Texas in accordance with federal law; and,

WHEREAS, the Regional Transportation Council (RTC), comprised primarily of local elected officials, is the regional transportation policy body associated with NCTCOG, and has been and continues to be a forum for cooperative decisions on transportation, and is committed to the development of a strong, safe, reliable, and integrated regional transit network; and,

WHEREAS, Subtask 3.05 of the Fiscal Year (FY) 2018 and FY 2019 Unified Planning Work Program supports monitoring grant activities; identifying and monitoring transit-related issues of local, regional, and national interest; and provides technical assistance to transit providers by coordinating the dissemination of technical information, federal regulations, and grant requirements; and,

WHEREAS, the Federal Railroad Administration (FRA) has made funding available through the Federal-State Partnership for State of Good Repair Program Grant to repair, replace, or rehabilitate qualified railroad assets to reduce the state of good repair backlog and improve intercity passenger rail performance; and,

WHEREAS, on March 14, 2019, the RTC approved the submittal of a grant application for a total project cost of \$53 million including approximately \$24 million in grant request under the FRA's Federal-State Partnership for State of Good Repair Program.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED THAT:

Section 1. The Executive Board endorses NCTCOG's submittal of a grant application to the FRA for the Trinity Railway Express Corridor State of Good Repair Improvements Project under the Federal-State Partnership for State of Good Repair Program for a total project cost of approximately \$53 million including approximately \$24 million in grant request, as detailed in Attachment 1.


Section 2. The Executive Board instructs staff to work with the FRA and partner agencies to determine the most efficient method to bring these funds to the region and implement the project if the application is selected.

Section 3. NCTCOG is authorized to receive approximately \$24 million in State of Good Repair Program Grant funds, if awarded, and subject to Section 2.

Section 4. If awarded, these funds shall be incorporated into the applicable fiscal year budgets, Transportation Improvement Program, Unified Planning Work Program, and other planning/administrative documents.


Section 5. The Executive Director or designee is authorized to execute agreements necessary to carry out this project, including agreements for receipt of matching funds in the name of NCTCOG.

WHEREAS, NCTCOG has complied with RTC procedures for Calls for Projects/Funding Initiatives.



WHEREAS, Agile Mile, Incorporated has been recommended by the Consultant Selection Committee to provide the hosted website and participant recruitment and outreach services; and,



WHEREAS, NCTCOG staff are currently in the process of negotiating a long-term solution for the Kaufman County Workforce Center; and,


WHEREAS, staff recommends extending the current lease by a period of up to six (6) months in order to finalize negotiations.



WHEREAS, there is no provision for the assignment of this seat to another person or for an alternate to be named; and,


WHEREAS, the Executive Board has conducted an impartial lottery to determine the legislator to hold this seat, and,
