







# Roadway Capacity Reductions


### On a three-lane roadway closing, one lane reduces the capacity to 49%

Number of Lanes	If Shoulder Blocked	Lanes Blocked

Studies indicate that the likelihood of a secondary incident increases 2.8% for each minute that a lane is blocked

## 12 County Fatal and Serious Injury Crash Rate







