2. **Meeting Summary**. The December 10<sup>th</sup> meeting summary is available online for review and provided as a handout at the meeting. Approval will be sought at this meeting.

The subcommittee reviewed the summary from December 10, 2019 and approved it.

- 3. Landscape Planning and Vegetation Maintenance BMPs. The group will discuss BMPs for the first topic of the SPROW BMP Guidebook. The BMP Guidebook will include pros and cons lists, bullet lists, pictures, and matrices depending on what information is gathered and desired.

The intent of the guidebook is to help local governments make informed decisions. SPROW had created a Roadmap on the NCTCOG website with links to resources. This did not directly tell communities what the BMPs in this region are but point them to information on the topic. The Roadmap also did not convert well when NCTCOG updated their website and some of the links no longer work.

The Subcommittee discussed the lack of space in the ROW. There are utility easements or buffers that do not provide enough space for trees. There is a lot of competition for the space on the ROW and the Subcommittee will need to be innovative on ways to find room for trees and vegetation.

The Subcommittee wants to identify adequate street cross sections that accomadate trees and utilities in future meetings. This could include narrowing streets, utilizing silva cells, or requiring a landscape setback on new development. The solutions provided in the Guidebook should have pros and cons lists so communities have all the information to make the best decision with their situation.

It was also mentioned that the group should create a tree guide that lists what trees work best in certain situations, like under utility lines or in the median. The Subcommittee called this a form-based tree guide, like form-based planning. The list should provide context to the trees like how tall/wide the trees grow, how heat resistant they are, and how much maintenance they need. Also the trees should be native to Texas, and native to the region would be even better.

To work on the form-based tree guide at the next meeting, organizations should submit their tree lists to NCTCOG. Olivia will provide a way for the group to collaborate online, most likely through Google Drive. If cities have ordinances that are valuable to this conversation they should share those as well.


