Approval of iSWM Consultant Selection

- The previous iSWM contract with Halff Associates concluded April 30th, 2022.
- Request for Statement of Qualification (RFSQ # 2022-018) was issued on October 27th, 2022, and closed on December 8, 2022.
- NCTCOG received one (1) qualified response by the December 8, 2022, deadline from Halff Associates, Inc.
- The Evaluation Committee selected Halff Associates, Inc. to perform iSWM consultant services.
- The iSWM Implementation Subcommittee confirmed this selection on January 11, 2023.

 The Evaluation Committee selected Halff Associates, Inc. to perform iSWM consultant services.

- The iSWM Implementation Subcommittee is requesting approval from the Public Works Council to open a contract with Halff Associates, Inc. to perform consultant services for the Integrated Stormwater Management Program (iSWM), with terms as such:
 - Five (5) year term
 - In an amount not to exceed \$500,000.00 over the five (5) year term

Pavement Condition

Cracking - Detects cracks and potholes with a probability of accuracy including estimate of size.







PASER - Remote Pavement Surface Evaluation and Rating.











Sign Detection - Locate and record sign type
Sign Reflectivity - Using only night time imagery, signs graded on general reflectivity/luminosity.
Sign Damage – Identify/report damaged signs
