# DISCUSSION/PRESENTATION/ACTION ITEMS

2. **Meeting Summary.** The August 19, 2022, meeting summary is <u>available online</u> for review.

# 4. FY 2023 Trinity River COMMON VISION Work Program Activities Discussion.

- a. **NFIP and CDC Model Consolidation Team.** USACE staff will update the FMTF on scopes of work and timelines submitted by the USACE related to:
  - i. Updating the newly georeferenced CDC model with approved but not yet constructed CDC project geometries from 2017 onward and future flows.



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 ii. Creating the CDC future flows for the FEMA detailed study on the East Fork Trinity and the Trinity mainstem to extend the consolidated model.
Projected posting for the updated model will be best available data (not yet FEMA effective); estimated to be posted in Fall 2022. (Matt Lepinski)

USACE is incorporating LOMRs into the model and meeting with FEMA to discuss a path forward for consolidating. They will provide link to the CDC website for input and review. Meetings were held with NCTCOG to discuss a path forward for appropriate land use, keep data consistent, and develop hydrology. USACE hopes to complete the work in 2023.

# b. **Update the CDC Manual to the 5<sup>th</sup> Edition.** The NFIP-CDC Model Consolidation Team will share progress on updates to the CDC Manual. (Lisa Biggs)

Lisa is meeting with team members to finalize the last portions of the manual in late November/early December. Next steps involve NCTCOG staff compiling manual sections into one document for everyone on the Task Force to see and comment. The document may be sent out early January to the Task Force for comment. Let Lisa or NCTCOG know ASAP of any comments to try to address/incorporate.

c. **OneRain Regional Flood Warning Software Contract.** NCTCOG will provide an update on current contracts with communities in North Central Texas. (Sue Swenor)

- 5. Other Program Related Efforts
  - a. 26th Annual FEMA NFIP L-273 Course and CFM Exam. The FEMA NFIP L-273 Course will be held November 14 – 17, with the exam taking place November 18. The course is sold out; option to still sign up for the waiting list. (Jai-W Hayes-Jackson)

b. North Texas Floodplain Administrators/CRS Users Group. NCTCOG will share updates from the October 25 CRS Users Group/Elected Officials Seminar. (Erin Blackman)

Erin Blackman (NCTCOG) provided an update on the combined Community Rating System (CRS) Users Group/Elected Officials Floodplain Seminar that was held October 25, 2022. There were 41 attendees, including seven elected officials. The presentations are posted to NCTCOG's CRS website at <u>https://www.nctcog.org/envir/watershed-management/crs-user-</u>

The City of Dallas presented on their efforts to reach a CRS rating of 4; Halff Associates provided an update on the Regional Flood Planning Effort; and NCTCOG and USACE discussed the Integrated Transportation and Stormwater Infrastructure Initiative. Erin added that there was great participation at the seminar and NCTCOG hopes to hold quarterly CRS Users Group meetings. She encouraged this Task Force to send any needs on future topics and potential speakers to <u>eblackman@nctcog.org</u>.

c. **Trinity River Paddling Trail.** NCTCOG will provide an update on designation of the Trinity River in Dallas-Fort Worth as a National Water Trail and efforts to enhance the trail and maintain the National Park Service designation. (Erin Blackman)

Erin Blackman provided an update on the quarterly meeting of the Trinity River National Water Trail Task Force that was held virtually on November 2, 2022. Thirty-one people attended and heard updates from Trinity Coalition and the City of Irving on the state of the trail, including river events, sites that are open, closed, or in need of attention, as well as opportunities for expansion. Dallas County also gave a presentation on their Parks and Open Space Program. The meeting presentation is posted to NCTCOG's Water Trail website at <u>https://www.nctcog.org/envir/committees/trinity-river-national-water-trail-task-force</u>, and a meeting summary will be posted next week.

d. **Integration of Transportation and Stormwater Planning.** NCTCOG staff will provide an update on the scope and funding for the Integration of Transportation and Stormwater Planning Project. (Kate Zielke)

Kate Zielke provided background and work completed over the last quarter for the Integrated Transportation and Stormwater Infrastructure project. Agreements have been finalized with UTA and are awaiting finalization with other partners. Other activities still underway are reviewing projected land use data and performing a literature review on similar projects.

e. **Cooperating Technical Partnership.** NCTCOG staff will provide an update on the CTP projects that are ongoing. (Jai-W Hayes-Jackson)

Jai-W Hayes-Jackson updated the task force on the status of current Flood Risk Studies and Discovery projects. Waxahachie Creek and Harriet Creek projects were closed out last quarter, and the Discovery Meeting for the Upper West Fork of the Trinity River is scheduled for January 17.

f. **Integrated Stormwater Management (iSWM) Program.** An update on iSWM activities will be provided by NCTCOG staff. (Casey Cannon)

Casey Cannon (NCTCOG) provided an update on the status of iSWM activities. The budget for a new contract for a consultant for FY23 was approved. The City of Arlington was also awarded a Bronze iSWM Certification for their Stormwater Management Criteria. On November 17 the group will going through all public comments and proposed responses during a meeting at TRWD with a virtual option; flood model discussed, will be borrowing from NCTCOG. TWDB – No response USACE – Jerry Cotter mentioned the TSI outreach meetings – several communities said upstream development happened and led to flooding. Compliments of this group were given,

especially of NCTCOG, Lisa Biggs and Stephanie Griffin for the model.

Edith Marvin (NCTCOG) acknowledged the presence of Jasmin Ferrell and Wes McLure from the City of Mesquite. NCTCOG is still working to add members along the East Fork. Outside participants were invited to provide updates – No response.
