New TMDL Deliverables Available for Distribution

This quarter, two TMDL subcommittees drafted and completed multiple deliverables to increase regional education and awareness related to the project. These resources can be shared throughout various communities to inform practices and behaviors that may impact regional water quality.

The TMDL Wastewater subcommittee has created an On-Site Sewage Facility (OSSF or septic

system) [postcard mailer](#). This postcard seeks to educate septic system owners on proper care and maintenance techniques to increase the system's longevity. Readers will also find helpful reminders on basic wastewater system care, such as only flushing the three P's (Pee, Poop, and toilet Paper). Currently under development is a complementary brochure that explains these concepts in greater depth.

The TMDL Stormwater subcommittee has completed an educational explainer video on pet waste, "[Doo the Right Thing](#)". This video details the viruses and bacteria that are transmitted through exposure to pet waste and how this exposure impacts animals, humans, and regional ecosystems. TMDL Annual Program Summary and Five-Year Status Report

The TMDL 2023 Annual Program Summary is available for review on the NCTCOG [TMDL page](#). This summary displays the clear progress being made to reducing the amount of bacteria loading in the Greater Trinity River basin. Program highlights from this year include increased participation in the Holiday Grease Roundup and the creation of the new educational explainer videos, "No Muss, No Fuss- Be Wise When You Flush", "Only Flush the Three P's", and "Septic System Maintenance for Homeowners". Additionally, NCTCOG has completed [the five-year status report](#) and it is available on the [TMDL home page](#). This report details progress made from 2018-2022. This is the third status report of the program and is meant to provide the Coordination Committee with the tools to efficiently review the implementation and impact of strategies outlined in the I-Plan, and to coordinate further with the technical subcommittees to identify areas to focus future resources and efforts.

A draft of the Trash Free Texas [Restaurant Program Toolkit](#) is now posted on the Trash Free Texas website! The toolkit includes resources and strategies for both restaurants and communities to jointly promote less usage of single-use plastic items in local restaurants, like plastic straws and plastic utensils. Efforts to reduce these items are a win for both groups because they save money and reduce litter in our communities.

The toolkit includes promotional items, such as window decals, flyers, napkin inserts, and customer leave behind cards. It also includes case studies and program implementation strategies. The toolkits are customizable to support a variety of plastic reduction goals and users

"Doo the Right Thing" Photo Contest


