The world is currently facing many energy challenges due to a rapid demographic, economic, social, climatic, and technological changes. As part of a major energy infrastructure study, the Energy Institute at the University of Texas at Austin has sought to understand how an increase in electric vehicles might change how energy is supplied and consumed. So far, their study has shown that the impact of electric vehicles will depend on where you live and when the vehicles are charged.

The city of Georgetown is going one step farther to become energy-independent after winning a \$1 million grant from Bloomberg Philanthropies U.S. Mayors Challenge. City officials said they plan to lease rooftop space on homes to install solar panels as well as additional space to install storage batteries that will allow the city to collect and store solar-generated energy.

Texas Bets \$1 Million for the Construction of a Large Battery Storage Project

The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) has awarded a \$1 million grant to Luminant in order to build the state's largest electricity storage facility

located in Uptown County, West Texas. The grant is part of the Texas Emission Reduction Plan and will help make solar energy a more lucrative source of electricity in the state. The Upton 2 facility started generating energy in June, but the battery is expected to be installed before 2018 ends.

The RFI covers four topic areas: Photovoltaics, system integration, concentrating solar-thermal power, and balance of systems soft cost reduction.
