## NOTES

Application Limitations: Per CJPDC Policies and Procedures, Section 3.3: A cap of \$100,000 has been placed on new Juvenile Justice applications being scored and prioritized. Per CJPDC Policies and Procedures, Section 3.4.1: For the FY16 grant cycle, an agency may submit no more than three (3) new projects to be scored in the Juvenile Justice category.

Vendor Hold Deduction (new policy for FY16 scored projects): A vendor hold results in the Criminal Justice Division (CJD) withholding payments on all grants to an agency. CJD may place a grantee agency on vendor hold for any of the following reasons: delinquent single audit report, delinquent financial or programmatic reports, pending refunds to CJD, match requirement not met, unresolved monitoring findings, or non-compliance with State or Federal rules. At CJD's direction, five (5) points were deducted from grant applications for applicants shown on CJD's vendor hold list any time during the last two plan years (April 1, 2013 – March 31, 2015), and the point deduction has been incorporated into the final score for each affected new application. A grant application may be disqualified by CJD from the grant application process if an applicant is on vendor hold at the time funding decisions are finalized.
